



Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

September 11, 2021 Twenty-Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time Isaiah 50: 5-9a Psalm 116:1-2, 3-4, 5-6, 8-9 James 2:14--18 Mark 8: 27-35

A reading from the Gospel according to Mark: Jesus and his disciples set out for the villages of Caesarea Philippi. Along the way he asked his disciples, "Who do people say that I am?" They said in reply, "John the Baptist, others Elijah, still others one of the prophets." And he asked them, "But who do you say that I am?" Peter said to him in reply, "You are the Christ." Then he warned them not to tell anyone about him. He began to teach them that the Son of Man must suffer greatly and be rejected by the elders, the chief priests, and the scribes, and be killed, and rise after three days. He spoke this openly. Then Peter took him aside and began to rebuke him. At this he turned around and, looking at his disciples, rebuked Peter and said, "Get behind me, Satan. You are thinking not as God does, but as human beings do." He summoned the crowd with his disciples and said to them, "Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me. For whoever wishes to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake and that of the gospel will save it." **Focus Questions:** 1. When you endured the worst suffering in your life, how did Jesus help you through it? 2) What does the term 'take up your cross' mean to vou? 3) What are some of the most meaningful lessons you

3) What are some of the most meaningful lessons you have learned after enduring deep suffering?

Suggestions for Action:

Bring joy to another who has withstood extreme suffering. Bring them a gift (flowers, baked goods, chocolates, etc.) and share time with them.


FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

It was a golden wedding anniversary party. With many family members and friends gathered the husband toasted his wife who was very hard of hearing, "My dear wife, after fifty years I've found you tried and true." Everyone smiled approval but his wife said, "Eh?" He repeated in a louder voice, "AFTER FIFTY YEARS I'VE FOUND YOU TRIED AND TRUE." His wife harrumphed and shot back, "Well, let me tell you something – after fifty years I'm tired of you, too." The message is often communicated not by what is said but by what is heard. The words don't become a message at the uttering but at the listening and grasping.

Today's Gospel is the miracle of healing a deaf man who also had a speech impediment. The healing

takes place by the touch and by the command of Jesus. His touching opened the biological faculty of hearing and speaking. His command ("*Ephphatha!*"— which means, "Be opened!") gave the purpose to the faculty of the man's hearing and speaking: What should our senses be opened to? Psalm 119:18 explains the purpose of our seeing, "Open my eyes to see clearly the wonders of your law."

The function and the purpose of the human faculties/senses are to see and grasp the wonder of God's law at work everywhere and in all persons.

The Gospel continues to describe what happens when the faculties of hearing and speaking are opened. The healed-man begins to proclaim the wonder of hearing and speaking. The people who has seen the healing and has heard the man speaking "were exceedingly astonished and they said, "He has done all things well." Thus the healed man has become the living- powerful message for the people to open their senses to how God does all things well.

Our human faculties of sensing, understanding and realizing are to be kept "OPEN" to the Godly wonders that are all around us in creation and its laws. We, in the name of our selfishness and



weakness can close all our faculties to our own needs or greed. But today's Gospel encourages us to set our potential beyond our selfish horizon. Let us pray to Jesus to open us to live the Divine realities and experience Godly wonders. Let us tune our senses to perceive and believe.

It's OK For Students to Pray in Public Schools

As students prepare for the new 2021-22 school year, they need an important tool in their backpacks: **knowledge of their religious liberty rights.**

On January 16, 2020 (Religious Freedom Day), the Dept. of Education issued updated *Guidance on Constitutionally Protected Prayer & Religious Expression in Public Elementary & Secondary Schools.* The guidance was originally issued in 2003. The Guidance explains that "students and teachers do not shed their constitutional rights at the schoolhouse gate." The law also requires that, as a condition of receiving federal funds, local education agencies must certify that they are in compliance with the prayer guidance.⁽¹⁾

The Supreme Court has repeatedly held that the First Amendment, with its enumerated rights of Freedom of Religion and Freedom of Speech, requires public school officials to be neutral in their treatment of religion, showing neither favoritism toward nor hostility against religion. The newly updated U.S. Department of Education Guidelines explicitly list the many rights of students in relation to religious expression. These rights include:

* **Students may read their Bibles** or other religious materials, say grace before meals, and pray or study religious materials with fellow students during recess, lunch hour, or other non-instructional time.

* **Students may express their beliefs** about religion in homework, artwork, and other written and oral assignments.

* Students may organize prayer groups, religious clubs, or other religious themed gatherings before or after school to the same extent that students are permitted to organize other non-curricular student activity groups.

* Schools may teach about religion but not provide religious instruction.⁽²⁾





EXTRAORDINARY MINISTER of HOLY COMMUNION

Training Opportunities-Fall 2021



This training is required for **all** those who are beginning as Ministers. This "BASIC" training is required for **all** who wish to serve as Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion. Those who wish to minister in hospitals, nursing homes and to the homebound are required to attend "SPECIALIZED" training in addition to BASIC training. One **must** attend BASIC training prior to SPECIALIZED training.

Plans for SPEICALIZED training will be shared in a separate communication

How to Register for Extraordinary Minister Training

Each pastor who has qualified candidates he wishes to be trained as Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion must send a nomination letter to Bishop Barres requesting the training. One letter from each parish is fine, as long as each individual attending is named on it. This letter must should be received one week prior to the training date requested. This letter must indicate the date and location of the training session each person(s) will attend.


