## Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

September 5, 2021 Twenty-Third Sunday in Ordinary Time Isaiah 35:4-7a Psalm 146:6-7, 8-9, 9-10 James 2:1-5 Mark 7:31-37

#### A reading from the Gospel according to Mark:

Again Jesus left the district of Tyre and went by way of Sidon to the Sea of Galilee, into the district of the Decapolis.

And people brought to him a deaf man who had a speech impediment and begged him to lay his hand on him.

He took him off by himself away from the crowd. He put his finger into the man's ears and, spitting, touched his tongue; then he looked up to heaven and groaned, and said to him,

"Ephphatha!"— that is, "Be opened!" —

And immediately the man's ears were opened, his speech impediment was removed, and he spoke plainly.

He ordered them not to tell anyone. But the more he ordered them not to, the more they proclaimed it.

They were exceedingly astonished and they said, "He has done all things well. He makes the deaf hear and the mute speak."

- 1. How exciting is it for you when you share the good news of Jesus?
- 2) What is the most exciting part of being Christian for you?
- 3) What sickness or infirmity that you have struggled with has Jesus healed for you?

#### FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

The pastor asked the children of his congregation, "What's gray, has a bushy tail and gathers nuts in the fall?" A child hesitantly answered, "I know the answer should be Jesus," she began, "but it sure sounds like a squirrel to me." Sometimes we may tend to mar our inner correct inspiration from pressure of outer social expectations. Or we may be ready to forego our original spiritual knowledge at the fear of being rejected by others.

Today's Gospel invites us to be true to ourselves and not to depend on societal or approval of others to live one's true self. The Pharisees pointed out to Jesus that His disciples are defiled, impure and

irreligious; thus they have become unspiritual by not observing the external traditional norms. Jesus responded to them that it is not the outer practices of any rules that make one true to oneself, but the expression of one's inner spiritual power.

In Jesus' simple words, nothing that enters one from outside can defile or define that person but the things that come out from within are what defile and define. We can be true only when we are living our inner spiritual self. Our outer practices can be empowered only when our inner self chooses that

practice as the right and conscious expression of our inner belief/conviction. It is our inner self that gives power and meaning to our outer; not vice versa. The truth is the expression of the inner in the outer.

But we, humans are so cunning that we can hypocritically practice appearing to be good while inwardly filled with corrupted thoughts and feelings. We are capable of living two different styles of life— one outwardly and the other inwardly; each totally opposed to the other. Life to be meaningful and powerful has to be unified and integrated. When we are split between our inner person and outer practices, our everyday life would become a war waged within our hearts trying to reconcile or negotiate our belief with outer meaningless practices. We would become our own enemy. Our life would become a battle ground between the inner and the outer.

The prayer of St. Paul is worth remembering at this point. "May the God of peace himself make you



perfectly holy and may you entirely, spirit, soul, and body, be preserved blameless for the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ." (1Thessolanians 5:23) The peace and blessing of God is experienced by those who live their entirety. Hypocrisy and its fruits like anger, jealousy, dissension, division etc., is caused when we sacrifice the entirety to please any one of the three faculties, spirit, soul or body. Let us pray that God help us live our entirety of the inner and the outer.





## EXTRAORDINARY MINISTER of HOLY COMMUNION

## Training Opportunities—Fall 2021



This training is required for **all** those who are beginning as Ministers. This "BASIC" training is required for **all** who wish to serve as Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion. Those who wish to minister in hospitals, nursing homes and to the homebound are required to attend "SPECIALIZED" training in addition to BASIC training. One **must** attend BASIC training prior to SPECIALIZED training.

## How to Register for Extraordinary Minister Training

Each pastor who has qualified candidates he wishes to be trained as Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion must send a nomination letter to Bishop Barres requesting the training. One letter from each parish is fine, as long as each individual attending is named on it. This letter must should be received one week prior to the training date requested. This letter must indicate the date and location of the training session each person(s) will attend.
