Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

August 8, 2021 Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time 1 Kings 19:4-8 Psalm 43:2-3, 4-5, 6-7, 8-9 Ephesians 4:30-5:2 John 6:41-51

A reading from the Gospel according to John:

The Jews murmured about Jesus because he said, "I am the bread that came down from heaven," and they said,

"Is this not Jesus, the son of Joseph? Do we not know his father and mother?

Then how can he say, 'I have come down from heaven'?"

Jesus answered and said to them,

"Stop murmuring among yourselves. No one can come to me unless the Father who sent me draw him, and I will raise him on the last day. It is written in the prophets:

They shall all be taught by God.

Everyone who listens to my Father and learns from him comes to me. Not that anyone has seen the Father except the one who is from God; he has seen the Father. Amen, amen, I say to you, whoever believes has eternal life. I am the bread of life. Your ancestors ate the manna in the desert, but they died; this is the bread that comes down from heaven so that one may eat it and not die. I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world."

- 2) When a group of people you are with begin to negatively gossip, how do you re-act?
- 3) In your opinion, what are the reasons people enjoy gossiping?

Family and children's question:

When the conversation in your presence turns to negative gossip, redirect the conversation to something positive.

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

Jim hates to work out, which means the treadmill in his bedroom barely gets used. Nevertheless, he swears by it. "It really works."

"I throw my jeans over it, and they get smaller."

Every time we don't use a device properly, we begin to misuse it. At the end we bring hurt and harm to ourselves. When we don't understand rightly and try to take advantage of a person, we only misunderstand and make use of that person as we like, not as that person is.

Today's Gospel is the continuation of last Sunday's. Last week was the story of feeding more than 5000 people. This week the people come in search of Jesus but Jesus openly points out to them why they came to Him, "You are looking for me not because you saw signs but because you ate the loaves and were filled." While making them realize that they came to him for more free food, He invited them to avail themselves for the everlasting food from Him, "Do not work for food that perishes but for the food that endures for eternal life, which the Son of Man will give you."

God in Jesus begins with us as the giver of what we need but wants to make us as the receivers of what He offers. God feeds us with our worldly needs first only to make us thirst for Godly life. God sustains us not merely according to the human standard we set but uplifts us to the Divine standard that we are capable of living as His children.

Our search for Him or our prayers to Him are not merely our petitions to acquire or achieve what we need/want. Our spiritual moments with God are our yearnings and cravings to realize our full potential. At the end of today's Gospel Jesus invites us to live our full potential, saying, "I am the bread of life;



whoever comes to me will never hunger, and whoever believes in me will never thirst." The goal of all our searching and prayers must be to be fed by Jesus in such a way that we will never be hungry. Jesus guarantees that He is the person who would make it happen for us. Our believing in Jesus and praying to Him can bring in us a great fulfillment that we will never thirst for anything else,: that is to say that all our worldly thirsts will be quenched. All our thirsts will be quenched by our thirst for Jesus who alone will fulfill all our needs and cravings.

"Therefore if any man *be* in Christ, *he is* a new creature: old things are passed away; behold, all things are become new." (2 Corinthians 5:17)



Significant Rise in Christian Persecution Worldwide

"Let us pray for the many Christians in the world who still suffer persecution and violence. May God grant them the courage of fidelity." Pope Francis

More than 340 million Christians across the globe live in perpetual fear that they will be punished, harmed or even killed for merely practicing their faith. The annual World Watch List 2021 from Christian charity Open Doors showed this is a huge increase over previous years; the 2019 figure was about 260 million. Every day, 13 Christians worldwide are killed for their faith; 12 churches or Christian buildings are attacked; 12 Christians are unjustly imprisoned and another 5 are abducted

Open Doors identified three main trends driving the increase:

"Covid-19 acted as a catalyst for religious persecution through relief discrimination, forced conversion, and as justification for increasing surveillance and censorship."

"Extremist attacks opportunistically spread further throughout Sub-Saharan Africa, from Nigeria to Mali and beyond."

"Chinese censorship systems continue to propagate and spread to emerging surveillance states." (1)

"My heart breaks when I hear of believers in India and Vietnam being refused food and told 'let your God feed you.' Or when I hear of women like a Christian mother-of-three from Egypt who was kidnapped by the Muslim Brotherhood and forced to declare she had 'converted' in a video," said Open Doors CEO, Henrietta Blyth. (2)

"The pandemic has legitimized increased surveillance by totalitarian governments, with China leading the way. And nationalism driven by religious identity is increasing in countries such as India and Turkey." (3)

"It is tragic and unacceptable that this happen to

anyone, whatever their faith or none. Christians will only be freed from persecution when freedom of religion and belief is guaranteed for all." (1)
