FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

A mother of a teenager: “My daughter doesn’t tell me anything. I’m a nervous wreck!”

Another mother of a teenager: “My daughter tells me everything and I am a nervous wreck”

Human life is so mysterious that neither any amount of words can explain it fully well, nor any silent observation can help grasp it totally.

In the readings of the Second week of Lent God invites us to see the truth, to experience and believe it. In the first reading God shows the innumerable stars to the aged and childless Abram and invites him to believe that his descendants will be as many as the stars. Abraham believed and saw it happened. In the second reading Paul recommends his church to see themselves not as citizens of the passing world but that of eternal heaven. One can believe only what one sees and experiences as the truth in oneself or in others.

In the Gospel Jesus takes with him Peter, James and John and shows them his heavenly Glory. They saw and experienced Jesus’ divine manifestation. Their seeing and experiencing would help them to believe in Jesus specially at the moments later on when they had to see Jesus die a painful and shameful death on the Cross.

We are all created in the image of God. As bearers of God’s image, we are chosen by God to be God’s children in our Baptism. This is our true identity which can neither be explained adequately in words; nor be ignored and silenced. Lent invites us to see this true identity both in ourselves and in others, to experience and believe it.

Our spiritual identity is the spiritual truth which can neither be analyzed nor be demonstrated with any instrument or theorem as science would do. We are called to see it in ourselves, experience and believe it. We don’t prove our truth but we become the truth. Our truth is not an object to be proved but to be experienced and believed both by us and by others through our behaviors. . Let us try to live in such a way that others may see and experience in us the truth of being children of God.

In our Parish we pray the Stations of the Cross every Friday at 7:00 pm for a particular intention. This Friday March 18th we pray for those who are suffering from unforeseen events like accidents, house fires, debt, personal troubles like separation, and misunderstanding or other challenges in the family. Please come and pray with us.

Please mark your Calendar. March 28th, 29th and 30th is the Parish Mission by Fr. Kevin Cronin OFM.

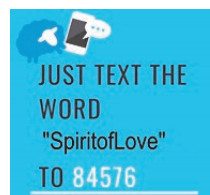

Canadian Pastor Put into Solitary to Prevent Him from Preaching

"God allows me to be here for a witness to the entire world, to show what happens when you kick God out of your nation. Lawlessness, injustice, abuse of power and corruption creeped in," said Pastor Artur Pawlowski, after being imprisoned in February for attempting to preach and minister to truckers in the Freedom Convoy along the U.S.-Canada border. ⁽¹⁾ Law enforcement told the pastor he was under arrest for "mischief."

For two years, Pastor Pawlowski has been standing up for the right to hold church services during the Covid lockdowns and has been repeatedly arrested and imprisoned. "He is not the first pastor targeted and persecuted for speaking the truth in the face of injustice," wrote Standing For Freedom Center. ⁽²⁾ Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., Pope John Paul II, and Rumanian Pastor Richard Wurmbbrand, all suffered religious persecution.

Hope for Religious Revival in America

"We can feel and sense rumblings of revival, and when I say revival, I mean people's hearts turning back to God," said Donna Stands-Over-Bull of the Crow Tribe. "There's a lot of broken areas, broken communities, and our communities are rampant with drugs," said Stands-Over-Bull describing the plight of Native Americans. ⁽³⁾

"We've been having healing revivals over the on-line church. God's been healing through social media," said Russell Stands-Over-Bull, senior pastor of Arrow Creek TV e-church. ⁽⁴⁾

