Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

June 13, 2021 Eleventh Sunday in Ordinary Time Ezekiel 17:22-24 Psalm 92:2-3, 13-14, 15-16 (2a) 2 Corinthians 5-6-10 Mark 14:26-34

A reading from the Gospel according to Mark:

Jesus said to the crowds:

"This is how it is with the kingdom of God; it is as if a man were to scatter seed on the land and would sleep and rise night and day and through it all the seed would sprout and grow, he knows not how.

Of its own accord the land yields fruit, first the blade, then the ear, then the full grain in the ear.

And when the grain is ripe, he wields the sickle at once, for the harvest has come."

He said.

"To what shall we compare the kingdom of God, or what parable can we use for it? It is like a mustard seed that, when it is sown in the ground, is the smallest of all the seeds on the earth.

But once it is sown, it springs up and becomes the largest of plants and puts forth large branches, so that the birds of the sky can dwell in its shade."

With many such parables he spoke the word to them as they were able to understand it. Without parables he did not speak to them, but to his own disciples he explained everything in private.



FR. ANTONY'S LETTER


Dear Friends,

When a matron was signing up for exercise classes, the instructor told her to be sure to wear loose clothing to class. She responded, "Listen, if I had any loose clothing, I would not need this class." Whenever we sign up or commit ourselves to a regular activity like Gym or weight-watching, we desire a newer-self to happen in us.

Today is the Solemn Feast of CORPUS CHRISTI i.e., the Solemn Feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. What do we celebrate in this Feast? We celebrate what Jesus asked us to do in His Last Supper on Holy Thursday. After sharing His Body and Blood in the form of bread and wine, Jesus said "Do this in memory of me." When we commit to celebrate the memory of Jesus' meal we will realize that we become His living presence.

The books of the Acts of the Apostles (Acts 2:42; 20:11; 27:35.) and Paul's letter to the Corinthian Church (1Corinthians 11:24-26) narrate that whenever the early church celebrated breaking of the bread they believed and experienced the presence of the Risen Jesus. For the last two millennium we, the church celebrate the "Breaking of the Bread and drinking from the Cup" in our coming together in memory of what Jesus commanded us to do. Our faith experience of this celebration is the real presence of Jesus in the midst of the believers.

The celebration of the Mass is not a simple pious memory or recalling the event of what took place two



millennium ago. It is a celebration of the presence of Jesus among us and in each of us. The bread we break becomes the medium or Sacramental symbol of Jesus' presence. As the bread becomes the body of Christ, we the people who celebrate Jesus 'Last Supper in His memory, become the mystical body of Christ. By receiving His body and blood in the form of bread and wine, we become what we eat. By eating His Body and drinking His Blood each of us becomes a member of His Body.

Thus by celebrating the Feast of the Body of Christ we revitalize our faith that Christ's presence is in each of us. and in turn we will to offer ourselves to live as His Body and ready to recognize that each of us is a member of His Body. We are sanctified and empowered to be just like Him. Let us commit ourselves to this mystery of the Body of Christ. Every time we celebrate Mass let us remember and acknowledge that a newer-self happens in the presence and power of Jesus.

June is the month devoted to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. God is love, and the heart is the symbol and

the place of love. The Sacred Heart opens our hearts to experience and accept God in love. I suggest you pray this traditional small simple prayer, every day "Jesus, meek and humble of heart, make my heart like unto Thine." Please pray this line as often as you can at whatever time of the day during June. Jesus will help us to understand everything from His Heart, in the light of Love, as God reveals

Concern About Religious Freedom Protections in the Military

Recently, both members of Congress and retired military leaders have voiced concern about protecting the rights and freedoms, including Freedom of Religion and Freedom of Speech, for our current service members. This concern was in part, prompted by Department of Defense Secretary Austin who said, "Extremism presents a complex and unique challenge to DoD. We must meet this head-on, working to stamp out extremism among the ranks, permanently." (1)

"The U.S. Army produced training materials that labeled Christians and Catholics as religious extremists alongside Hamas and al Qaeda, never mind the fact that evangelicals and Catholics continue to comprise the majority of those serving in uniform today. Labeling religious and political beliefs that are held by tens of millions of Americans as extremist is to declare them unwelcome and unfit to serve...," said First Liberty Institute in testimony before Congress. (2) "At a time of turmoil and instability, during which our nation faces many external threats, (this) message is inappropriate and offensive to our service members and those they defend." (3)

Catholics can be thankful that, per the Archbishop for Military Services, Timothy P. Broglio, "the military is the largest single source of vocations to the priesthood" in the United States.⁽⁴⁾
