Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

August 15, 2021
Solemnity of The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary
Revelation 11:19a; 12:1-6a, 10ab
Psalm 45:10, 11, 12, 16
1 Corinthians 15:20-27
Luke 1:39-56

A reading from the Gospel according to Luke:

Mary set out and traveled to the hill country in haste to a town of Judah, where she entered the house of Zechariah and greeted Elizabeth. When Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting, the infant leaped in her womb, and Elizabeth, filled with the Holy Spirit, cried out in a loud voice and said,

"Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb. And how does this happen to me, that the mother of my Lord should come to me?"

For at the moment the sound of your greeting reached my ears, the infant in my womb leaped for joy. Blessed are you who believed that what was spoken to you by the Lord would be fulfilled."

And Mary said:

"My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord; my spirit rejoices in God my Savior for he has looked with favor on his lowly servant.

From this day all generations will call me blessed: the Almighty has done great things for me and holy is his Name.

He has mercy on those who fear him in every generation.

He has shown the strength of his arm, and has scattered the proud in their conceit.

He has cast down the mighty from their thrones, and has lifted up the lowly.

He has filled the hungry with good things, and the rich he has sent away empty.

He has come to the help of his servant Israel for he has remembered his promise of mercy, the promise he made to our fathers, to Abraham and his children forever."

Mary remained with her about three months and then returned to her home.

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

A friend was really tired of hearing Mohammad Ali boast about his physical prowess. His constant claiming "I am the best!" was wearing thin. So he asked him how he did at golf. Ali replied, "I'm the best. I just haven't played yet." In all of us the best is yet to be discovered and yet to be displayed. Every time we are challenged, the best in us is ready to engage us to become better than what we were before the challenge.

All the readings of this Sunday speak about what to do or how to behave when we are to face challenges in our lives. The first reading Elijah, the most celebrated prophet of the Old Testament, did not have enough will, energy and motivation to deal with any more challenges in his life. He said to God, "This is enough, O Lord: Take my life." But God encouraged him saying, "Get up and eat, else the journey will be too long for you!" So Elijah allowed God to act in his most challenging time. He became God's most powerful prophet and was taken alive in a fiery chariot to be with God.

In the Gospel we see how Jesus met his challenge. Jesus claimed that He is the God-sent-food like the 'manna' which God provided their fore parents when they journeyed through the desert from Egypt to the Promised Land. Eating Him would keep the believers alive to reach the new Promised Land, which is eternal life with God. But the listeners were not ready to believe Jesus' claim. It was a challenge for Jesus to make them believe.

On the other hand it was neither easy for the listeners to see in Jesus what He claims to be. Their knowledge of who Jesus was, challenged them. "Is this not Jesus, the son of Joseph? Do we not know his father and mother? Then how can he say, 'I have come down from heaven'?" Jesus came down from his divine dignity to human level in order that they could understand and receive Him

easily . But that attempt of Jesus became a challenge for them. They could not see beyond Jesus' human conditions to grasp and believe in Jesus' divine mission..

Challenges are neither good nor bad in themselves. Every challenge we meet is only a call or an occasion which can bring good only if we are able to see it through. God is never a challenge to tempt and defeat us. God always invites and helps us to live our best for which He has created us. When we don't try our best to happen in us God would appear to us as a challenging and demanding God. God will never settle for anything less than the best in us and for us. Such faith in God will empower us to see through our challenges and come out of them with our best. Let us strive for the best. Let us pray to God to live our best.

August 14th and 15th - Next weekend we will begin a New Time. We will resume our Sunday obligation. By "Obligation" we mean not any legal or external force to do things, but a self-spiritual imposition or self-promise to care for ourselves to grow spiritually with God and others in love and service. Worshiping together on Sundays in the Church is the primary way of expressing our love for God and others, in praising God and praying for others and ourselves..

