Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

November 7, 2021 Thirty-Second Sunday in Ordinary Time 1 Kings 17:10-16 Psalm 146:7, 8-9, 9-10 Hebrews 9:24-28 Mark 12:38-44

A reading from the Gospel according to Mark:

In the course of his teaching Jesus said to the crowds,

"Beware of the scribes, who like to go around in long robes and accept greetings in the marketplaces, seats of honor in synagogues, and places of honor at banquets.

They devour the houses of widows and, as a pretext recite lengthy prayers. They will receive a very severe condemnation."

He sat down opposite the treasury and observed how the crowd put money into the treasury.

Many rich people put in large sums.

A poor widow also came and put in two small coins worth a few cents.

Calling his disciples to himself, he said to them, "Amen, I say to you, this poor widow put in more than all the other contributors to the treasury. For they have all contributed from their surplus wealth, but she, from her poverty, has contributed all she had, her whole livelihood."

- 1. Jesus praised the poor widow who gave less to the Temple than others. What feelings do you have when you hear Jesus' words?
- 2. Describe a time when someone's generosity affected you personally?
- 3. What is your reaction to people who try to impress others with their superiority?

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

Two men were adrift on a raft in the open sea, and it looked bad for them. Finally one of them, frightened, began to pray: "O, Lord, I've broken most of the commandments. I've got some pretty bad habits — I drink, I curse, I steal... but if my life is spared now, I promise you that I'll change, that I'll never again curse, that I...." Suddenly his friend cried out to him: "Wait, Jack. Don't go too far. I think I see another ship." Our common consensus is that one is punished for breaking the law and rewarded for its observance.

Today's Gospel speaks about something more than the Law's punitive or rewarding aspect. The purpose of the Law is to employ people's heart, soul, mind, and strength (which means to employ their all) to love God (who is above all) and others (who are their equals). Today's Gospel is Jesus' answer to a scribe's question "Which is the first of all the commandments?" Here 'the first' does not mean what is the number one law which begins the book of Law. 'The First' means 'the most important law' which enlightens all the other laws. It would mean that every law of the Law-Book has only one purpose that is to fulfill this 'the First Law'

Jesus answered the Scribe's question with what he knew already, i.e., to love God; but Jesus adds a second law to the first one as if they are inseparable, "You shall love your neighbor as yourself." Thus Jesus concludes His answer saying, "There is no other commandment greater than these." For Jesus, loving God is as important as loving one's neighbors.

The scribe who wanted to know what is that first law, responded to Jesus that the first and the second are actually One Most Important Law, one fulfilling the other, one giving meaning to the other and one unable to exist without the other. The purpose of the law is not merely to maintain order and security but to enable people to freely love with all that they are and have.

The purpose of the law is not merely to create a system, but to realize the meaning and power of living for every human being regardless of their status, class, creed or color. The law must not only provide an external ambience to safety and orderly system but also internally empower each person so that they can live and let live. Such a kind of living-power is possible for every one only when we freely choose to love each other for the greater good of LOVE (God's Love). Let us pray to God that His love becomes human love and our human love becomes pure like God's love.

November 2nd Friday, All Souls Day: At 7:00 pm is the memorial mass when we pray for all those whose funeral was held in our church since past November. Letters of invitation have been sent to the families. Please feel free to join us to pray for those deceased from our families.

Religious Discrimination Over Vaccine Exemption Requests

Navy Seals Seek Religious Exemption

A growing number of U.S. Navy Seals who are seeking a religious exemption from the DODs vaccine mandate are being threatened with punishment that includes demotion, pay cuts, repayment of the cost of training them and possible court martial. First Liberty Institute General Counsel, Mike Berry, representing 40 Navy Seals, explains that requesting a religious accommodation is a right guaranteed to service members under both federal and military law. "We should accommodate these heroes and not force them to choose between serving their faith and serving their country... There's medical exemptions...so why are they treating religion and religious freedom like they're second-class status." (1)

Medical School Accused of Religious Discrimination Over Exemption Requests

A federal complaint was filed against a Un. of Colorado medical school by the Thomas More Society on behalf of a Catholic pediatrician and bioethicist and a Buddhist first year medical student who "are unable to take the school's mandated vaccine because of deeply held religious objections." (2)

"The university's foray into theology has gone even further, with its administrators probing and debating the religious beliefs of its staff and students, rendering value judgments on believers in an inquisition that further violates the First Amendment," said attorney Peter Breen.
