



# Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

February 20, 2022 Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time 1 Samuel 26:2,7-9, 12-13, 22-23 Psalm 103:1-2, 3-4, 8, 10,12-13 1 Corinthians 15:45-49 Luke 6:27-38

## A reading from the Gospel according to Luke:

Jesus said to his disciples:

"To you who hear I say, love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who mistreat you. To the person who strikes you on one cheek, offer the other one as well, and from the person who takes your cloak, do not withhold even your tunic. Give to everyone who asks of you, and from the one who takes what is yours do not demand it back.

Do to others as you would have them do to you. For if you love those who love you, what credit is that to you? Even sinners love those who love them. And if you do good to those who do good to you, what credit is that to you? Even sinners do the same.

If you lend money to those from whom you expect repayment, what credit is that to you? Even sinners lend to sinners, and get back the same amount.

But rather, love your enemies and do good to them, and lend expecting nothing back; then your reward will be great and you will be children of the Most High, for he himself is kind to the ungrateful and the wicked. Be merciful, just as your Father is merciful.

"Stop judging and you will not be judged. Stop condemning and you will not be condemned. Forgive and you will be forgiven. Give, and gifts will be given to you; a good measure, packed together, shaken down, and overflowing, will be poured into your lap. For the measure with which you measure will in return be measured out to you."

#### **Focus Questions:**

- 1. How hard do you find it to turn the other cheek when someone hurts or offends you?
- 2. Jesus asks a lot of his followers. What do you find hardest to do?
- 3. Recall a time in your life when you received overflowing good measure of God's compassion.

#### Family and children's question

How many times a day do you judge others negatively. Talk about how you can turn that into more positive thoughts.

## FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends.

The seven year old daughter of a television announcer was invited to dinner. The hostess asked her to say the grace before the meal. The girl cleared her throat, gave a quick glance at the clock and said, "This food, friends, is coming to you through the courtesy of Almighty God. Amen." Prayer helps us see everything as a gracious gift from God and every one as God's child.

**Today's reading inspires our inner wisdom** to see God's gift everywhere and triggers our spiritual power to change the negatives to positives. In the second reading Paul reminds that those who believe in the Risen Christ don't live in a human body that ends in death. Our faith in the Risen Jesus empowers us to live as people capable of rising with Jesus. Our body may die but we will not end in death but continue to live with Jesus.

**Prophet Jeremiah declares in the first reading** that the human condition in itself is "like a barren bush in the desert that enjoys no change of season, but stands in a lava waste, a salt and empty earth" But those who trust in the LORD, are "like a tree planted beside the waters that stretches out its roots to the stream:" It is true that our faith in God, the Risen Christ would uplift our human conditions from death to ever living possibility with God their Creator.

**Today's Gospel is the beatitudes from the Gospel of Luke.** These words of Jesus make us realize that we, already now and here in our human-conditions, carry within ourselves God's wonderful gift of changing the destructives to the constructives. Poverty, hunger, weeping, insults etc. are normally considered by us as negatives and destructives but Jesus names them as "Blessed". Because Jesus wants us to understand how these negatives can motivate and empower us to live our best. The so called 'negatives' can activate all the positives within us

At the same time Jesus names all the external powers like wealth, instant gratification, self-centered-aggrandizement, narrowmindedness etc., as "Woe" to humans; because these powers can woefully distract and destroy us living our inner God-given power. The God-given power and wisdom within each of us are more capable of making us live our best than any external powers like wealth etc. God-given power and wisdom are such a living power within us that they cannot be upset by any negatives like poverty, hunger, weeping etc. Jesus sees in the so called "negatives' the "Blessed" opportunity to dig out and live the best and the most powerful from within us.

Those who live their best will see the "Blessed" moments everywhere, in all persons and at all moments. But those who rely only on the external power like wealth, oppressive power, unjust accumulation of anything and discriminative judgement will always live in "woe" moments of insecurity, fear, jealousy of either losing their own external power or others becoming more powerful than they. Let us pray that we may be inspired by the beatitude. Let us acknowledge and appreciate God's wonderful gift both within and around us. The blessings consist in the realization of who we are and not in what we have.

## A Win for Genuine Religious Freedom in CA Schools

A parent lawsuit, brought by the Thomas More Society, forced California to drop a public school curriculum requirement that had students praying to Aztec gods. The curriculum included a section of "Affirmations, Chants, and Energizers," that prayed to five Aztec deities by name and title "that were invoked when the Aztecs worshipped with human sacrifices," said the special counsel. The prayers and chants recognized these deities as sources of power and knowledge, invoked their assistance, and gave thanks to them.

## "Satan Clubs" Causing Controversy in Public Schools

School officials and parents are trying to decide how to deal with what are being called "Satan Clubs" cropping up in schools, specifically in Illinois and Ohio, in a mistaken belief that these clubs have First Amendment Religious Freedom rights. They do not. Satanism is the opposite of religion since it

directly attacks the foundation of religion - "the existence of a Creator who is the source of unalienable rights." (2)


