Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

June 6, 2021 The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ Exodus 24:3-8 Psalm 116:12-13, 15-16, 17-18 Hebrews 9:11-15 Mark 14:12-16, 22-26

A reading from the Gospel according to Mark:

On the first day of the Feast of Unleavened Bread, when they sacrificed the Passover lamb, Jesus' disciples said to him,

"Where do you want us to go and prepare for you to eat the Passover?"

He sent two of his disciples and said to them,
"Go into the city and a man will meet you, carrying a
jar of water. Follow him. Wherever he enters, say to
the master of the house, 'The Teacher says,

"Where is my guest room where I may eat the Passover with my disciples?"

Then he will show you a large upper room furnished and ready. Make the preparations for us there."

The disciples then went off, entered the city, and found it just as he had told them; and they prepared the Passover


While they were eating, he took bread, said the blessing, broke it, gave it to them, and said, "Take it; this is my body."

Then he took a cup, gave thanks, and gave it to them, and they all drank from it.

He said to them,

"This is my blood of the covenant, which will be shed for many. Amen, I say to you, I shall not drink again the fruit of the vine until the day when I drink it new in the kingdom of God."

Then, after singing a hymn, they went out to the Mount of Olives.



FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends.

After attending church with his parents one Sunday morning and before getting into bed that evening, a little boy knelt at his bedside and prayed, "Dear God, we had a good time at church today, but I wish you had been there."

The parents went to church for the love of God and His presence in the church. Their son just followed his parents. Soon his following will become a habit; a habit will look for meaning, the meaning will lead to feel the presence, and the presence will bond God and the believer in love. Today we celebrate this process of experiencing God in and as love.

Today is the Solemn Feast of the Holy Trinity, an ungraspable mystery that is hard to be understood by human mind and impossible to be explained by human words. But, though ungraspable, the strange thing with God's Trinitarian mystery is that it can be experienced by every human person, and whoever experiences it can become a living witness/expression of it.

What is Trinity? Trinity is the divine mystery of One God in three persons, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Each person of the Trinity has their own uniqueness yet they are not different from each other or divided against each other. Only existential and unconditional love that each person has for the other two can explain and make us capable of experiencing this God-reality of One God in Three Persons. Love alone has the ways and means of entering into the ungraspable truth of God because love is a mystery in itself. To understand the mystery of love, let us start with human love. When we love someone or someone loves us, we will be able to experience it but will always struggle to explain it to the other how much we love or are being loved. Love is a mystery in the sense that humans can experience it deeply but would not be able to explain its depth in any human words and gestures. We know it is there but we are not able to explain or prove it to anybody convincingly or satisfactorily in human terms.

It is exactly the same with the Mystery of God, because God is PURE LOVE. God is not a single lonely person living far away from us in an abstract way. God is one but three persons living in a loving bond. The Father's eternal love begets or gets revealed as love in the person of Son; and the interpersonal love between Father and the Son is in itself an expression of the third person, the Holy Spirit. Thus God is a loving relationship. Whoever lives in love will automatically reflect God and whatever one does as an expression of love towards others begins to live the mystery of God. Thus the Solemn celebration of the Trinity, one God in three persons is a personal invitation from God to us to live the mystery of Love. When we love we not only experience the beloved but also bring God alive in our everyday life. In loving we become a living expression of God.

The first two weekends of June, we will celebrate the first communions for 80 children of our parish in five different private masses just with their families. Let us pray that they experience the love of God in the sacrament of Eucharist, the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ.

Catholic Bishops and Other Faith Leaders Urge Stopping the Misguided "Equality Act"

Catholic Bishops and other faith leaders are once again urging people to contact their U.S. Senators via social media, email, or by phone as they prepare to vote on the misguided "Equality Act." The House of Representatives passed this well intentioned but ultimately harmful legislation that "discriminates against people of faith, threatens unborn life, and undermines the common good" ⁽¹⁾ on February 25, 2021 and it can be voted on by the Senate at any time now.

The USCCB (US Conference of Catholic Bishops) explain that while the so-called Equality Act purports to protect people experiencing same-sex attraction and gender discordance from unjust discrimination, in fact, the bill would discriminate against people of faith because of their beliefs about life, marriage and sexuality. The Equality Act also "exempts itself from the bipartisan Religious Freedom Restoration Act, thereby infringing on religious freedom and making it more difficult for Individuals to live out their faith." (2) "It would mean that Catholics, evangelicals, Orthodox Jews, Mormons, Muslims and many other religious communities could not raise religious objections ... In effect, religious entities would be secularized." (3)

According to the USCCB, these are some of the direct effects and possible consequences of this legislation: (4)

- Require religious organizations to cover gender "transition" procedures in their health insurance plans;
- Force girls and women to compete in sports against males who identify as female;
- Force girls and women to share locker rooms, showers, restrooms, and dorms with males who

identify as female;

- Shut down Catholic and other Foster Care and Adoption Agencies who will only place children in homes with a married mother and father:
- Force small business people to support events or create products that violate their beliefs or be put out of business;
- Likely require taxpayers to fund elective abortions and likely force doctors and hospitals to perform abortions against their conscience or beliefs.

Minority Christian leaders have proposed an alternative to this Act called the *Fairness for All Act*, which they say would protect religious liberties as well as preserve the rights of the LGBT community. "Black and Brown Christians worked too hard for the Civil Rights Act to have it revised in ways that would take away basic rights and funding from our communities. The Equality Act needlessly pits the concerns of diverse communities against each other." (5)
