A reading from the Gospel according to John:

Many of Jesus' disciples who were listening said, "This saying is hard; who can accept it?" Since Jesus knew that his disciples were murmuring about this, he said to them, "Does this shock you? What if you were to see the Son of Man ascending to where he was before? It is the spirit that gives life, while the flesh is of no avail. The words I have spoken to you are Spirit and life. But there are some of you who do not believe."

Jesus knew from the beginning the ones who would not believe and the one who would betray him. And he said, "For this reason I have told you that no one can come to me unless it is granted him by my Father."

As a result of this, many of his disciples returned to their former way of life and no longer accompanied him.

Simon Peter answered him, "Master, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life. We have come to believe and are convinced that you are the Holy One of God."

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

At a party in Japan a visitor was introduced to a popular Japanese drink. After his first drink he noticed the furniture in the room moving around. "This is a very powerful drink," he said to his host. "Not particularly," the host replied, "This happens to be an earthquake."

Often we may assume that we have or try to have control over everything that happens to us. But today's celebration affirms that the God-given-Life in us is bigger than what we can do to it.

Today we celebrate the Solemn Feast of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. A poor and unknown girl from an insignificant village of Nazareth has been raised by God to the highest honor a human being can have. Mary, in her Assumption, defines and declares the real worth of humans. As Psalm 8 portrays we humans are created little less than God crowned us with glory and honor. (Psalm 8:6)

Today's celebration is our wish to grasp how God fulfilled such Glory and Honor in His Blessed Mother Mary, who is one of us. Celebrating Mary for what happened in her is an occasion to each of us to

realize that what God has done for her, He would do for every one of us. On the one hand, Mary as a human being reveals to all of us humans what our potential is i.e., We are God's Honor and Glory. On the other hand, Mary who, as the Mother of Jesus, became the "Bearer of God" makes us realize that we too can become God-Bearers in our human flesh.

On this Feast Day, it is very much fitting to celebrate "WELCOME BACK" after

having gone through the tough time of 'Social Distance' and "Virtual Gatherings", "Masked Faces" and "Greetings without Handshakes and Hugs".

Today we come back to worship God and celebrate each other.

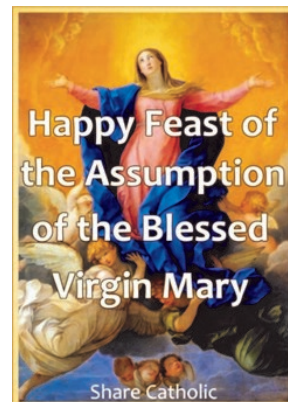
Worshiping God means that we gratefully remember how, by God's grace, we made it through this tough time and surrender our present and future to His merciful providence. '**Celebrating Each Other**' means that life as a Gift of God is stronger than this virus, that threatens life. Because Our Blessed Mother invites us to experience 1) the God who has created us with Honor and Glory, 2) the Christ who has shared with us the power of Resurrection

to live through and beyond Death, and 3) the Holy Spirit who is empowering us to live, not in fear of death, but in joy of living the God-given-life.

Starting from Today, we will begin to celebrate Mass as we used to do it before the Pandemic. . All ministries will participate. We will pass the basket to collect the offerings in order to express that our donations may represent our sense of joining the Spirit of Jesus who donates His body and blood in the form of Bread and Wine. During the time of the Pandemic our collection remained at the entrance lacking our expression of joining with the offering of Jesus.

After evaluating the various practices observed in the stores, gyms, restaurants, workplaces and various public places, the Diocese has instructed us to resume the offertory collections and offertory processions in order to liturgically celebrate our spirituality of giving to God in return to Jesus' giving to us. Please understand and cooperate with us. Let us begin what we used to do, only with the mindset to change if the need arises.

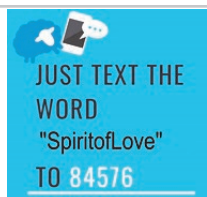
Until then let us not fear and curb ourselves but be cautious, safe and grow.

Where in the World is Christianity Growing and Why?

Pope Francis, in 2014, spoke in his homily about Christianity experiencing the largest numbers of martyrs today than ever before in its 2,000 year history.⁽¹⁾

"The world hates Christians for the same reason it hated Jesus: because He brought the light of God and the world prefers the darkness to hide its wicked works....The martyrs of today are greater in number than those of the first centuries," said Pope Francis again in 2016.⁽²⁾ In 2021, the number of martyrs is even greater.

Yet - despite this persecution on a massive scale, Christianity is growing faster than any time in history. Where is this happening and why?

***The more you mow us down, the more numerous we grow;
the blood of Christians is seed."*** -
Tertullian, early Church theologian (155 - 220AD)

In the last 100 years, the number of Christians in the world has quadrupled from about 600 million in 1910 to well past 2 billion in 2020. Christianity remains the world's largest religious group.⁽³⁾

Africa and Asia, with believers in the most persecuted countries, are seeing incredible expansion of Churches while the Church in Europe and America is declining. Millions of people across Africa and Asia in

historically unengaged people groups are now in rapidly growing Disciple Making Movements. In 2000, there were 6 such movements and today there are now 1,035.⁽⁴⁾

The Status of Global Christianity data reports that between 2000-2020:

* Africa had 37,825 new Christ followers **each day over the last 20 years.**

- * Latin America had 16,988 each day.
- * Asia had 13,443 each day.
- * North America had 1,999 each day.
- * Oceania had 473 each day.
- * Europe had 8 each day.⁽⁵⁾
