Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

May 1, 2022
 Third Sunday of Easter
 Acts 5:27-32
 Psalm 30:2, 4, 5-6, 11-12, 13
 Revelation 5:11-14
 John 21: 1-19

A reading from the Gospel according to John:

At that time, Jesus revealed himself to his disciples at the Sea of Tiberias. He revealed himself in this way. Together were Simon Peter, Thomas called Didymus, Nathanael from Cana in Galilee, Zebedee's sons, and two others of his disciples.

Simon Peter said to them, "I am going fishing."

They said to him, "We also will come with you." So they went out and got into the boat, but that night they caught nothing. When it was already dawn, Jesus was standing on the shore; but the disciples did not realize that it was Jesus.

Jesus said to them, "Children, have you caught anything to eat?"

They answered him, "No."

So he said to them, "Cast the net over the right side of the boat and you will find something."

So they cast it, and were not able to pull it in because of the number of fish.

So the disciple whom Jesus loved said to Peter, "It is the Lord."

When Simon Peter heard that it was the Lord, he tucked in his garment, for he was lightly clad, and jumped into the sea. The other disciples came in the boat, for they were not far from shore, only about a hundred yards, dragging the net with the fish.

When they climbed out on shore, they saw a charcoal fire with fish on it and bread.

Jesus said to them, "Bring some of the fish you just caught."

So Simon Peter went over and dragged the net ashore full of one hundred fifty-three large fish. Even though there were so many, the net was not torn.

Jesus said to them, "Come, have breakfast."

And none of the disciples dared to ask him, "Who are you?" because they realized it was the Lord.

Jesus came over and took the bread and gave it to them, and in like manner the fish.

This was now the third time Jesus was revealed to his disciples after being raised from the dead.

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

A five-year-old excitedly reported to his parents what he learned in Sunday school. He told the story of Adam and Eve and how Eve was created from one of Adam's ribs. A few days later he told his mom: "My side hurts. I think I am having a wife." Human mind is such a marvelous organism that it can see and live even the moment of pain as an occasion for something new to be born out of it.

The Second Sunday of Easter is celebrated as Divine Mercy Sunday. Today's Gospel narrates the story of Jesus appearing to his disciples wishing them "Peace be with you." and He filled them with the Holy Spirit. He did not blame them for their failure to be with Him during His passion and death; rather He revived and equipped them with the power of the Holy Spirit to continue His mission. Jesus, the living expression of God's Mercy, did not waste His time and energy in blaming what they failed to do; but empowered them to live as positive witnesses to God's redeeming Mercy.

As the saying goes, God does not call the well-equipped, but equips those He called to do His mission. Jesus called the fishermen and promised them saying "Come, follow me, and I will send you out to fish for people." (Mark 1:17) Jesus saw in the fishermen His missionaries who can continue His mission of gathering (fishing) people for God's kingdom. God, who calls humans to do His mission, never abandons them even if they fail to prove themselves. This is what happened when Jesus appeared to them after His Resurrection. Forgetting their failure in the past, He equipped them to experience the peace of the Resurrection. He gave them the power of the Holy Spirit to continue the mission for which they are called.

God is merciful in the sense that He forgives all the bad we did and the good we failed to do; and always blesses us to do the best we can do. God's Mercy focuses only on the best we are and the best we can do. God's is a merciful kingdom in the sense that it spends all its energy and time to employ the best of its citizens with goodness to blossom in all walks of life. Mercy means to be good, to see good everywhere and in all persons and to cultivate the good and the good alone.

Just as Jesus came down to the level of doubting Thomas to strengthen his faith, He is ready to reach to work with us at any and all levels. Let us try to experience the Mercy of God shown in Jesus. Let us live it and spread it around us. Mercy is the media through which God presents the best to happen for us and we, like God present the good to happen for others.
