A reading from the Gospel according to John:

Pilate said to Jesus,

"Are you the King of the Jews?"

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

A Sufi saint on his pilgrimage to Mecca, exhausted from his day's journey, lay down by the road,. He was brusquely awakened by an irate pilgrim. "This is the time when all believers bow their heads toward Mecca and you have feet pointing toward the Holy Shrine. What sort of Muslim Sufi are you?" The Sufi did not move, he opened his eyes and said, "Brother, would you do me the favor of placing my feet where they won't be pointing to the Lord?" Those who believe that God is everywhere and is in everything, see God in every person and revere God's presence in all places.

Today's Gospel depicts the threatening and troubling signs that would take place before the Son of Man comes: signs, such as darkening of the sun and moon, falling stars preceded by other tribulations. Jesus interpreted to His hearers that these negative signs are the indicators or messengers of the greater positive reality.

Jesus instructed His hearers how to positively understand such negative signs.

The signs are like a fig tree which looks dry and dead in the winter, but its branches become tender and sprout leaves indicate the nearness of summer.

The same way, though the signs appear to be troubling and deadly, they can be taken as messengers announcing that the Son of Man is near at the gates.

Thus the people in the city can open the gates and welcome the Son of Man; or they could become fearful of these signs and flee through the gates without noticing the Son of Man at the gates.



Everything that happens to us and every person whom we meet are just messengers of God's news.

They are not an end in themselves. They stand for the divine message that God wants to reveal through them. When we treat them as signs giving God's message, we will be filled with hope and live for God's presence to be experienced. But when we take the signs as an end in themselves we would yield to its deadly forces out of fear, pain, hopelessness and despair.

Nothing can disturb us if we try to see God's providence in everything and every person. "We know that God causes all things to work together for good to those who love God, to those who are called according to His purpose." (Letter to Romans 8:28) Let us pray to see God and God's guidance and providence in all that we come across.

Join us this Advent for an hour to reflect back on the last 21 months. There will be a short video, an opportunity to talk with others about the challenges, heartache and hope of the last 21 months. Through story and prayer we will seek to unite our stories with the greater story of our God who reaches out to strengthen and save us.

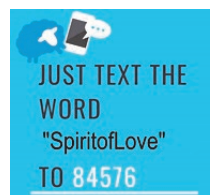

Warnings from Nine Popes about Socialism and Its Threat to Religious Freedom – continued

The Catholic Church has condemned Socialism in all its forms - so-called Christian Socialism as well as atheistic Socialism - without exception. But why? What is the error of socialism? ⁽¹⁾

Pope John Paul II (1978-2005) said, "The fundamental error of socialism is ... (it) considers the individual person simply as an element, a molecule within the social organism, so that the good of the individual is completely subordinated to the functioning of the socio-economic mechanism." ⁽²⁾

In 1891, **Pope Leo XIII (1878-1903)** wrote, "It is clear that the main tenet of socialism, community of goods, must be utterly rejected, since (it is) directly contrary to the natural rights of mankind..."⁽³⁾

Pope Pius XI (1922-1939) explained, "Just as it is gravely wrong to take from individuals what they can accomplish by their own initiative and industry and give it to the community, so also it is injustice and a grave evil to assign to a higher association (big organization or government) what a lesser and subordinate association (local organizations or government) can do." ⁽⁴⁾

"No Catholic could subscribe even to moderate socialism (since) Socialism is founded on a doctrine of human society which...takes no account of any objective other than that of material well-being," wrote **Pope John XXIII (1958-1963)** in his 1961 encyclical *Mater*

et Magistra. ⁽⁵⁾
