### **A reading from the Gospel according to John:**

Jesus said to his disciples:

“I am the true vine, and my Father is the vine grower.

He takes away every branch in me that does not bear fruit, and every one that does he prunes so that it bears more fruit.

You are already pruned because of the word that I spoke to you.

## **FR. ANTONY'S LETTER**

Dear Friends,

**A king dreamed that he saw a king in paradise and a prophet in hell.** He wondered how this could be, and then he heard a voice say, "The king is in paradise because he respected the prophets. The prophet is in hell because he compromised with kings."

There are things that are okay to compromise. There are things that are not okay to compromise. Life is about learning the difference. (Katrina Mayer) If we limit our choices to what seems possible or reasonable we disconnect ourselves from what we truly want, and all that is left is compromise. (Robert Fritz)

**The readings of this Fourth Sunday of Easter** address the inner reality that cannot be compromised for anything. Jesus portrays Himself as the Good Shepherd who loves us even to the extent of laying down his life for us, the sheep. He could have avoided such a painful death on the cross, as He said that no one has the power to take it from Him. He chose to lay down His life for the sheep. That is the way God planned to show the Godly selfless love in Jesus and Jesus would not compromise that kind of Godly reality in Him for any other easy selfish way.

**In the First reading we hear Peter attributing the healing of the cripple to the power of God** revealed in the death and resurrection of Jesus "it was in the name of Jesus Christ the Nazorean whom you crucified, whom God raised from the dead; in his name this man stands before you healed."

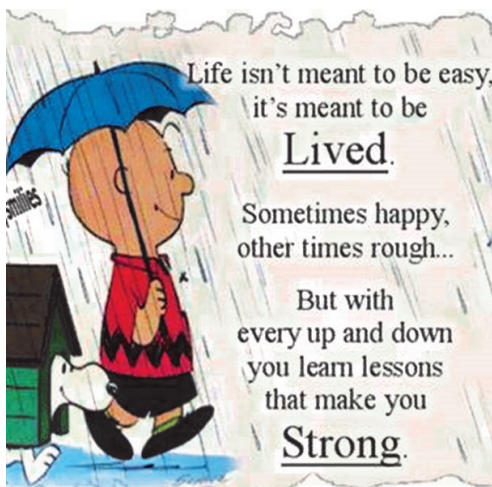
Peter did not stop there. He began to proclaim the uncompromising God's reality which is: "There is no salvation through anyone else, nor is there any other name under heaven given to the human race by which we are to be saved."

**In the name of Jesus God has bestowed upon each of us** the richest grace of being God's children and sheep of Jesus, the Shepherd. Today's second reading promises that those who would live this reality uncompromisingly, will grow richer in their identity even to the level of becoming God like.

"Beloved, we are God's children now; what we shall be has not yet been revealed. We do know that when it is revealed we shall be like him, for we shall see him as he is." Unless we compromise our inner reality with anything lesser than who we are as God's image, nothing could stop us from being God-like.

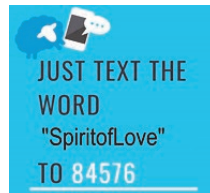

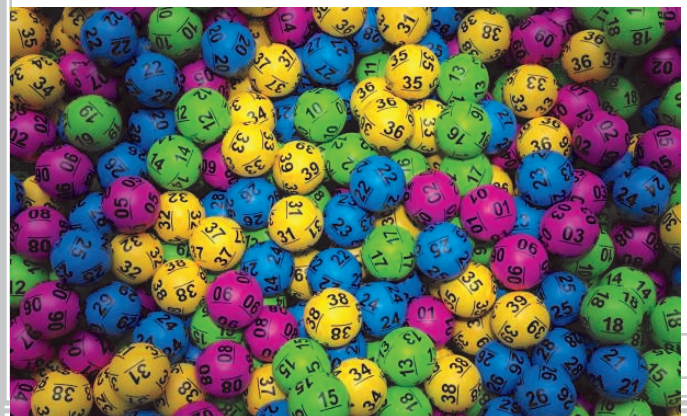


**CIRCLE OF WOMEN**

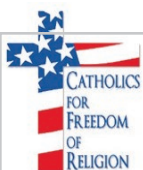

## Focus on Religious Freedom

### Some With Courage Are Defending Religious Freedom

"Get out! Get out! ... Don't come back without a warrant!," <sup>(1)</sup> yelled Pastor Artur Pawlowski to police and a public health officer as they "entered the church building uninvited on its holiest, most anticipated day for parishioners," during their church's Passover service in Alberta, Canada. "If they want to inspect the building, they can call me and we can arrange that... I asked them to get out and they would not move," said the Polish Pastor. <sup>(2)</sup>