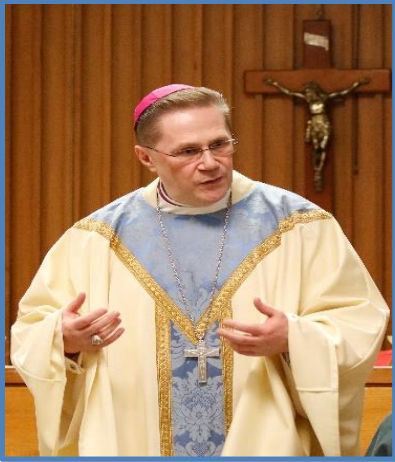

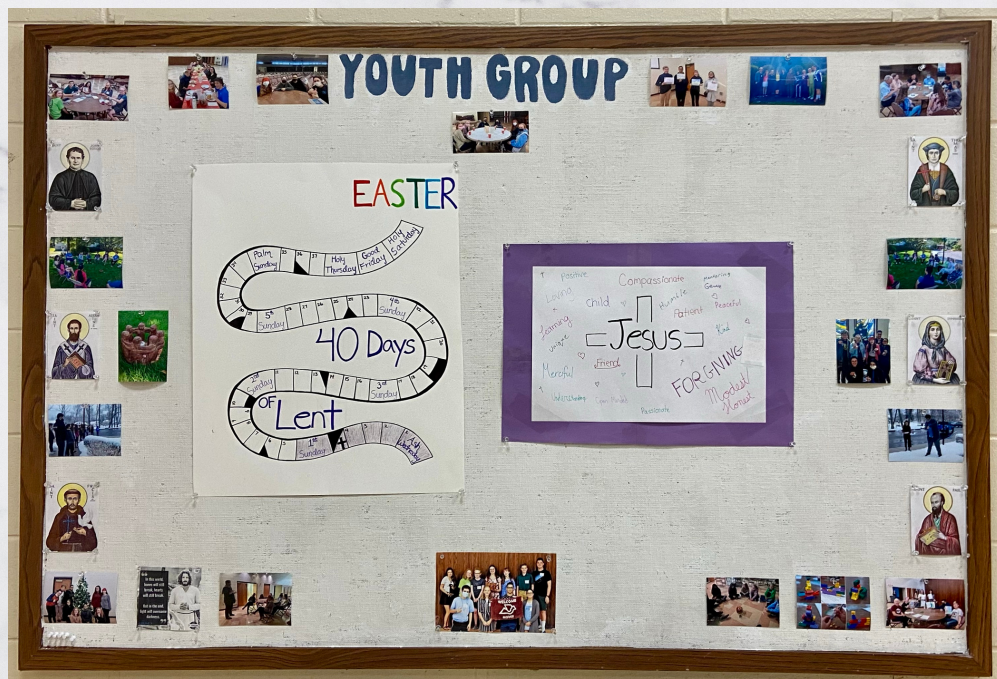

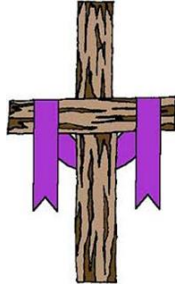

St. Thomas More Lenten Project

This year's Lenten Project will support *Holy Family Vocational Technical School (Sagrada Familia)* in the Dominican Republic.

In 1979 the Diocese of Rockville Center adopted the parish of San Pedro Apostol in El Cercado, Dominican Republic. The El Cercado mission organized and empowered a network of faith-based communities in barrios and rural towns to build schools, safe homes, water systems, latrines, agriculture and preventative health services. There is currently an elementary and secondary school for over 600 students in pre-K to grade 12. A 3-floor physical structure was recently completed with plans to provide technical training to juniors and seniors, allowing these young people to become agents of change in their own community. The school was named "*Sagrada Familia*" in honor of the 50th anniversary of Holy Family Diocesan High School in Huntington. Fr. John Cervini, a former Associate Pastor at St. Thomas, spent 17 years as the Pastor in El Cercado and continues to support the El Cercado mission.

Donations from our Lenten project will support an electricity workshop, plumbing workshop, beauty & hygiene workshop, cooking and bakery workshop, arts & crafts and sewing workshop and an assembly room. The goal is to open the school this September. Future plans include evening courses for adults and senior citizens.
