Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

October 4, 2020 Twenty-Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time Isaiah 5: 1-7 Psalm: 80: 9, 12, 13-14, 15-16, 19-20 Philippians 4: 6-9 Matthew 21: 33-43

A reading from the Gospel of St. Matthew:

Jesus said to the chief priests and the elders of the people: "Hear another parable. There was a landowner who planted a vineyard, put a hedge around it, dug a wine press in it, and built a tower. Then he leased it to tenants and went on a journey.

When vintage time drew near, he sent his servants to the tenants to obtain his produce.

But the tenants seized the servants and one they beat, another they killed, and a third they stoned.

Again he sent other servants, more numerous than the first ones, but they treated them in the same way.

Finally, he sent his son to them, thinking, 'They will respect my son.'

But when the tenants saw the son, they said to one another, 'This is the heir. Come, let us kill him and acquire his inheritance.' They seized him, threw him out of the vineyard, and killed him. What will the owner of the vineyard do to those tenants when he comes?" They answered him,

"He will put those wretched men to a wretched death and lease his vineyard to other tenants who will give him the produce at the proper times."

Jesus said to them, "Did you never read in the Scriptures: *The stone that the builders rejected*

has become the cornerstone;

by the Lord has this been done,

and it is wonderful in our eyes?

Therefore, I say to you, the kingdom of God will be taken away from you and given to a people that will produce its fruit."

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

An employee looked at his paycheck and found that he had been overpaid, but he did not report the error. The next week, the accountant, correcting the error, deducted the same amount from the employee's pay. This time the employee complained. When asked by the accountant why he had not complained the previous week, the employee responded, "I can overlook one error, but when it happens two times in a row, it's time to complain." When an error happens to our advantage, we take it in good faith. But when it hurts us, we begin to question our faith.

In today's Gospel Jesus tells another parable about two sons. One of them promises to do the work but does not do so.. While the other son initially refuses to do the work but later has a change of heart and actually does it. It does not matter if the sons say 'yes' or 'no' to their father's wish. Rather what really matters is whether they did or not do the work requested by the father. What they profess to do must be supported by what they actually do. Faith is not one of the many opinions we nurture in our brain. Faith is the power of believing. It empowers the believer to become the living witness in action of what the person believes.

Faith must help the action and action should reflect the faith. "Faith and action are inseparable" is the Gospel today. Faith would be just a sweet vapor if it is not expressed in acts. Likewise an act will be a burden or a mechanical manipulation if it is not inspired by faith. As James wrote in his letter to his first century church, "If someone says he has faith but does not have works, can that faith save him?.... Faith of itself, if it does not have works, is dead. Indeed someone may say, "You have faith and I have works." Demonstrate your faith to me without works, and I will demonstrate my faith to you from my works." (James 2: 14, 17-18) May God help us increase our faith. May faith inspire and empower our actions. May our actions express and witness our faith.

And every day the Lord added to their number....(Acts2:47) What happened to the First Century Church is happening to our St. Thomas More Church in Hauppauge. When we opened the Church for public worship, in the first week 45 people attended the indoor mass and people in 65 cars participated in the Parking Lot Mass. Last Sunday, 75 people worshipped at the Saturday 5:00pm Mass and 125 at the Noon Mass of Sunday, and 165 viewers participated virtually in the Saturday 5:00 pm Live Stream Mass . People in 125 cars attended last Sunday's Parking Lot Mass. As we welcome and eagerly pray with those attending in person, we pray for those who are worshipping with us from home. May God strengthen you and encourage you to join us at your own pace one day in person .

Youth ministry starts this week. We take all the safety measures of wearing masks, social distancing, sanitizing and other health precautions. Our meeting time is 1:00 pm to 2:30 pm soon after the 12:00 noon Mass. Please encourage the young to this fun and faith formation time.






