



#### FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

A hesitant driver, waiting for traffic to clear, came to a complete stop on a freeway ramp. The traffic thinned, but the intimidated driver still waited. Finally, an infuriated voice yelled from behind, "The sign says to yield, not to give up." God would never abandon or give up on those who yield to God-experience.

The third week of Easter invites us to yield to the main flow of the Risen life. Today's Gospel story tells us how the disciples of Jesus almost gave up following Jesus and returned to their former livelihood of fishing, but that night they caught nothing. Jesus came to the shore in the morning but they did not yet recognize Him as Jesus. At His command when they caught a boat load of fish, each one began to recognize Him at a personal level, without Jesus introducing them "who He was' to and without them asking Him 'who you are.' Their recognition happened in each one according to their yielding and opening themselves to Jesus' experience.

**The second part of the Gospel narrates the story** how Peter, the denier became the lover of Jesus. Peter gave up Jesus at the His trial before the Sanhedrin. When the gatekeeper asked Peter, "You are not one of this man's disciples, are you?" He said, "I am not." (John 18:17). In today's story we see how Jesus lifted him up from where he fell. Peter was invited by Jesus to love Him back. The denier who gave up Jesus yielded to Jesus's invitation saying, "Lord, you know everything; you know that I love you."

**In the story of God and human**, God never gives up the human at any time even when the humans were to refuse His love for their own reason or convenience. God is ever faithful to love us. Jesus is always at our door. "Behold, I stand at the door and knock. If anyone hears my voice and opens the door, I will come in to him and eat with him, and he with me." (Revelation 3:20) Let us not be stubborn. Let us yield our spirit to invite Him into our life. Let us recognize the divine presence and welcome Him who is ready to relate with us.

**May 1<sup>st</sup> reminds me that I finish a year and begin another** – **NEW** – **year** in my priestly ministry for God and God's people. Yes. I was ordained Priest 40 years ago on May  $2^{nd}$  1982. Huh... an Old Priest trying every day to become a mature one. I complete 40 years as a Priest today, Sunday May  $1^{st}$  and commence my  $42^{nd}$  year on Monday May  $2^{nd}$ . Please join with me thanking God for the innumerable blessing He has showered on us in making us His priestly people, and sharing with me the ministerial priesthood to serve His presence through Sacraments and service.

I invite you all for a great Festival-weekend on June 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup>. We have named this weekend as "CELEBRATE ST. THOMAS MORRE." We have planned to celebrate many feasts on this weekend. 1) Our Coming Back Together after the Pandemic 2) Feast of our Parish Patron St. Thomas More 3) Feast of Pentecost 4) Celebrating our Priesthood in Jesus on the occasion of the 40<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of my Ordination to the Priesthood.

We will begin our celebrations Saturday June 4<sup>th</sup> with Mass at 5:00 pm followed by a Complimentary Dinner Dance at 7:00 pm in Walden Hall. The dinner is free. But please kindly reserve your place with a check for \$20 made to St. Thomas More Church which will be returned to you when you show up for the dinner on June 4th. Since we have limited space we will go by "first come first served" basis.

We will continue the celebration on Sunday, June 5<sup>th</sup> with a pancake breakfast in Walden Hall after the 8:00 am and 9:30 am family mass. The cost is just two dollars per head for a delicious breakfast. All are welcome.

We will reminisce and celebrate the 11:30 am mass in the Parking Lot. (if weather permits). Come and celebrate St. Thomas More.

## Where in the World is Religious Revival Happening?

In a time of global religious revival, people of faith in many countries also face significant ongoing persecution and denial of any religious freedom. The same trends - expansion of religious zeal and religious repression - apply particularly to Christians. The majority of countries in which Christianity is growing are located in Africa, Eastern Asia, and the Arabian Peninsula. None of the top 20 is found in Europe, North America or Latin America. Still, Christianity is the most widely practiced religion in the world with approximately 1/3 of the global population.

Religious revival is sorely needed in America today where a recent survey by the Freedom Forum showed only 14% of Americans consider religious freedom to be the most important freedom. The religious revival in the colonies from the 1730s -1740s, called the First Great Awakening, inspired Benjamin Franklin to write,

"Revival changes a nation from the inside out. It was wonderful to see the change soon made in the manners of our inhabitants. From being thoughtless or indifferent about religion, it seemed as if all the world were growing religious."
