



Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

August 23, 2020 Twenty-First Sunday in Ordinary Time Isaiah 22: 19-23 Psalm: 138: 1-2, 2-3, 6-8 Romans: 11:33-36 Matthew 16:13-20

A reading from the Gospel of St. Matthew:

Jesus went into the region of Caesarea Philippi and he asked his disciples, "Who do people say that the Son of man is?"

They replied, "Some say John the Baptist, others Elijah, still others Jeremiah or one of the prophets." He said to them, "But who do you say that I am?" Simon Peter said in reply, "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God."

Jesus said to him in reply, "Blessed are you, Simon son of Jonah. For flesh and blood has not revealed this to you, but my heavenly Father.

And so I say to you, you are Peter, and upon this rock I will build my church, and the gates of the netherworld shall not prevail against it.

I will give you the keys to the kingdom of heaven. Whatever you bind on earth shall be bound in heaven and whatever you loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven."

Then he strictly ordered his disciples to tell no one that he was the Christ.

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

"Good resolutions are simply checks that people draw on a bank where they have no account." (Oscar Wilde) A check that can't pay the stated amount is a piece of paper. A resolution that doesn't become an action is just an empty wishful thinking. Likewise faith without lifelong commitment to the person, who believes, is mental self-cheat of the believer.

Today's Gospel story explains the power of the Canaanite woman's faith. Though her request to heal her tormented daughter was ignored, denied, and to a certain extent degraded by Jesus, her faith in Jesus is so committed that Jesus not only appreciates her faith but also shatters His own restrictions and heals her daughter immediately. **Faith is not a mental exercise** or a psychological attitude but a lifelong commitment in a loving relationship with God whom the believer believes. Faith empowers the believer to engage and surrender his/her whole self (life) to God. In turn Committed-Faith of the believer entreats God to favor the believer beyond all barriers. Committed-Faith in God develops a creative relationship between God and the believer. This kind of faith grows the believer to be his/her best in God and allows God to achieve his best in them. When we respond to God in a faith-filled relationship God takes a wonderful delight in the believer, as Jesus did in today's Gospel. Let us pray for the gift of faith in God. Let us live by the faith in God to be our best.

Thank you very much for all your financial support to our Parish. You have been so faithful in sending your weekly offering envelopes even when the church was in lock-down. I am very much appreciative of your continuing support for the church to continue God's mission and service to his people. Now when we are partially opened with caution and social distancing, I admire how people help volunteering on weekends and every day in seating the people, in sanitizing the church after the worship, in preparing the parking lot and directing the cars before and after the parking lot mass.

Before the lock-down we used to have five masses during the weekends. Now during the partial opening we have just three masses: Saturday 5:00 pm in the Church, Sunday 9:30 am in the parking lot and 12; 00 noon in the Church. About 75 to 90 people attend the masses in the Church. About 75 to 100 cars are present at the parking lot mass. The attendance is slowly but steadily increasing. The collection is not as it used to be; it is about 65% of what it used to be before the lock-down.

Please take your time to embolden and encourage yourself to join the worship. In order to help exercise and grow your faith we record Holy Mass every day and post it on our parish website "stmli.org". Also we live stream the Saturday 5:00 pm Mass and post it on our parish website for you to watch and pray at your convenient time on Sunday.

Slavery Today: Religious & Ethnic Minorities Targeted

From China to Great Britain, millions of religious & ethnic minorities are held in slavery - politely called "forced labor" in many reports.

According to the Global Slavery Index, there were over 40 million slaves in over 100 countries in 2019. The International Labour Organization estimates that 26% of modern day slaves are children. Some countries with the most slaves are China, N. Korea, India, Iran, Cambodia, Pakistan, Afghanistan, Nigeria and Central African Republic.

Slaves are gleaned from minority populations of Christians, Uyghur Muslims, Yazidis, Hindus, and other religious/ethnic minorities. These people are used for a wide variety of purposes: factory and agriculture workers, organ harvesting, girls & women are sex-trafficked, and boys & men are forced to fight in government-backed militias that are engaged in civil wars.

Present-day slavery is both cheap and disposable. In 1850, an average slave in the American South cost today's equivalent of \$40,000. Today, a slave costs \$90 on average worldwide.

"The U.S. will not stand by as any government with a policy or pattern of human trafficking subjects its own citizens to this kind of oppression," said Secretary of State Pompeo at the July, 2020 Trafficking in Persons (TIP) Report conference. "We will work tirelessly in the U.S. to free those who are still enslaved." (1)

"The TIP report takes modern-day slavery head on, providing a measuring stick for progress - or for regression, and sanction," said Rep. Chris Smith, N.J. (2)

The Slave-Free Business Certification Act, introduced by Rep. Josh Hawley, would require every American business that takes in \$500 million worldwide to certify to the Dept. of Labor that their companies are not using slave labor in their supply chains or face substantial fines. A recent study revealed 83 well known worldwide companies have "directly or indirectly" profited from slave labor. (3)


MAINTENANCE COLLECTION


