



Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

November 15, 2020 **Thirty-Third Sunday in Ordinary Time** Proverbs 31:10-13, 19-20, 30-31 Psalm: 128:1-2, 3, 4-5 1 Thessalonians 5:1-6 Matthew 25:14-30

A reading from the Gospel of St. Matthew:

Jesus told his disciples this parable:

"A man going on a journey called in his servants and entrusted his possessions to them. To one he gave five talents; to another, two; to a third, one--

to each according to his ability. Then he went away. Immediately the one who received five talents went and traded with them, and made another five.

"After a long time the master of those servants came back and settled accounts with them.

The one who had received five talents came forward bringing the additional five.

He said, 'Master, you gave me five talents. See, I have made five more.'

His master said to him, 'Well done, my good and faithful servant. Since you were faithful in small matters, I will give you great responsibilities. Come, share your master's joy.' Then the one who had received two talents also came forward

'Master, you gave me two talents. See, I have made two more '

His master said to him,

and said,

Well done, my good and faithful servant. Since you were faithful in small matters, I will give you great responsibilities. Come, share your master's joy.'

Then the one who had received the one talent came forward

'Master, I knew you were a demanding person,

harvesting where you did not plant and gathering where you did not scatter; so out of fear I went off and buried your talent in the ground. Here it is back.'

His master said to him in reply,

'You wicked, lazy servant! So you knew that I harvest where I did not plant and gather where I did not scatter? Should you not then have put my money in the bank so that I could have got it back with interest on my return? Now then! Take the talent from him and give it to the one with ten. For to everyone who has, more will be given and he will grow rich; but from the one who has not. even what he has will be taken away. And throw this useless servant into the darkness outside, where there will be wailing and grinding of teeth."

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

The mother was having a hard time getting her son to go to school in the morning. "Nobody in school likes me," he complained. "The teachers don't like me, the kids don't like me, the superintendent wants to transfer me, the bus drivers hate me, and the schoolboard wants me to drop out. Mom, now, give me one good reason why I should go to school." His mother countered, "You must go to school because you are forty-five years old and you are the principal." No one can make you live the truth unless you awaken yourself to it. You can bring the horse to the water but cannot make it drink. Today through 'the story of the ten virgins" Jesus invites us to be awake to vibrations of life in and around us that we may not miss any occasion of living life in abundance. Five of the ten virgins had enough oil to keep their lamp burning to join the celebration with the bridegroom when he came, while the other five had everything else except the one important thing, "enough oil". Those who had the oil did not have enough of it to share with them. Nor, did the other five have enough time to go to the merchants to buy oil before the bridegroom's arrival. Thus they missed the opportunity of celebrating with the bridegroom.

The Gospel Story instructs us to be awake for life is an ever flowing celebration with God. God is ready to start celebrating with us at any time and we must be ready all the time to light our lamp in order to join the celebration with God. We may miss the celebration with God if we were not to have enough oil. We may have everything else to live our life and yet it would not be a celebration if we don't have that little more oil to celebrate with God.

The message of the story is to have "little more oil" or "enough oil". "Having enough oil" means "having enough wakefulness". The wakefulness that we have for every other affairs of life would make our lives livable but having enough wakefulness to celebrate life with God, would make our lives very festive. The real celebration of life consists in having "enough oil" to join God.

We might have enriched ourselves with all kinds of material possessions to make our lives happy, but we would still not be able to celebrate our life if we don't have enough oil (enough awareness to join God) to withstand evil and troubles, war and terrorism etc. Let us pray that God supplies "enough" oil that we may not miss the moment of his coming into our lives. As much as we spend burning ourselves in the care of various concerns of life, let us also remember that "saving enough oil" to join God would change our lives to be more celebrative. Let us light our lamp for God and celebrate life.

Honoring Veterans - Champions of America's Freedoms

As all freedoms and especially, religious freedom, are under assault around the world, we speak and pray on November 11 to honor the Americans who have served in all areas of the military in defense of liberty.

Veterans Day originated as "Armistice Day" on Nov. 11, 1919, the first anniversary of the signing of the armistice ending World War I on the "eleventh hour of the eleventh day of the eleventh month" of 1918. Unlike Memorial Day that honors service members who died in service to their country, Veterans Day pays tribute to all American veterans living or dead - to give thanks for serving their country honorably during war or peacetime.

From WWI to the present post-9/11 conflicts, approximately 40 million have served in all branches of the military. Women have been approximately 9.1% of active members. These military men and women who protect the U.S. come from all walks of life and from every state.

Happening Now: 3 Killed in Knife Attack at Notre Dame Basilica, Nice, France

French bishops ordered a "death knell" to ring from every church of their country, as an act of mourning, after 3 people were hacked to death in Notre Dame Basilica in the southern Mediterranean city of Nice on Oct. 29th while they were preparing for Mass.

The Vatican Secretary of State, Cardinal Parolin, wrote, "Entrusting France to the protection of Our Lady," Pope Francis "wholeheartedly gives his apostolic blessing to all those affected by this tragedy." (1)




