

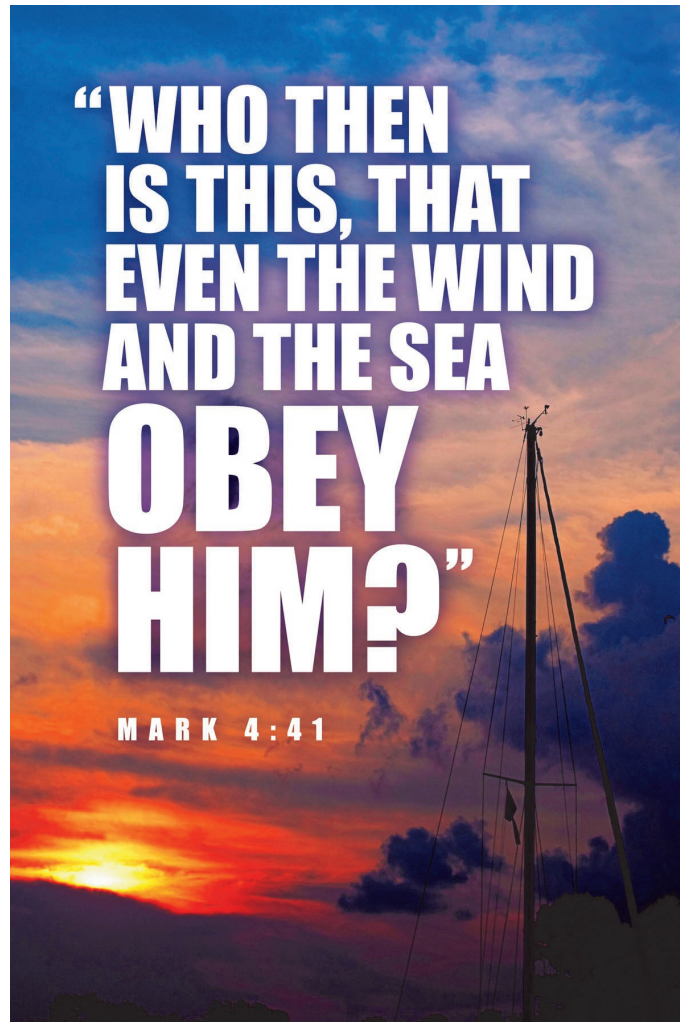

A reading from the Gospel according to Mark:

When Jesus had crossed again in the boat to the other side, a large crowd gathered around him, and he stayed close to the sea. One of the synagogue officials, named Jairus, came forward. Seeing him he fell at his feet and pleaded earnestly with him, saying, "My daughter is at the point of death. Please, come lay your hands on her that she may get well and live."

He went off with him, and a large crowd followed him and pressed upon him.

There was a woman afflicted with hemorrhages for twelve years. She had suffered greatly at the hands of many doctors and had spent all that she had. Yet she was not helped but only grew worse. She had heard about Jesus and came up behind him in the crowd and touched his cloak. She said, "If I but touch his clothes, I shall be cured." Immediately her flow of blood dried up. She felt in her body that she was healed of her affliction. Jesus, aware at once that power had gone out from him, turned around in the crowd and asked, "Who has touched my clothes?" But his disciples said to Jesus, "You see how the crowd is pressing upon you, and yet you ask, 'Who touched me?'" And he looked around to see who had done it. The woman, realizing what had happened to her, approached in fear and trembling. She fell down before Jesus and told him the whole truth. He said to her, "Daughter, your faith has saved you. Go in peace and be cured of your affliction."

While he was still speaking, people from the synagogue official's house arrived and said, "Your daughter has died; why trouble the teacher any longer?"

Disregarding the message that was reported, Jesus said to the synagogue official, "Do not be afraid; just have faith."

He did not allow anyone to accompany him inside except Peter, James, and John, the brother of James. When they arrived at the house of the synagogue official, he caught sight of a commotion, people weeping and wailing loudly. So he went in and said to them, "Why this commotion and weeping? The child is not dead but asleep." And they ridiculed him.

Then he put them all out.

