Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

October 10, 2021 Twenty-eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time Wisdom 7:7-11 Psalm 90:12-13, 14-15, 16-17 Hebrews 4:12-13 Mark 10:17-30

A reading from the Gospel according to Mark:

As Jesus was setting out on a journey, a man ran up, knelt down before him, and asked him, "Good teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life? "Jesus answered him, "Why do you call me good? No one is good but God alone. You know the commandments: You shall not kill; you shall not commit adultery;

vou shall not steal;

you shall not bear false witness;

you shall not defraud;

honor your father and your mother."

He replied and said to him, "Teacher, all of these I have observed from my youth." Jesus, looking at him, loved him and said to him, "You are lacking in one thing. Go, sell what you have, and give to the poor and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me." At that statement his face fell, and he went away sad, for he had many possessions. Jesus looked around and said to his disciples, "How hard it is for those who have wealth to enter the kingdom of God!" The disciples were amazed at his words. So Jesus again said to them in reply, "Children, how hard it is to enter the kingdom of God! It is easier for a camel to pass through the eye of a needle than for one who is rich to enter the kingdom of God." They were exceedingly astonished and said among themselves, "Then who can be saved?" Jesus looked at them and said, "For human beings it is impossible, but not for God. All things are possible for God."

Peter began to say to him, "We have given up everything and followed you." Jesus said, "Amen, I say to you, there is no one who has given up house or brothers or sisters or mother or father or children or lands for my sake and for the sake of the gospel who will not receive a hundred times more now in this present age: houses and brothers and sisters and mothers and children and lands, with persecutions, and eternal life in the age to come."

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

He was at last bold enough to ask the girl, whom he was dating regularly, "would you marry me?" Being very practical, the young woman replied, "When you have several thousand dollars, I will seriously consider it." Six months later the two strolled hand in hand through a park along the river. He stopped to kiss and asked her, "When are we going to get married?" She inquired, "Well, you remember my condition. Just how much have you saved?" He responded, "Exactly \$75." She sighed and smiled "Oh well, I guess that's close enough." Until the love blooms between persons they rely on external conditions as security for their union. Once the love becomes the basis, their relationship becomes unconditional.

Today's Gospel speaks about the unconditional and intimate love. According to the Pharisees the marital intimate union is bound by the Law of Moses, a legal union which can be severed by the force of the same Law that united them. But Jesus sees the marital intimate union intended and empowered by God, the Creator. The marital union unlike any other union is not bound by any external force or conditions. The marital union is so strongly, internally and creatively untied that they "two shall become one flesh. So they are no longer two but one flesh."

The marital union is a God-intended one that if the couple is seriously conscious of it NO LIMIT AND they will feel that God has joined them together; thus they can experience God Him-

self in living their marital union. Their human bond empowered by God could be so strong that no human has the power to separate them. "What God has joined together, no human being must separate." Laws are built upon human reasons and conditions, not on human hearts. It is we who give power to

God loves you 100%. The percent you receive is up to you.

Law and its power is not creative but judicial. It can unite or sever people's union on conditions or consequences. But the marital union is bonded in human hearts by the living presence and will of God the Creator. Such a kind of marital union is creative and only can grow and increase. It does not change according to seasons and situations. It is thus inseparable on any condition as long as it grows as bonded by God.

But we also know that humans are weak and lose focus on God. Our union

can slowly turn to be legal or habitual, dry or demanding, repetitious or repressive thus soon becoming burdensome and heartless. Human hard heartedness will not nurture any union. Then Law is the only solution with its own consequences to bear on the persons of the union. Let us pray for the person living in suffering union or in separation. May God open for them a new future based on creative love. May they be healed from the hardness of their hearts and make their legal burdens be made light.

Restrictions on Places of Worship in Australia, Canada and Ireland

Australia: Beginning on Sept. 11, some parts of the country initiated new Covid rules allowing citizens to leave home for limited hours a day and limited distance from home in order to shop, exercise or work. Proof of vaccination is required to enter a church. These rules are being challenge by many religious leaders. "... many pastors and faithful would be uneasy with restricting worship to the fully vaccinated and doing so could prove divisive," said Catholic Archbishop Fisher. (1)

Canada: Churches, synagogues and mosques had to negotiate Covid regulations that changed frequently. Often, there could be no in-person services at all. The country hoped to enter a new reopening phase in mid-September that will begin a return to in-person church services and major religious events like funerals, etc (2)

Ireland: Religious services resumed for the first time in May, 2021 but the sacraments of Baptism, Communion and Confirmation did not return. The Catholic Archbishop of Dublin said that parents must be trusted to know how to protect the health of their children and that a ban on communions and confirmation was seen as discriminatory.(3)


