Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

August 30, 2020 Twenty-Second Sunday in Ordinary Time Jeremiah 20:7-9 Psalm: 63:2, 3-4, 5-6, 8-9 Romans 12:1-2 Matthew 16:21-27

A reading from the Gospel of St. Matthew:

Jesus began to show his disciples that he must go to Jerusalem and suffer greatly from the elders, the chief priests, and the scribes, and be killed and on the third day be raised.

Then Peter took Jesus aside and began to rebuke him,

"God forbid, Lord! No such thing shall ever happen to you."

He turned and said to Peter,

"Get behind me, Satan! You are an obstacle to me. You are thinking not as God does, but as human beings do."

Then Jesus said to his disciples,

"Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me. For whoever wishes to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake will find it. What profit would there be for one to gain the whole world and forfeit his life?

Or what can one give in exchange for his life? For the Son of Man will come with his angels in his Father's glory, and then he will repay all according to his conduct."

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

"Caddy: Let me say this about your game, mister. I wouldn't say you were the worst golfer I have ever seen on this course, but I've seen places today that I've never seen before." What a clever caddy! The caddy was gentle enough to reveal to the golfer the best he did in his worst game. His bad game made the caddy see places in the golf course for the first time.

Today's Gospel narrates how each of us is blessed by God to reveal the best in others, and in the process of that revelation we get the best in us revealed. When the disciples exhausted reporting about what people say of Jesus, Jesus asked them what they say of Him. Peter said that Jesus is Christ (Messiah), the Son of God. Jesus acknowledged Peter's reply and attested that his reply is not from his own discovery but from God's inspiration. Then Jesus revealed to Peter that he is the rock on which Jesus would build His Church and whatever he does, will have its own effect in Heaven. When Peter acknowledges God's revelation to him about Jesus, Jesus makes Peter aware of God's revelation about him.

This is what happens for those who believe in God. When the believers accept God's revelation to them about God, they would realize that God would reveal their own worth to them. Belief in God is not just about God but more so about the believer.. God is not affected in any way by our believing or denying Him. Believing in God reveals to us our worth, how our existence here on earth has a purpose and how God graciously empowers us to live that purpose as the meaning of our living. Let our belief in God enlighten and empower us. The Parking lot Mass was rained out and was celebrated in the church: Last Sunday, August 16th we could not celebrate mass at 9:30 am in the Parking lot because of the rain. Our general understanding is to celebrate the 9:30 am mass in the church whenever the weather does not permit us to do it in the Parking Lot. About 80 people attended the mass.

Parking lot mass is the most attended mass. But the inclement weather and the vulnerability of attending the indoor mass at this virus time make some of our people restrict themselves from indoor masses. I only want to reassure you that the 9:30 am mass is always celebrated either in the parking lot in good weather and inside the church in inclement weather. So please take your time to heal and embolden yourself to worship with us indoors whenever we cannot celebrate the outdoor mass.

Creative Christians Find Unique Places to Worship

Worshippers met in a local Walmart on June 26 in North Versailles, PA, after Gov. Tom Wolf ordered that individuals "should not gather in religious buildings or homes for services or celebrations until the stay-at-home order is lifted." ⁽¹⁾

The church had moved its worship service from its building to Walmart after police officers interrupted to disperse the congregation. Law Enforcement Today (LET) reported, "If people can safely gather at a Walmart to worship, then it is absurd to suggest that the actual house of worship is any more dangerous." (2)

"This just further affirms the bias that is taking place across the country in the name of 'safety' and 'quarantine.' Liquor stores and marijuana shops were deemed essential, but not houses of worship." (3)

A group of 500 Evangelical Christians held a prayer & praise service in the lobby of a 1,600-person capacity Las Vegas casino on Aug. 6, since Nevada Gov. Steve Sisolak restricted services in houses of worship to 50 people but allowed casinos to operate at 50% capacity. Retail stores and restaurants are also allowed to reopen at 50% capacity. "The governor allows hundreds to thousands to assemble in pursuit of financial fortunes but only 50 to gather in pursuit of spiritual ones. That is unconstitutional," said lawyers for the church. This casino prayer & praise event came two weeks after the U.S. Supreme Court rejected the plea of Calvary Chapel in Nevada to suspend the state-imposed 50-person limit for church gatherings. In a 5-4 decision, justices denied the church's appeal to allow services for up to 90 members, 50% capacity, while fully complying with social distancing and other rules.

Dissenting Justice Sam Alito wrote, "We have a duty to defend the Constitution, and even a public health emergency does not absolve us of that responsibility." "The Constitution guarantees the free exercise of religion. It says nothing about freedom to play craps or blackjack..." (5)


MAINTENANCE COLLECTION


