



Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

September 26, 2020 Twenty-Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time Ezekiel 18:25-28 Psalm: 25:4-5, 6-7, 8-9 Philippians 2:1-22 Matthew 21: 28-32

A reading from the Gospel of St. Matthew:

Jesus said to the chief priests and elders of the people:

"What is your opinion?

A man had two sons. He came to the first and said, 'Son, go out and work in the vineyard today.' He said in reply, 'I will not, ' but afterwards changed his mind and went. The man came to the other son and gave the same order.

He said in reply, 'Yes, sir, 'but did not go. Which of the two did his father's will?" They answered, "The first."

Jesus said to them, "Amen, I say to you, tax collectors and prostitutes are entering the kingdom of God before you. When John came to you in the way of righteousness, you did not believe him; but

tax collectors and prostitutes did. Yet even when you saw that, you did not later change your minds and believe him."



FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

.**There was an elderly lady who said to a little girl**, "How do you do, my dear?" The girl replied, "Quite well, thank you?" After a long pause the woman asked, "Why don't you ask me how I am?" The child paused and said calmly, "Because I am not interested."

Now what shall we say about the little girl's reply? Shall we say she is honest or rude in making such a reply to the lady? Honesty can be hurtful at times and politeness may not reflect honesty all the time.

In today's Gospel story, what shall we say about God's reply to the workers? Honest or rude? How does God treat the workers? Justly or generously? The Gospel story is not an intellectual argument to understand and accept God's justice and generosity from the dry plain of reason and logic. Rather, it is a parable inviting us to experience God's justice and generosity from the faculty of the heart.

God is a just God in never denying us what we deserve. Also God is the generous God in blessing us with more than we deserve. As long as each of us begins to live from our blessings we will experience and appreciate that our life is a generous gift justly given to us. But once each of us begins to live from comparing what we don't with what others have, we will see God as unjustly generous.

None of us is a replica or copy of anybody else in the globe. Each of us is unique with our own individual strengths and needs. We are abundantly supplied with more than what we need in order to grow the Kingdom of God. As long as we don't begin to live our uniqueness we will always measure our success or failures with those of others. This way of measuring oneself with others will always end up in valuing our lives as unfair. This would make us unable to live our own unique blessings. Let us pray that we may be enlightened to know who we are. May God empower to live our gifts justly and generously given to us by God.

As Schools and colleges have started, we wish and pray for our children to be healthy and industrious. Our Parish Patron, St. Thomas More is the Patron Saint of families. So we celebrate a Novena Mass of St. Thomas More every Tuesday to pray for our children and families. You can leave your written petitions in the Petitionbox by the St. Thomas More niche. All your intentions will be prayed for every Tuesday at the Novena Mass of St. Thomas More at 9:00 am.

The Constitution of the United States This "Miracle in Philadelphia" Was Grounded in America's Judeo-Christian Values

"The happy union of these states is a wonder; their Constitution is a miracle; their example the hope of liberty throughout the world. Woe to the ambition that would meditate the destruction of either!" - James Madison, 1787

Judeo-Christian values are foundational to America, beginning with the Declaration of Independence "endowed by their Creator" to the principles found in the U.S. Constitution honoring God-given Life and Liberty."

"Our Founding Fathers separated church from state, but they wisely did not separate God from state. They acknowledged God as the source of our rights and were careful to place Biblical morality

directly into our founding documents and laws, and into our values and culture, precisely to help prevent a future totalitarian or tyrannical rule in America," wrote author Dr. Ronald R. Cherry⁽¹⁾

It is alarming that many today have turned a blind eye to the required connection between God and Liberty and forgotten the warning from John Adams and Thomas Jefferson that Liberty cannot survive among men without its Divine connection.

"Remember that a Constitution which gives to the people so much freedom and entrusts them with so much power, rests for its permanency, on their knowledge and virtue," wrote Arthur Stansbury, in 1828. "An ignorant people are easily betrayed, and a wicked people can never be ruled by the mild

influence of their own laws. If you would be free ... cultivate knowledge - flee from vice. The virtuous citizen is the true noble." ⁽²⁾

Happening Now: Freedom of Religion & Freedom of Speech Denied freedom was violated when he was removed from his position following comments he made in a private chat forum for Catholic students. Because of the pandemic Religious Education will look different this year. Beginning the second week of September small classes will meet outside. Catechists and children will wear masks and maintain the correct social distance. We will continue outdoor classes as long as it is safe to do so and the weather permits. After that we will switch to online learning.



We anticipate that we will be able to celebrate First Communions and Confirmation later next spring or early summer as we did this past July when we celebrated the sacraments in smaller groups following Diocesan guidelines.


