When the sabbath came he began to teach in the synagogue, and many who heard him were astonished.




Jesus said to them,

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

A customer walked in an insurance office looking for a quote. But first, the agent had to lead her through a litany of questions including "Marital status?"

"Well", she began, "I guess you could say we are happy – as happy as most other couples nowadays." A simple question can sometime bring an unexpected answer. Likewise, when we approach God with a simple petition of our single need, God would respond to our petitions in God's abundance, more than we asked for.

Today's Gospel is a double miracle, one intertwined into the other explaining how the touch of Jesus responds to a simple prayer with God's abundant grace. In the first miracle the woman, suffering from a hemorrhage for twelve years, approached Jesus with a simple petition, "If I but touch his clothes, I shall be cured." Her wish was so singularly simple that she wanted to touch Him and be healed anonymously without anyone's knowledge.

But touch always includes two people. When she touched Him for healing, He touched her and not only healed her but also turned her into a public witness of faith in Him. ""Daughter, your faith has saved you. Go in peace and be cured of your affliction." When a faithful touches God with prayer, God touches the faithful with favor of God's abundance. The faithful becomes not only the healed but also the public witness of faith in the Healer.

The second miracle is a pleading call from a father for Jesus' touch. "My daughter is at the point of death. Please, come lay your hands on her that she may get well and live." On his way to the girl's house, Jesus was delayed by the first miracle and he could only reach the house after the death of the girl, only to be ridiculed by the people. He took the child by the hand and said to her, "Little girl, I say to you, arise!" The girl, a child of twelve, arose immediately and walked around. The touch of God brought the dead to life. What is impossible for people is possible with God.

When everything around us seems unpromising, impossible and deadly Jesus only repeats the same words that He said to the girl's father, "Do not be afraid; just have faith." Yes faith makes things Possible, not easy. Both miracles encourage us to approach God with faith. Our prayer in faith may express just what we want but God would answer us more than we have prayed, expected, dreamt or imagined. (Ephesians 3:20)

Congratulations to 120 teenagers who will receive the Sacrament of Confirmation this week; 40 on Monday, June 28th, 40 on Wednesday, June 30th and 40 on Friday, July 2nd. Please pray for them and their families that they may be inspired by the reception of the Holy Spirit and begin to live as witnesses to God's love and testimony to Jesus' message.

Religious Freedom Week: June 22-29 continued

The annual observance of Religious Freedom Week began as the Fortnight for Freedom in 2012, when the Church and other religious liberty advocates were concerned about threats to the Defense of Marriage Act (1) In 2021, the U.S. Bishops continue to see threats to Catholic institutions in many different areas of concern. Also, this year's observance comes as the Supreme Court is due to rule on a Philadelphia First Amendment case that has implications for religious freedom in the area of foster care and adoption. "Domestically, a major area of concern continues to be freedom for Catholic institutions, such as schools, hospitals. and child welfare service providers, to carry out their missions with integrity," said a bishops' press release. The Equality Act
Church Vandalism
Catholics in Nigeria
Conscience Rights for Medical Professionals

"The U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) Committee for Religious Liberty collaborated with the Office of International Justice and Peace to raise awareness and show solidarity with people throughout the world who suffer for their faith, from the persecution of Christians in Nicaragua to highlighting Pope Francis's trip to Iraq this year." (4) Through prayer, education, and public action

during religious Freedom Week, the USCCB hopes to promote the essential right of religious freedom for Catholics and for those of all faiths.

And, as my brothers, the United States Bishops, have reminded us, all are called to be vigilant, precisely as good citizens, to preserve and defend that freedom from everything that would threaten or compromise it. Happening Now: Ruling that Vermont Cannot Deny Aid to Catholic School Students

Vermont's Town Tuition Program (TTP) provides funding for students in towns where the public school system does not cover all grade levels. When TTP administrators refused funding to four students who chose to attend a Catholic high school, their parents and the diocese sued and won at the Court of Appeals.

"Four years ago, the Supreme Court reminded states that it has repeatedly confirmed that denying a generally available benefit solely on account of religious identity imposes a penalty on the free exercise of religion ..." wrote Judge Steven Menashi.

"Officials who administer Vermont's (TTP) Nevertheless continued to discriminate against religious schools and students in violation of the first Amendment." (5)


