## Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

**January 16, 2022**  
**Second Sunday in Ordinary Time**  
**Isaiah 62:1-5**  
**Psalm 96:1-2, 2-3, 7-8, 9-10**

**John 2:1-11**

### A reading from the Gospel according to John

There was a wedding at Cana in Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there. Jesus and his disciples were also invited to the wedding. When the wine ran short, the mother of Jesus said to him, "They have no wine."

And Jesus said to her, "Woman, how does your concern affect me? My hour has not yet come."

His mother said to the servers, "Do whatever he tells you." Now there were six stone water jars there for Jewish ceremonial washings, each holding twenty to thirty gallons.

Jesus told them, "Fill the jars with water."

So they filled them to the brim.

Then he told them, "Draw some out now and take it to the headwaiter."

So they took it. And when the headwaiter tasted the water that had become wine, without knowing where it came from — although the servers who had drawn the water knew —, the headwaiter called the bridegroom and said to him, "Everyone serves good wine first, and then when the people have drunk freely, an inferior one; but you have kept the good wine until now."

Jesus did this as the beginning of his signs at Cana in Galilee and so revealed his glory, and his disciples began to believe in him.

### Focus Questions:

1. Describe a time when your mother prodded you to do something good for someone else. How did you respond?.

2. When you see the world today, how would you like to see it transformed?

3. Describe a time when you stepped into a situation where help was needed and you were able to help.

### Family and children's question:

Be like Mary this week; be on the lookout for someone who needs help. Then offer to help them. Find someone who can help.

## **FR. ANTONY'S LETTER**

Dear Friends,

On the eve of New Year, the wife asked her husband, "What is your New Year's resolution?" He replied to her, "None."

"How come, no resolution?" the wife questioned.

"I want to live a guilt-free year this time" came the quick reply.

Resolutions are the way of telling oneself that we have the capacity and willingness to do something better than what we used to do. But they can soon become the guilt-givers when we forget our capacity and capability to live the resolutions and end up doing what we wish and crave.

Today is the Solemn Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. At the event and moment of Baptism Jesus



all around Him heard a voice from heaven, "You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased." Voice from heaven in the Biblical world means voice from God (God's voice). Thus baptism is the event of God openly revealing to all people that Jesus is God's Son. Soon after His Baptism Jesus began His public ministry of proclaiming God's kingdom; i.e. all that Jesus did and said from His Baptism until His Death and Resurrection, was what God willed in Him and planned to do through Him. Baptism revealed Jesus' identity as God's Son and what He did was God's work.

Baptism as a sacrament offers the same thing to the baptized persons. Baptism is a sacramental event that reveals to the baptized persons their identity as God's children. Baptism

is also the sacramental moment of God revealing to the baptized what God wants to do with them and how God wants them to realize their own gifts and inner power of which they are made.

When we received Baptism God declared who we are: we are God's children. Baptism initiated us to realize that our life can be lived in God's standard. Baptized persons can realize and live as God's instrument to be used by God as God's channel to let God's wondrous grace pass through us and as God's light reveal God's love and truth.

Whenever we bless ourselves with holy water we remind ourselves of what happened to us at the moment and event of Baptism. We were baptized in water and now we touch the water and apply it on ourselves wishing the blessing of our Baptism to come true in our lives. We want God to help us live as His children, to do and say God's will. Let us try to bless ourselves with Holy Water at the beginning of each day that whatever we do that day may be done as God's children and with God's help.

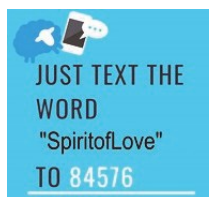

It is the mission of the Circle of Women Book Group to focus on the spiritual influence of contemporary writing that facilitates our own reflections of God's action in our daily lives.

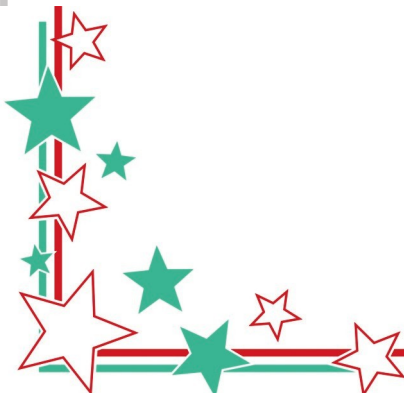

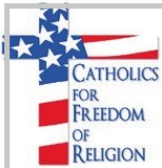

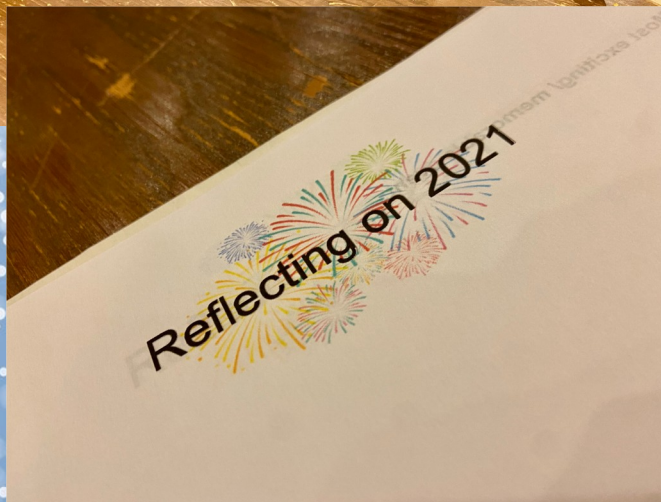
