



Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

March 13, 2022 Second Sunday of Lent Genesis 15:5-12, 17-18 Psalm 27:1, 7-8, 8-9, 13-14 Philippians 3:17—4:1 Luke 9:28b-36

A reading from the Gospel according to Luke:

Jesus took Peter, John, and James and went up the mountain to pray.

While he was praying his face changed in appearance and his clothing became dazzling white. And behold, two men were conversing with him, Moses and Elijah, who appeared in glory and spoke of his exodus that he was going to accomplish in Jerusalem. Peter and his companions had been overcome by sleep, but becoming fully awake, they saw his glory and the two men standing with him.

As they were about to part from him, Peter said to Jesus,

"Master, it is good that we are here; let us make three tents, one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah." But he did not know what he was saying.

While he was still speaking, a cloud came and cast a shadow over them, and they became frightened when they entered the cloud.

Then from the cloud came a voice that said,

"This is my chosen Son; listen to him."

After the voice had spoken, Jesus was found alone. They fell silent and did not at that time tell anyone what they had seen.

- 2. Jesus took time apart for prayer. Where do you like to pray?
- 3. Describe a way that prayer has transformed your life.

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends.

Agent to writer: I have some good news and some bad news.

Writer to Agent: First tell me the good news.

Agent to writer: Paramount just loved your story, absolutely ate it up.

Writer: That's fantastic – and the bad news?

Agent: Paramount is my dog.

Every temptation peripherally sounds as good news but is bad news substantially.

The Gospel of the First Sunday of Lent narrates the three temptations of Jesus. The first one is the devil's suggestion that after 40 days of fast, Jesus could appease His hunger by turning stone into bread through His Miracle-power. The second and third temptations are the devil's outward invitation to Jesus to enjoy glory and authority over the whole world if He would worship and obey the devil. The devil's temptations to Jesus are sugar quoted suggestions to misuse His miracle-doing-power or to surrender His Godly identity in order to possess material properties. Every temptation is a sugar coated trap. It attracts us with its sweetness only to get our life entrapped in our weakness and deterioration.

At no time did Jesus fell into the devil's trap or in the sweet-coated attraction offered to him. Jesus replied to the devil how His inner reality of being the Son of God, is true living than enjoying all the sugar-coated offers that the devil placed before him. Thus Jesus invites us to live our inner worth of being God's children. In Jesus we are saved and have the freedom of living the image of God we bear. We are so powerful that no one can enslave us unless we yield to them. Let us follow Jesus and live like Him in the face of temptations. Let us never succumb to sugar coating; let us be awakened to our inner worth. Let us awaken ourselves to the spiritual power to live our best.

We have begun the Holy Time of Lent. We call it holy time, not because the time has anything holy, but it offers an invitation to us to become holy. To be holy is to think and act, not in our selfish way, but as God would. To become holy, we must first be aware of God's presence in and around us. Once God's awareness becomes our experience all that we do and say will express God's presence. This is what Jesus means when he asks us "to be perfect just as your Heavenly Father is perfect." (Mt. 5:48).

Of course we cannot in any way be like God our Heavenly Father. But we can experience God in us and allow God to be experienced by others through our words and deeds. Lent is the time we seriously make efforts to be aware of God's available presence in and around us and become channels bringing God to others by experiencing God within us. All our Lenten spiritual practices like **praying**, fasting and almsgiving are merely the means of growing into God-awareness in us and others.

In our Parish we pray the Stations of the Cross every Friday at 7:00 pm for a particular intention. This Friday March 11th we pray for those who are impacted by loss of jobs and business due to Covid. Please come and pray with us.

Please mark your Calendar. March 28th, 29th and 30th is the Parish Mission by Fr. Kevin Cronin OFM. Lenten Project: This year's Lenten Project is to support "Holy Family Vocational School" in the Parish of San Pedro Apostolo, El Cercado, Dominican Republic. Christian Values on Trial in Finland Will Affect Religious Freedom in Europe and the World

"Part of the scary thing about what's happening in Finland is that it could happen anywhere else," said human rights lawyer Paul Coleman. (1) Coleman cautioned that the Finnish cases are the "canary in the coalmine" for freedom of speech and freedom of religion in the Western world.

