

# Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

November 22, 2020 Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe Ezekiel 34:11-12, 15-17 Psalm: 23:1-2, 2-3, 5-6 1 Corinthians 15:20-26 Matthew 25:31-45

A reading from the Gospel of St. Matthew:

Jesus said to his disciples:

"When the Son of Man comes in his glory, and all the angels with him, he will sit upon his glorious throne, and all the nations will be assembled before him. And he will separate them one from another, as a shepherd separates the sheep from the goats. He will place the sheep on his right and the goats on his left. Then the king will say to those on his right,

'Come, you who are blessed by my Father. Inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world. For I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me drink, a stranger and you welcomed me, naked and you clothed me, ill and you cared for me, in prison and you visited me.'

Then the righteous will answer him and say,

'Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you, or thirsty and give you drink? When did we see you a stranger and welcome you, or naked and clothe you? When did we see you ill or in prison, and visit you?'

And the king will say to them in reply,

'Amen, I say to you, whatever you did for one of the least brothers of mine, you did for me.'

Then he will say to those on his left,

'Depart from me, you accursed, into the eternal fire prepared for the devil and his angels. For I was hungry and you gave me no food, I was thirsty and you gave me no drink, a stranger and you gave me no welcome, naked and you gave me no clothing, ill and in prison, and you did not care for me.'

Then they will answer and say,

'Lord, when did we see you hungry or thirsty or a stranger or naked or ill or in prison, and not minister to your needs?' He will answer them,

'Amen, I say to you, what you did not do for one of these least ones, you did not do for me.'

And these will go off to eternal punishment, but the righteous to eternal life."

#### FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

When a hunter killed a grizzly bear in a protected area, this was his defense: "when I saw that bear come smoking down on me, I didn't have any trouble in deciding who the endangered species was." We, humans react to warnings of death more alarmingly than the vibrations of life.

Today's Gospel encourages us to employ creative power to promote life. Pessimism grips us feistier than optimism.

**Today's Gospel is the parable of talents.** God did not mold humans in the same mold. Each of us is unique. Some are entrusted with five talents, others with two talents and some others with a single talent. This uniqueness may appear to us as inequality. Yes, it is inequality as long as we compare and define our individual worth to be quantitatively less or more than another person's individual worth.

**On the other hand the parable reminds us** that each of us has creative power within us. We grow every day. We can become better every day. We can make the five talents that are invested in us, into five more and the two talents into four . God appreciates those who used their creative power, "Well done, my good and faithful servant. Since you were faithful in small matters, I will give you great responsibilities. Come; share your master's joy." It is not what we have that makes us worthy servants of the Lord. Rather it is how we employ our creative power to better ourselves and others.

**Today's parable warns us not be like the person with a single talent** who took his creative power for granted. The fear of losing the single talent made him stop believing in his creative power. Having more talents or a single talent is a matter of comparison. The person with two talents has less than the one with five talents; but at the same time he has comparatively more than the person with a single talent. Those who would employ their creative power don't compare but grow in the life in and around them. Those who bury their creative power out of fear or any other excuse have nothing to grow as life, and we certainly know that life, if it does not grow, it dies.

**Life is always creative.** It can never stay stagnant or static. When it is not creative it can become selfdestructive. We are called to enthusiastically engage in life. All are gifted with enough enthusiasm to be creative. Life in itself has the inner force to be enthusiastic and enterprising. It cannot be curbed unless humans willfully suffocate its creative enthusiasm. When God created the universe, God blessed them and God said to them: Be fertile and multiply." (Genesis 1:28) Let us pray that blessings of God continue in all of us.



## **Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults**




The RCIA is a faith journey which leads those seekers to meet Jesus in the Easter Sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation.

# Freedom of Religious Expression in the Founding of America

In November, Americans prepare for the holidays and think about how our country came to be and why it is unique among all the nations of the world.

Freedom of religious expression is a key to understanding early American history and the founding of our nation. The British colonies that eventually formed the United States of America were settled in the 17th century by men and women who, in the face of European persecution, refused to compromise passionately held religious convictions and fled Europe. Although some settlers came for secular motives, the great majority left Europe to worship God in the way they believed to be correct. They enthusiastically supported the efforts of their leaders to create "a city on a hill" or a "holy experiment."

In the founding documents, our founders quoted thousands of Bible scriptures, opened and closed sessions with prayer to God, and openly stated that they used the Ten Commandments in writing the laws. "There are more than 4,500 recorded, public quotes by our Founding Fathers about the Bible, God, and the importance of ethics based on Christian principles," wrote author Randall Niles.(1)"History is clear: Judeo-Christian ethics are at the foundation of the United States of America. Morality was never seen as relative - it was always based on Natural Law and the authority of Scripture."(2)

#### Happening Now: 1776 Commission Established to Restore Patriotic Education

On Nov. 2, 2020, Pres. Trump signed an Executive Order to form the 1776 Commission with the goal "to better enable a rising generation to understand the history and principles of the founding of the United States in 1776, and, through this, form a more perfect ratification of a Constitution, civil war, abolition of slavery, Reconstruction, and a series of domestic crises and world conflicts. Those events establish a clear historical record of an exceptional Nation dedicated to the ideas and ideals of its founding."

"Against this history, in recent years a series of polemics grounded in poor scholarship has vilified our Founders and our founding. Despite the virtues and accomplishments of this Nation, many students are now taught in school to hate our own country, and to believe that the men and women who built it were not heroes, but rather villains. This radicalized view of American history lacks perspective, obscures virtues, twists motives, ignores or distorts facts, and magnifies flaws, resulting in the truth being concealed and history disfigured."
