Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

April 25, 2021
Fourth Sunday of Easter
Acts of the Apostles 4: 8-12
Psalm 118:1, 8-9, 21-23, 26, 28, 29
1 John 3:1-2
John 10:11-18

A reading from the Gospel according to John:

Jesus said:

“I am the good shepherd. A good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep. A hired man, who is not a shepherd and whose sheep are not his own, sees a wolf coming and leaves the sheep and runs away, and the wolf catches and scatters them. This is because he works for pay and has no concern for the sheep.

I am the good shepherd, and I know mine and mine know me, just as the Father knows me and I know the Father; and I will lay down my life for the sheep.

I have other sheep that do not belong to this fold. These also I must lead, and they will hear my voice, and there will be one flock, one shepherd.

This is why the Father loves me, because I lay down my life in order to take it up again.

No one takes it from me, but I lay it down on my own.

I have power to lay it down, and power to take it up again. This command I have received from my Father.”



FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

The Sufi Bayazid Bistami describes his progress in the art of prayer: “The first I visited the Kaaba (Holy Place) at Mecca, I saw the Kaaba. The second time I saw the Lord of the Kaaba. The third time I saw neither the Kaaba nor the Lord of the Kaaba.” God-experience starts with looking at each other, develops into experiencing the grandeur of God and attains the experience of losing oneself totally in God.

On the Third week of Easter the appearance of the Risen Jesus prepares His disciples to this spiritual attainment of totally losing themselves in Jesus and being fully filled with His Risen presence, as if there is nothing of themselves left in them. It all started with the empty tomb. The empty tomb gave them the desire to see the Risen Jesus. When the Risen Jesus appeared to them, they began to experience in Him, as the Lord Jesus, a victor over death.

In today's Gospel Jesus invites them to a deeper experience of losing themselves totally in Himself.. They are sent by Jesus as witnesses of what God has done in Jesus. Henceforth all that they would say or do would be claimed by Jesus for the sole purpose of bearing witness to what they have experienced as God's work in Jesus.

As witnesses they are sent in the name and power of Jesus to preach in his name to all the nations, beginning from Jerusalem. Jesus personally appointed them with the words, “You are witnesses of these things.” Jesus filled them with God's plan and with God's power. Their identity becomes God-given-identity. They were no more just their human selves, but extensions of Jesus in God. In the first reading we hear the disciples calling themselves as witnesses of what God worked in Jesus, “God raised him from the dead; of this we are witnesses.”. In the second reading John reminds that the same thing can happen to all those who believe in Jesus.

We will surely come to know him by keeping His commandments as happened to the disciples. By keeping his commandments we will experience “the love of God truly perfected” in us. That is to say that we will become the perfect love of God. We will experience that "I am crucified with Christ: nevertheless I live; yet not I, but Christ liveth in me: and the life which I now live in the flesh I live by the faith of the Son of God, who loved me, and gave himself for me." (Galatians 2:20) Easter is the event of Jesus empowering each of us with the power of Easter.

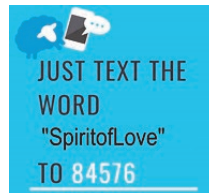

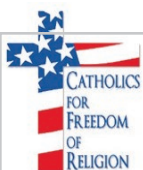

Canceling Worship Persists in Europe & Canada

(A Harbinger for Further Restrictions in America?)

As the world continues to confront coronavirus, many leaders have paused the reopening of their countries, announcing new constraints on travel, gatherings, churches, synagogues, and mosques.

Ireland: "This Cabinet will go down in history as the most anti-Christian Government of all time ... to think people will be persecuted for going to Mass or having public worship," said a minister of the Irish Parliament. "140 people or more were in this room today voting on legislation. There's churches in this country bigger than this and yet you allow only 10 people in!" said another minister.⁽¹⁾

Scotland: A group of 27 church leaders argued the Scottish government acted beyond their emergency powers. Judge Lord Braid said the Scottish regulations disproportionately interfered with the freedom of religion. "I have not decided that all churches must immediately open... All I have decided is that the regulations ... went further than they were lawfully able to do."⁽²⁾ Rev. Dr. William Philip said that the Scottish Ministers, "approach to banning and criminalizing gathered church worship was clearly an over-reach..."⁽³⁾

France was still under curfew in March and entered its third national lockdown on April 3, the day before Easter.