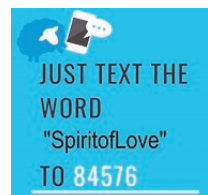

“Rise in Christian Persecution Worldwide” continued:

"It has been a tough year for billions of people. However, for many of the 340 million Christians worldwide who face persecution and discrimination, things have been worse still," said Open Doors CEO H. Blyth.⁽¹⁾

This year, the top 10 persecutors are: North Korea, Afghanistan, Somalia, Libya, Pakistan, Eritrea, Yemen, Iran, Nigeria, and India. Nigeria, with Africa's largest Christian population, is new to this list. Of the 4,761 Christians killed for their faith in 2020, over 2,200 Christians were murdered by radical Islamists in Nigeria alone.

"We've been all fighting a virus that we cannot see with the naked eye. Less known but equally as viral has been the discrimination, isolation and violence against Christians by using Covid-19 as a leverage and justification," said Open Doors President Curry.⁽²⁾ "Extremists ... are emboldened by governments weakened by Covid-19 restrictions, knowing they can steal food and medical supplies from already embattled Christian communities. ... Violence by Islamists in Nigeria amounts to genocide," he said.⁽³⁾

In India, the nationalist political party has encouraged persecution of Christians by sanctioning Hindu extremism and telling the nation only Hindus are truly Indian.

In China, the Communist Party (CCP) uses surveillance technology to track its people and punish them for attending church. A recent report from Radio Free Asia revealed that Chinese Christians are being detained in mobile "transformation" facilities and subjected to brainwashing, torture, and other violent measures to coerce them into renouncing the faith. "It was a mobile facility that could just set up in some basement somewhere," said Li Yeuse who was detained by the CCP for over 10 months. "They mainly target Christians who are members of house churches.... I couldn't sleep; after you've been in there a week, death starts to look better than staying

there."⁽⁴⁾

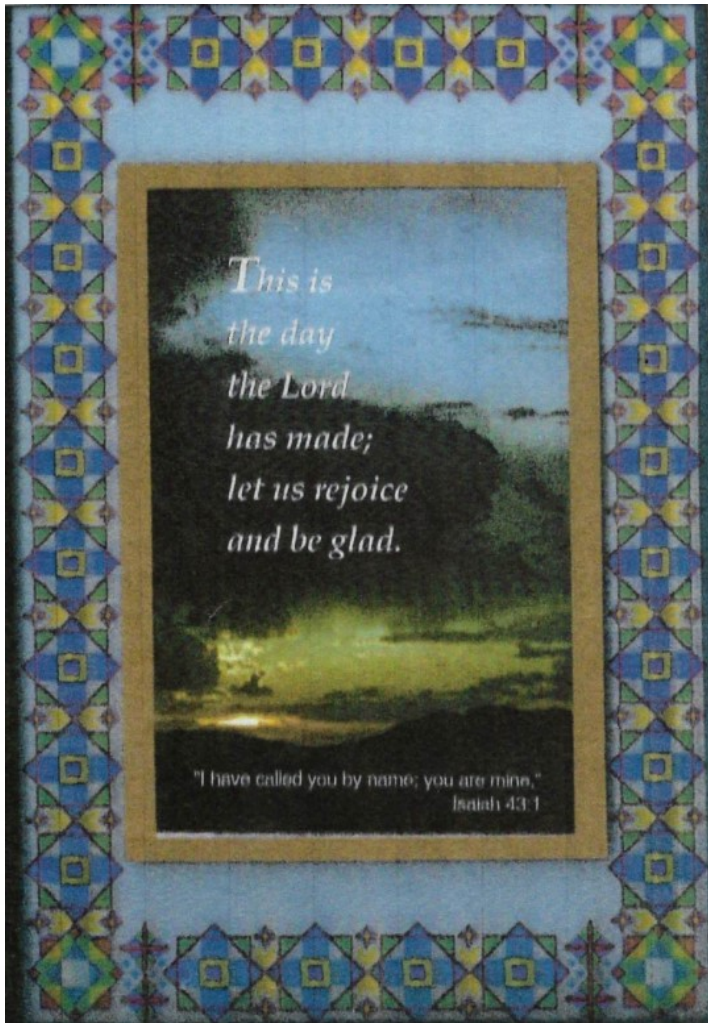