If the court finds them guilty, two Christians in Finland face fines or up to two years in prison and thus would set the precedent of making quoting the Bible a criminal offense in Western countries. Dr. Paivi Rasanen, member of Parliament (2011-2015), physician and mother of five and Bishop Juhana Pohjola of the Lutheran Mission Diocese in Finland, were charged with incitement against a minority group for publishing a pamphlet, "Male and Female He Created Them," that states the theological and scientific truth that men and women are different. Bishop Pohjola warned that "the Gospel of Christ is at stake" as Western governments liken the Bible's teachings about marriage and sexuality to "hate speech." (2)

Lent 2022

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

Lent is a journey from the desert of death to the springs of new life. We follow Jesus into the wilderness of the desert to renew our baptismal covenant with the Father. During this sacred time, we die to sin, and washed clean from our self-centeredness and attachment to the world, rise to divine grace and love. As we enter this privileged season, let us reflect once more on the three means we employ during this forty-day journey of penance and conversion: prayer, fasting, and almsgiving.

Prayer. Prayer is most simply a conversation with God, and St. Paul reminds us that this conversation must be continual. The Apostle to the Gentiles enjoins us to "pray at all times" (Eph 6:18), "pray without ceasing" (1 Thess 5:17), and "be constant in prayer" (Rom 12:12). To pray this way requires effort. It demands silence, artful listening, and remaining in the presence of God. This Lent we remember two powerful ways we enter into this holy conversation: by sitting in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament and through *lectio divina*, a prayerful reading of Sacred Scripture.

Fasting. The Church Fathers speak extensively on the power of fasting to break sin and open our hearts to the grace of God. Saint Peter Chrysologus writes: "Fasting is the soul of prayer, mercy is the lifeblood of fasting. So if you pray, fast; if you fast, show mercy; if you want your petition to be heard, hear the petition of others. If you do not close your ear to others, you open God's ear to yourself" (Sermo 43: PL 52, 320, 322). Let us remember, too, that bodily fasting is useless unless it is joined with spiritual fasting, that is, fasting from our passions.

Almsgiving. Scripture brings the three marks of our Lenten journey together and puts the emphasis on the last: "Prayer and fasting are good, but better than either is almsgiving accompanied by righteousness ... It is better to give alms than to store up gold; for almsgiving saves one from death and expiates every sin. Those who regularly give alms shall enjoy a full life" (Tob 12:8-9). Almsgiving is better because it points to charity. We remember we are not only to give materially to those in need but also give of ourselves as we love God and neighbor.

Last October, Pope Francis invited the Church into a synod on synodality. The Holy Father wants the Church to journey together in a multi-year process listening to each other, hearing the Word and celebrating the Eucharist. As we journey towards Easter, let us be united in mind and spirit. May the spiritual exercises of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving prepare us for Easter and an experience of the power of God, which "dispels wickedness, washes faults away, restores innocence to the fallen, and joy to mourners, drives out hatred, fosters concord, and brings down the mighty" (*The Easter Proclamation - Exsultet*). Then, alive in Christ, we can go forward evangelizing, as Pope Francis would want, with *parrhesia*: "Boldness, enthusiasm, the freedom to speak out, [and] apostolic fervor" (*Gaudete et Exsultate* 129).

May the loving presence of the Blessed Virgin Mary, who remained faithful to her son at the foot of the cross, protect and sustain us in our Lenten journey.

St. Thomas More Lenten Project

This year's Lenten Project will support Holy Family Vocational Technical School (Sagrada Familia) in the Dominican Republic.

In 1979 the Diocese of Rockville Center adopted the parish of San Pedro Apostol in El Cercado, Dominican Republic. The El Cercado mission organized and empowered a network of faith-based communities in barrios and rural towns to build schools, safe homes, water systems, latrines, agriculture and preventative health services. There is currently an elementary and secondary school for over 600 students in pre-K to grade 12. A 3-floor physical structure was recently completed with plans to provide technical training to juniors and seniors, allowing these young people to become agents of change in their own community. The school was named "Sagrada Familia" in honor of the 50th anniversary of Holy Family Diocesan High School in Huntington. Fr. John Cervini, a former Associate Pastor at St. Thomas, spent 17 years as the Pastor in El Cercado and continues to support the El Cercado mission.

Donations from our Lenten project will support an electricity workshop, plumbing workshop, beauty & hygiene workshop, cooking and bakery workshop, arts & crafts and sewing workshop and an assembly room. The goal is to open the school this September. Future plans include evening courses for adults and senior citizens.