"I grew up under communist dictatorship behind the Iron Curtain, under the brute of the Soviets... It was like a ...flashback when those police showed up at my church.... And the only thing I could do is to fend off the wolves as a shepherd, and I used my voice to get rid of them." <sup>(3)</sup>

In a "Huge Win!" <sup>(4)</sup> California lifts capacity limits on churches and in home religious gatherings following five rebukes from the U.S. Supreme Court in five separate cases citing the First Amendment's right to religious freedom. "This is the fifth time the Court has summarily rejected the Ninth Circuit's analysis of California's COVID restrictions on religious exercise," the opinion said. <sup>(5)</sup>

"For over a year, the state of CA has targeted the faith community for discriminatory treatment depriving them of their fundamental right to worship. It shouldn't take a decision from the Supreme Court, much less five decisions, for Gov. Newsom to realize that what he has been doing is unconstitutional," said Center for American Liberty founder and CEO Harmeet Dhillon. <sup>(6)</sup>

Colorado cake artist Jack Phillips is again defending his freedom to practice his Christian faith in his refusal to create a cake celebrating a gender transition. "Jack Phillips serves all people, no matter how they identify, but he cannot violate his conscience and create custom cakes celebrating all messages," said Alliance Defending Freedom. <sup>(7)</sup>

"And, he is not alone. There are cases like these across the nation where an artist's livelihood - and in some instances, their homes and personal assets - are on the line simply for not wanting to speak a message that violates their core convictions. ... our system of justice is being weaponized as nothing more than an arm of cancel culture to ruin people with whom one disagrees." <sup>(8)</sup>

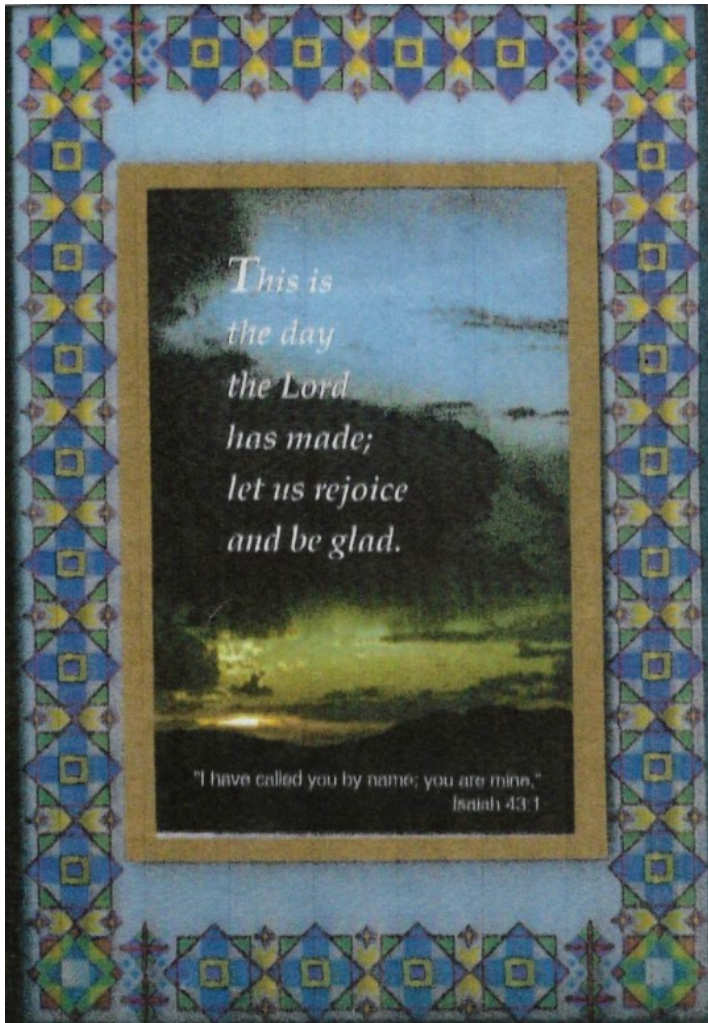
