



# Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

July 12, 2020 Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time` Isaiah 55: 10-11 Psalm: 65: 10, 11, 12-13,, 14 Romans 8:9 18-23 Matthew 13: 1-23

A reading from the Gospel of St. Matthew::

On that day, Jesus went out of the house and sat down by the sea. Such large crowds gathered around him that he got into a boat and sat down, and the whole crowd stood along the shore And he spoke to them at length in parables, saying: "A sower went out to sow. And as he sowed, some seed fell on the path, and birds came and ate it up. Some fell on rocky ground, where it had little soil. It sprang up at once because the soil was not deep, and when the sun rose it was scorched, and it withered for lack of roots. Some seed fell among thorns, and the thorns grew up and choked it But some seed fell on rich soil, and produced fruit, a hundred or sixty or thirtyfold. Whoever has ears ought to hear." The disciples approached him and said, "Why do you speak to them in parables?" He said to them in reply, "Because knowledge of the mysteries of the kingdom of heaven has been granted to you, but to them it has not been granted. To anyone who has, more will be given and he will grow rich; from anyone who has not, even what he has will be taken away. This is why I speak to them in parables, because they look but do not see and hear but do not listen or understand. Isaiah's prophecy is fulfilled in them, which says: You shall indeed hear but not understand, vou shall indeed look but never see. Gross is the heart of this people, they will hardly hear with their ears, they have closed their eyes, lest they see with their eves and hear with their ears and understand with their hearts and be converted. and I heal them.

"But blessed are your eyes, because they see, and your ears, because they hear.

Amen, I say to you, many prophets and righteous people longed to see what you see but did not see it, and to hear what you hear but did not hear it.

"Hear then the parable of the sower.

The seed sown on the path is the one who hears the word of the kingdom without understanding it, and the evil one comes and steals away what was sown in his heart.

The seed sown on rocky ground is the one who hears the word and receives it at once with joy.

But he has no root and lasts only for a time.

When some tribulation or persecution comes because of the word, he immediately falls away.

The seed sown among thorns is the one who hears the word, but then worldly anxiety and the lure of riches choke the word and it bears no fruit.

But the seed sown on rich soil is the one who hears the word and understands it,

who indeed bears fruit and yields a hundred or sixty or thirtyfold."

Dear Friends,

**There is a sculpture "Knotted Gun" right outside the UN headquarters, NYC.** The Knotted Gun is a bronze sculpture by Swedish artist Carl Fredrik Reuterswärd. It is an oversized 357 Magnum revolver with its muzzle tied in a knot. According to Kofi Annan, the seventh Secretary-General of the UN "it is a powerful symbol that encapsulates, in a few simple curves, the greatest prayer of man; that which asks <u>not for victory, but for peace."</u>

**This Sunday's readings invite us** to experience life not as a battle-field with winners and losers but as a farming-field of growing peace in oneself and others. The First reading prophesizes how the Messianic King's dominion would not depend on war-weapons to proclaim or bring peace.

The Gospel reading shows that Jesus the Messiah recommends us to imitate him to find REST from labor and burden of life. "Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am meek and humble of heart; and you will find rest for yourselves." Life is not an attempt to win but readiness to embrace its richness spread before us. All that we need to experience the rest and richness of life is to imitate Jesus in His meekness and humility. That means not to get absorbed in our own comfortable selfish/clannish zones but to break the barriers we built around ourselves.

**Breaking the barriers is like carrying the cross.** It makes us open our heart to learn from Jesus. Through the cross Jesus will empower us to experience life as richer mysteries (hidden things) than what we selfishly understand life is.

With all that is going around us locally and globally, REST of heart is the basic recipe for the festive dinner of PEACE. If one's heart is restless one cannot find peace in any place or person; and one cannot find rest unless one is ready to break one's own barriers, which is a readiness to carry one's own cross. Unless I am ready to give up my brick and you yours, no peaceful abode will be built for both of us to live.

The wars, fights, divisions or emotional arguments become endlessly inevitable as long as we file our bricks and gather bricks from others as well in order to build our fortress. Peace is not building a fortress to prove our strength and to win our battle. Peace is not a product but a great opening growing endlessly in each of our hearts. Unless I open and let peace go from me towards the other, it does not happen between me and the other. Let us imitate Jesus. Let us live like Jesus. Let peace blossom from our heart.

#### **Focus on Religious Freedom**

Celebrating "Religious Freedom Week" - June 22-29 The Christian Roots of America's Longing for Liberty - Part 2

By the time of the American Revolution, 1776, our nation's founders embraced Freedom of Religion as an essential condition of a free and democratic society.

James Madison, often called the Father of the Constitution, described conscience as "the most sacred of all property" and "the Religion then of every man must be left to the conviction and conscience of every man...<sup>(1)</sup> George Washington wrote that "the establishment of Civil and Religious Liberty was the Motive that induced me to the field of battle." <sup>(2)</sup> Thomas Jefferson assured the Ursuline Sisters - who had been serving a mostly non-Catholic population in Louisiana since 1727 by running a hospital, an orphanage, and schools - that their Ministry would be free "to govern itself according to its own voluntary rules, without interference from the civil authority."<sup>(3)</sup>

Therefore, when the Bill of Rights was ratified in 1791, religious freedom had the distinction of being the First Amendment. Our founders believed religious liberty is, indeed, the first liberty. The First Amendment guarantees, "Congress shall make no law respecting an establishment of religion, or prohibiting the free exercise thereof."

Recently, in a unanimous Supreme Court judgment affirming the importance of the First Freedom, Chief Justice Roberts explained that religious liberty is not just the first freedom for Americans; it is the first in the history of democratic freedoms, tracing its origins back to the first clauses of the Magna Carter of 1215. Chief Justice Roberts cited an 1806 judgement involving the first Catholic bishop in the U.S., in which James Madison stated, the "scrupulous policy of the Constitution is guarding against a political

interference with religious affairs" and this prevented the government from rendering an opinion on Church matters.<sup>(4)</sup>

Our American heritage and most cherished freedom is Freedom of Religion because if we are not free in our conscience and practice of religion, all other freedoms are fragile. If our obligations and duties to God are contradicted by the government, then we can no longer claim to be a land of the free, and a beacon of hope for the world. <sup>(5)</sup>