He took along the child's father and mother

and those who were with him and entered the room where the child was.

He took the child by the hand and said to her, "*Talitha kum,*" which means, "Little girl, I say to you, arise!"

The girl, a child of twelve, arose immediately and walked around.

At that they were utterly astounded.

He gave strict orders that no one should know this and said that she should be given something to eat.

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

A man, who was driving the car with his wife in the back seat, stalled his car on a railroad track. A train was coming down the track. His wife screamed, "Go on! Go on!"

The husband responded, "You've been driving all day from the back seat. I have got my end across the track. See what you can do with your end."

If life is like a car, who is its driver and who is the back seat driver?

The Gospel today narrates the story of Jesus sleeping in the stern

(back seat) of the boat while the disciples were rowing the boat

against the violent squall and bashing waves. Jesus' sleep was

interpreted by his disciples as his not caring about their troubles.

"Teacher, do you not care that we are perishing?" So they woke Him

up, expecting Him to take control of the situation so that they might

not sink.

After calming the sea, Jesus' question to his disciples, "Why are you

terrified? Do you not yet have faith?" presents Jesus in a different

light. His sleep shows that Jesus did not want to be a backseat driver.

He could sleep without any disturbance because He totally believed the way his disciples were rowing

the boat in the midst of the storm. His silence or sleep means that they could handle the

situation by themselves.

The creator knows the potential of His creatures He created. The creator would not allow anything that

the creature would not be able to carry out. God has given us sufficient grace for the crosses that we

have to carry. All we have to do is to be conscious of what St. Paul was conscious of in his inexplicable

and irremovable sufferings. God's grace is sufficient for us. (2 Corinthians 12:9). Let us be conscious

of Jesus in our back seat while we are at the driver's seat. Nothing can upset our journey. With God in

the back seat nothing can harm us.

After calming the storm, Jesus calms the disciples' inner storm of fear and faithlessness, "Why are you

terrified? Do you not yet have faith?" Again these words of Jesus invite them to reflect why they were

terrified. They feared the power of the storm because they doubted that their efforts would survive the

raging power of the storm. Life is not just about what I can or cannot do. Life is the continuous

consciousness of who is with us and whom we would allow to help us. God is our co-traveler, available

always to guide, strengthen and co-pilot with us sitting at our back seat without disturbing us and totally

confident of our ability and ready to help us in all our turbulent weathers. May our faith in God as our

co-traveler make the journey of our life easy and fearless.

Happy Father's Day. We wish them well and pray for them, the precious gift of God in our families. We

wish to share the wisdom of the words of Pope Francis on March 19, the feast of St. Joseph, patron saint of the universal church and Jesus' earthly father.

Pope Francis urged all dads in the world to stick by their children's side, teaching them, guiding them and loving them. "I ask that you have the grace to

be very close to your children, letting them grow, but being by their side. They need you, your presence, to be there, your love!"

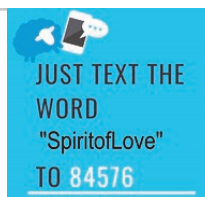

U.S. Catholic Bishops Designate Religious Freedom Week: June 22-29

Each year, the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) observes Religious Freedom Week. It begins on June 22, the feast day of SS Thomas More and John Fisher, two English martyrs who fought religious persecution in the early 16th century. The week includes the Nativity of St. John the Baptist on June 24 and ends on June 29, the feast of SS Peter and Paul, two apostles martyred in Rome.

The theme chosen for this year is *Solidarity in Freedom*. "Solidarity means much more than engaging in sporadic acts of generosity. It means thinking and acting in terms of community." (1)

The Bishops invite all "to pray, reflect and act to promote religious freedom." (2) The USCCB offers resources for each day focusing on different areas of religious freedom at www.usccb.org/ReligiousFreedomWeek

Her parents reached out to American Center for Law & Justice (ACLJ) who wrote a letter to the district explaining a Supreme Court ruling that

"students do not shed their constitutional rights at the schoolhouse gates..." (4) "We're happy to report that after reading our letter, the school thanked us for educating them and removed all restrictions on Gabrielles's reading," the ACLJ reported. (5)
