





FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends.

Husband: Where is yesterday's newspaper?

Wife: I wrapped the garbage in it. Husband: Oh, I want to see it.

Wife: There isn't much to see....just some orange peels and coffee grounds.

We are the newspapers. God reads us for our messages. But we may use humans to cover our garbage. God looks for something worthy in everything while we primarily see something to cover the garbage.

Today's Gospel reading is the famous story of Jesus's 'The Prodigal Son'. Jesus narrates the story to explain to the Pharisees and the scribes how his view of sinners is different from theirs. They, like the older son of the story, look at sinners as those gone astray from the homestead and unworthy of being associated with the righteous like themselves. But Jesus treats sinners like the father of the story treated his younger son who came back to the embrace of his father's love. The Pharisees saw sinners as garbage while Jesus saw in them a worthy cause for celebration.

Today's readings free us from the frozen view to the flowing view of life. It is our choice. We can either adamantly settle for our own whims and fancies about our life like the older son did, and thus stay out from life's celebration. Or we can convert ourselves from our old way of life and allow the flow of new life like the younger son did, and thus celebrate life enjoying the mercy and forgiveness of God the Father.

As the first reading says our life is a celebration of 'pass over' from that which enslaves us to that which frees and fills us with God's new life. The second reading describes how we are a New Creation in Christ. God in Christ has not only empowered us with newness within us, but also made us as God's ambassadors for Christ in order to spread the newness around us. Let us not freeze in the old in which we have settled, like the older son. Let us free ourselves to the New we have within, like the younger son.

This week we pray the Stations of the Cross on April 1st at 7:00 pm for peace in families, communities and countries that struggle with violence of any kind, like wars, and acts of hate.

Next Friday April 8th at 6:00 pm is the Soup Supper. If you wish to attend, please bring a meatless soup to share with others. Soup supper will be followed by Stations of the Cross at 7:00 pm in the Church.

Our Parish Lenten Mission begins this week.on March 28th, 29th and 30th by Fr. Kevin Cronin OFM. All are welcome.

Lenten Project: This year's Lenten Project is to support "Holy Family Vocational School" in the Parish of San Pedro Apostolo, El Cercado, Dominican Republic. 

Sister Deidre Byrne, Surgeon, and Gerald Groff, Postal Carrier, Forced to Sue for Their Religious Liberty to Continue Their Work

Sister Deirdre Byrne, a board-certified physician -surgeon and retired U.S. Army colonel, had "sought - and been denied - a religious exemption from DCs health worker COVID-19 vaccination mandate," explained Thomas More Society in their March 9, 2022 lawsuit. "All three COVID-19 vaccines approved in the U.S. have been tested, developed, or produced with cell lines derived from abortions, something to which Sr. Deirdre has deep and sincere religious opposition."

A few days later, Sr. Deirdre was notified her license was now active until September unless the director decided to rescind her exemption again⁽²⁾

A religious exemption was denied to Postal Carrier Gerald Groff, an Evangelical Christian, who was forced to work on Sundays which is against his deeply held religious beliefs requiring him to honor the Sabbath. (3) The Third Circuit Court of Appeals heard oral arguments in January and this religious freedom case awaits a decision.



St. Thomas More Lenten Project

This year's Lenten Project will support Holy Family Vocational Technical School (Sagrada Familia) in the Dominican Republic.

In 1979 the Diocese of Rockville Center adopted the parish of San Pedro Apostol in El Cercado, Dominican Republic. The El Cercado mission organized and empowered a network of faith-based communities in barrios and rural towns to build schools, safe homes, water systems, latrines, agriculture and preventative health services. There is currently an elementary and secondary school for over 600 students in pre-K to grade 12. A 3-floor physical structure was recently completed with plans to provide technical training to juniors and seniors, allowing these young people to become agents of change in their own community. The school was named "Sagrada Familia" in honor of the 50th anniversary of Holy Family Diocesan High School in Huntington. Fr. John Cervini, a former Associate Pastor at St. Thomas, spent 17 years as the Pastor in El Cercado and continues to support the El Cercado mission.

Donations from our Lenten project will support an electricity workshop, plumbing workshop, beauty & hygiene workshop, cooking and bakery workshop, arts & crafts and sewing workshop and an assembly room. The goal is to open the school this September. Future plans include evening courses for adults and senior citizens.

Any donation will be greatly appreciated. Checks can be made out to St. Thomas More and placed in the little house by the bulletin board.