Germany is also still on lockdown with some relaxation promised at 7-day intervals for shops and service providers but no word yet of relaxation for churches.

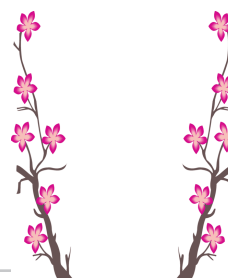
Vatican Congregation for Divine Worship issued guidelines for Holy Week, calling for return to "normal experience of Christian life through the physical presence of the faithful at Mass."⁽⁴⁾

Canada: GraceLife Church was "physically closed" by Alberta Health Services when authorities surrounded it with a chain link fence and blocked the entrance to the parking lot with police vehicles. The pastor, James Coates, resumed preaching on March 28, after being jailed for 35 days in February and fined \$1500, charged with violating health orders when he exercised his civil liberties by holding in-person services with the appropriate caution. "Now they've chained the doors of the church, enclosing it in chain link fence," said the pastor's wife. "This is all under the guise of a health order ... I pray for all the pastors and Christians that still think this is about a virus and health order. Clearly our Charter and criminal code mean nothing as long as the government can come up with a good enough story to disregard it. God have mercy on our nation."⁽⁵⁾

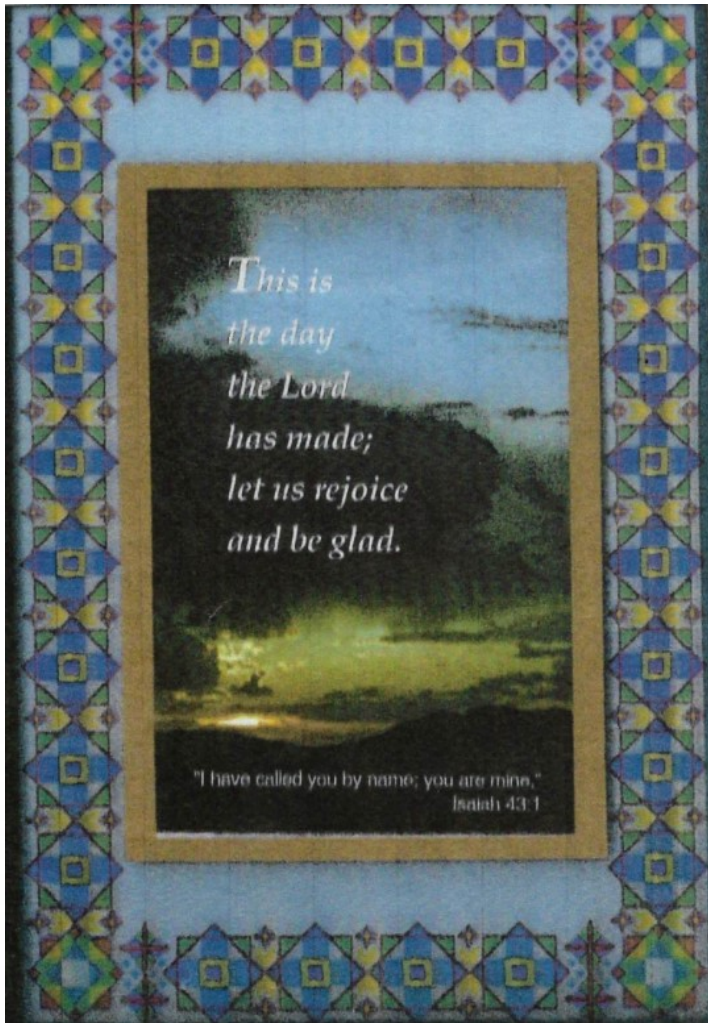
