



Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

November 14, 2021 Thirty-Third Sunday in Ordinary Time Daniel 12:1-3 Psalm 16;5, 8, 9-10 Hebrews 10;11-14, 18 Mark 13:24-32

A reading from the Gospel according to Mark:

Jesus said to his disciples:

"In those days after that tribulation the sun will be darkened, and the moon will not give its light, and the stars will be falling from the sky, and the powers in the heavens will be shaken.

"And then they will see 'the Son of Man coming in the clouds' with great power and glory, and then he will send out the angels and gather his elect from the four winds, from the end of the earth to the end of the sky.

"Learn a lesson from the fig tree. When its branch becomes tender and sprouts leaves, you know that summer is near.

In the same way, when you see these things happening, know that he is near, at the gates. Amen, I say to you, this generation will not pass away until all these things have taken place. Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will not pass away.

"But of that day or hour, no one knows, neither the angels in heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father."

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

In a fund raising event, the organizer wanted to try a new approach in order to make the participants donate more generously. At the decisive moment, he told everyone to stand and to reach forward to the person standing in front of them to get that person's wallet. Then he added, "Now open the wallet and give as you always wanted to but felt you couldn't afford." It is easier to be more generous with what is not ours than with what is our own. In the same vein, often our generous free will offerings come from the left-over we have after all our needs are taken care of.

Today's Gospel story explains to us that generosity has nothing to with what we have or do not have. Generosity is rather a living expression of what one is or is not. Jesus seems to be impressed with the very little offering of the poor widow than the big donation of the rich. Because the widow's offering expresses who she is, while the offering of the rich was a show of how much they possess. The former's offering was a sign of offering herself

totally to God while the latter's offerings were the demonstration of their 'generosity' before people. When Prophet Samuel was struggling by what standard he should choose a king to succeed King Saul, God advised him to go not merely by appearance but to go by heart. "For the Lord does not see the way that men see, for men look on the outward appearance, but the Lord looks at the heart." Jesus looked at the heart of the widow and not the worth of the money she offered.

The worth of anything or any person as small or big is weighed by what and how much their heart is involved. Our intention is a real value for God and not our possession. Our heart-felt giving makes us worthy before God and not our hard core hoarding. May all our giving express who we are from our hearts and not what we have in our wallet.

Nov 7th to 13th is Vocation Week. Let pray to the Lord of the Harvest to send more dedicated spiritual workers (priests, men and women religious) to sow seeds of God's grace and peace in the world. We know how much we are in need of Priests and Nuns to do the work of the Church. Let us initiate a dialogue among our young people how the world is in need of the Church's presence alive though the dedicated service of her sons and daughters. As the world is becoming more and more technological, digital and thus less personal and spiritual, we will soon be living like robots and machines

losing the original flavor of being a human in the spirit of love, mercy and kindness. Please pray for vocations that a large number of people be inspired by the Holy Spirit to sow the seeds of Christ's love to build the Kingdom of God.

November is the month we pray for those who lived with us and left us to be with God. Death is the reality of the biological body. But the Word of God explains that our body bears the Image of God (Gensis1:28) and is the Temple of Holy Spirit (Paul's Letter to the

Corinthians 3: 16-17). The body has its own limitation and can hold life only for a limited time. But the Spirit of God lives forever. Our beloved

finished their bodily life on earth. Now they are called by God to live eternally in God's presence. Let us pray that they have eternal rest and enjoy God face to face living eternally.

"Religious Socialism, Christian Socialism, are contradictory terms; no one can be at the same time a good Catholic (Christian) and a true Socialist."-Pope Pius XI (1922-1939)

The word "socialism" and "socialist" are often used in discussions today, but "few people in the modern Western world understand what socialism is" ... or the "traditional Marxist view of sociaism."⁽¹⁾ Socialism is not only about caring for the poor and eradicating poverty as many people mistakenly believe. "From **Pope Pius IX** (1846-1878) to **Pope Benedict XVI** (2005-2013), the popes have consistently condemned socialism" as "destructive" and "wicked." ⁽²⁾

"Socialism, like Communism, advances the view of the state as the supreme authority and inevitably persecutes religion.... Even when the persecution is not blatant or heavy-handed, the belief that the state is higher than the Church leads to innumerable forms of persecution. For example, God is not rightly acknowledged in the public forum, prayer is silenced, morality based on God's laws is ridiculed, taxes are used as coercion, and worship can be prohibited for what the government deems as just cause."⁽³⁾

Pope Leo XIII (1878-1903) said, "The great mistake is the notion that class is naturally hostile to class and that the wealthy and the working man are intended by nature to live in mutual conflict. So irrational and so false is this view that the direct contrary is the truth ... Each needs the other: capital cannot do without labor, nor labor without capital. Mutual agreement results in the beauty of good order, while perpetual conflict necessarily produces confusion and savage barbarity."⁽⁴⁾

"Too often Christians attracted by Socialism tend to idealize it ... They refuse to recognize the limitations of the historical social movements... Pope Paul VI (1963-1978)

"We make this pronouncement: Whether considered as a doctrine, or an historical fact, or a movement, Socialism, if it remains truly Socialism, ... cannot be reconciled with the teachings of the Catholic Church because its concept of society itself is utterly foreign to Christian truth." - Pope Pius XI (1922-1939


