



Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

February 14, 2021 Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time Leviticus 13:1-2, 44-46 Psalm: 31:1-2, 5, 11 1 Corinthians 10:31—11:1 Mark 1:40-45

A reading from the Gospel of Mark:

A leper came to Jesus and kneeling down begged him and said,

"If you wish, you can make me clean." Moved with pity, he stretched out his hand, touched him, and said to him, "I do will it. Be made clean."

The leprosy left him immediately, and he was made clean.

Then, warning the him sternly, he dismissed him at once.

He said to him, "See that you tell no one anything,

but go, show yourself to the priest and offer for your cleansing what Moses prescribed; that will be proof for them."

The man went away and began to publicize the whole matter.

He spread the report abroad so that it was impossible for Jesus to enter a town openly.

He remained outside in deserted places, and people kept coming to him from everywhere.

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends.

A father made his sons work in the cornfields while their peers spent the afternoon at the swimming hole. Someone scolded the father saying, "Why do you make those boys work so hard? You don't need all that corn."

The wise father replied, "Sir I am not raising corn. I am raising boys." We are all manufacturers. Some make good, others make trouble and still others make excuses.

Today's readings expose how the human can be different to each one of us. First reading is from the book of Job. Job exposes Life's negative side, "Is not man's life on earth a drudgery?... months of misery, and troubled nights ...night drags on with restlessness until the dawn....days come to an end without hope."- Life is full of unhappiness amidst trouble and turmoil, sufferings and sorrow.

On the other hand St. Paul in the second reading exclaims that his life is essentially in and out, all the time, in all its endeavors is nothing but the proclamation of the Gospel. Gospel means 'Good News'. Thus Life is nothing but the good news in all its aspects.

In today's Gospel reading Jesus clearly proclaims the purpose of His Mission saying "Let us go on to the nearby villages that I may preach there also. For this purpose have I come." For the followers of Jesus, Life has a single purpose which is nothing but the proclamation of Good News of Jesus. All what we do and say and all that we are pleased or burdened with as life, must have one message i.e. the good news of Jesus. As we read in the creation story we are God's creatures living in God's world and that "God looked at everything he had made, and found it very good." (Genesis 1:31) Jesus further explains that this God's world is God's Rule, God's Kingdom. "The kingdom of God is at hand. Repent, and believe in the gospel.(Good News)" (Mark 1:14)

We are in God's world; we live Jesus mission; thus as God's children and Jesus disciples, our life is surrounded by God's goodness and our living must be nothing but His Good News. As Paul says, 'to feel good,' 'to be good' and 'to live good' should be our nature and obligation. Let us pray for the awareness of being children of God and the disciples of Jesus to be, to live and to proclaim the Good News as the essence of our Life. .

Focus on Religious Freedom www.cffor.org

Parents - Do You Know What Your Children Are Learning in School? Are they taught that religious freedom is the first and the foundational freedom?

It is generally agreed that John Dewey (1859-1952) is the Father of American Education and his "contributions to government schooling are still recognized as being monumental even though he died over 60 years ago," wrote researcher Brad Harrub. (1) When at Columbia University, he put in place a framework for training thousands of teachers which shaped thinking on education in the U.S. and around the world.

However, Dewey was not primarily an educator but a philosopher and psychologist and not concerned with teaching new information. He was concerned with inculcating new attitudes and was considered a "social engineer" wrote education reformer, Bruce Price. (2)

Dewey's thought was strongly influenced by Charles Darwin's theories and he conceived of education as synonymous with an evolutionary process. Therefore, he believed the individual's duty was not to himself, God, or his family, but to his culture. Dewey once wrote, "Children who know how to think for themselves spoil the harmony of the collective society which is coming where everyone is interdependent." (3) John Dewey's views on philosophy and education flowed from the naturalist views of Darwin. He replaced Christianity with secular humanism which he described in his essay, A Common Faith: "Here are all the elements for a religious faith ... Such a faith has always been the common faith of mankind. It remains for us to make it explicit and militant." (4)

The Decline of American History in Public Schools - Part 1

"Those who don't know history are destined to repeat it."

"By reducing the importance of U.S. history in public schools, we deprive American children of an opportunity to learn their heritage.... The study of history cultivates an understanding and appreciation for the ideals the nation was founded upon," wrote news editor Daniel Doherty. ⁽⁵⁾ The foundational ideals of freedom: freedom of religion, freedom of conscience, and freedom of speech, are rarely emphasized or even taught.

Sadly, only 13% of U.S. High School seniors showed proficiency in their knowledge of American history, according to the National Assessment of Educational Progress 2010.




