



Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

October 11, 2020 Twenty-Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time Isaiah 25: 6-10 Psalm: 23: 1-3a, 3b-4, 5, 6 Philippians 4:12-14, 19-20 Matthew 22: 1-14

A reading from the Gospel of St. Matthew:

Jesus again in reply spoke to the chief priests and elders of the people in parables, saying, "The kingdom of heaven may be likened to a king who gave a wedding feast for his son. He dispatched his servants to summon the invited guests to the feast, but they refused to come. A second time he sent other servants, saying, 'Tell those invited: "Behold, I have prepared my banquet, my calves and fattened cattle are killed, and everything is ready; come to the feast."' Some ignored the invitation and went away, one to his farm, another to his business. The rest laid hold of his servants, mistreated them, and killed them. The king was enraged and sent his troops, destroyed these murderers, and burned their aity. Then he said to

those murderers, and burned their city. Then he said to his servants, 'The feast is ready, but those who were invited were not worthy to come. Go out, therefore, into the main roads and invite to the feast whomever you find.'

The servants went out into the streets and gathered all they found, bad and good alike, and the hall was filled with guests. But when the king came in to meet the guests, he saw a man there not dressed in a wedding garment. The king said to him, 'My friend, how is it that you came in here without a wedding garment?' But he was reduced to silence. Then the king said to his attendants, 'Bind his hands and feet, and cast him into the darkness outside, where there will be wailing and grinding of teeth.'

Many are invited, but few are chosen."

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

A young man asked a successful salesman for the secret of his success. The salesman said, "You just have to jump at every opportunity that comes along." The young man asked how he would know an opportunity was coming. The salesman responded, "You can't. You have to keep jumping." Yes we know life is an opportunity. But is it an opportunity of exploitation or an opportunity of service?

Jesus' parable of today's Gospel invites us to reflect on how to live our personal/social life - in exploitation or in service? In the first place the story explains that God wants to save us, humans; but we, humans, throughout our history, failed to cooperate with God and even killed God's own Son.

throughout our history, failed to cooperate with God and even killed God's own Son. On the second level the parable invites us to see that the life we claim to be ours is just of

On the second level the parable invites us to see that the life we claim to be ours is just a gift. Or to put in the words of today's Gospel, our life is leased to us so that we bear fruit to the one (God) who leased it to us. Thus we are just servants of our life not its owners to possess it. As long as we claim to possess life, we will be in an endless war with the owner (God). Once we see life as a gift/lease, we will begin to cherish it, cultivate it and make our life fruitful.

If we behave as owners of life, we will begin to do with it whatever "WE" want. We will try to rule and control life without any consideration to anyone who is involved with our life. On the other hand if we realize we are just servants we would treat life according to whatever the owner (GOD) wants us to achieve in our life. We will serve life in combination and cooperation with all who are involved with our life.

We brought nothing with us at our birth and would take nothing with us at our death. Whatever we claim as ours in the interim between birth and death, is the temporary support to make our lives fruitful. Let us serve life. Let God's will be the goal of life. Let us be servants of life bearing fruit.

October is the month of the Rosary. We pray the rosary every day in the Church at 8:40 am followed by the 9:00 am Mass. We pray the Rosary throughout October because October 7th is the feast of The Lady the Most Holy Rosary and The **Miracle of the Sun**, also known as the **Miracle of Fatima**, which is reported to have occurred on 13 October 1917, attended by a large crowd who had gathered in Fatima, Portugal, in response to a prophecy made by three shepherd children, Lúcia Santos and Francisco and Jacinta Marto. In all her monthly apparitions from May 13 to October 13, Our Lady asked the children and all of us to pray the Rosary for Peace. I suggest and request you pray the Rosary every day. If not the full Rosary, at least a decade of it, which is one Our Father, 10 Hail Marys and a "Glory be.

Today October 4, we celebrate Respect Life Sunday. We are reminded that the assaults on human dignity come in many forms from birth to natural death. Your prayers and assistance are greatly appreciated. Ensure the right of Americans to voice differing opinions freely, without censure or retaliation






