A reading from the Gospel of Mark:

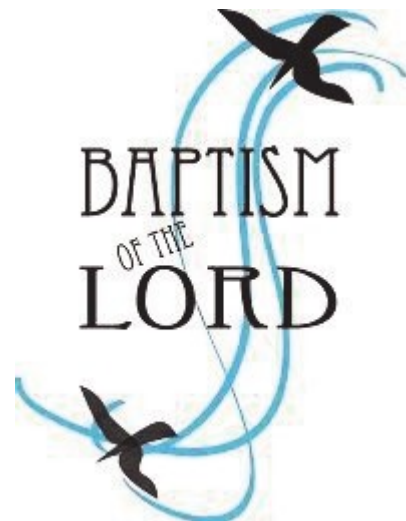
. This is what John the Baptist proclaimed:

It happened in those days that Jesus came from Nazareth of Galilee and was baptized in the Jordan by John. On coming up out of the water he saw the heavens being torn open and the Spirit, like a dove, descending upon him.

## FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

**During the minister's prayer, there was a loud whistle from the congregation.** Gary's horrified. Later she asked, "Gary, whatever made you do that?" Gary answered soberly, "I asked me to whistle and just then He did." God's gifts come to us in God's time and in God's measure.

**Today is the Solemn Feast of the Epiphany of the Lord:** Christmas proclaims that God, the Son of God, is born in finite human conditions, in a particular culture, time and space. Today's feast of the Epiphany announces that the human Baby Jesus is God, bound neither by a particular culture or group of people, nor constrained by a particular period of time or place. God in Jesus reveals to all, belongs to all and in Jesus fulfills God's gracious plan of salvation. God loves us all in God's inclusive way and in God's abundant mercy.

**The star that appeared in the sky announced** to all creation and every nation that God is with us. The three wise persons from the East represents how God loves all people beyond the borders of nations and culture in which Jesus was born. Today's feast makes us realize that God always reveals through various signs, and whoever seeks God will find God. The seeking hearts will recognize God's revelation. The Lord is the light and we can see the reality only when we open our eyes. Epiphany is the light of the Lord. Let us open our eyes and recognize the Lord.

**"20+G+M+B+21":** You may have noticed when you leave the church the writing "20+G+M+B+21" on the exit door of the Church. Three letters are the initials of the names of the three kings, Gaspar, Melchior, and Balthazar, and the numbers indicate the running year. This signifies that God is revealing to us who are the present day three kings. God is not a God of Old times, but of our times. In 2021. Epiphany is the time to celebrate our home as the home which recognizes God and invites Him to fill the house. Please write the same inscription inside your home, over the exit door. Every time you leave your home, this will remind you that God is ready to shine upon you with His wisdom and strength. Welcome the three kings.

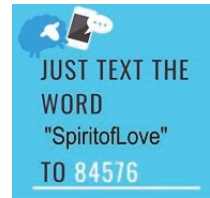

## Focus on Religious Freedom

### Our Story: Religious Freedom in Peril

In 1775, Paul Revere rode through the streets of towns and villages, country roads and dirt paths, calling out to his countrymen and neighbors to wake up, and prepare for an imminent attack on their freedoms.

In 2012, a group of Catholics came together bound by a common concern: the federal government's denial of freedom of conscience. Much like Paul Revere, they recognized the urgent need to alert their friends and neighbors to an attack on our foundational freedom – our freedom of religion.

"The constitutional freedom of religion is the most inalienable and sacred of all human rights."

The group was roused by the government's mandate that forced all employers, except churches, to provide abortion-inducing drugs, contraception and sterilization as part of their health insurance. These Catholics recognized that this was an extreme denial of religious freedom – and it was unconstitutional. The federal government was claiming the ability to deny First Amendment rights through regulations and excessive fines.

The Catholics – who were retired professionals, enjoying time with their families, and volunteering in their communities – saw that this information was not reaching Catholics in the halls of their schools and the vestibules of their churches, and they felt compelled to act. Their mission was clear: to draw attention to the ongoing erosion of religious freedom in the US and around the world.

"It's the duty of everyone to defend religious freedom and promote it for all people."

It was clear that secularism was being hard pressed on the heart of one of the most basic conscientiously-held beliefs – the sacredness of human life. The group knew from the world's history of religious intolerance and persecution that all Americans were in great jeopardy, particularly since religious freedom, the right of conscience, is the first of all our inalienable rights including life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness.

The group ultimately decided to mobilize and the Catholics for Freedom of Religion (CFFR) nonprofit organization was formed, embodying the group's commitment to grass-roots action. This has involved nine years of building resources and expanding volunteers to reach more fellow lay Catholics and bring attention to denials of religious freedom. Together, we continue to educate our fellow Americans about the facts and importance of religious freedom, how dearly it was purchased for us and how easily it is diminished and denied when we are not vigilant.
