



Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

May 15, 2022 Fifth Sunday of Easter Acts 14:21-27 Psalm 145: 8-9, Revelation 7:9, 14b-17 John 10:27-30

My children, I will be with you only a little while longer. I give you a new commandment: love one another. As I have loved you, so you also should love one another.


This is how all will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another."

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

A woman criticized D. L. Moody for his methods of evangelism in attempting to win people to the Lord. Moody replied, "I agree with you. I don't like the way I do it either. Tell me please, how do you do it? I can learn from you." The woman replied, "I don't do it." Moody retorted, "Then I like my way of doing it better than your way of not doing it."

This week's readings commission us as messengers of God's good news. In the first reading we see that Paul and Barnabas moved from preaching to their own Jewish people to the Gentiles because their message was received by the Jewish people with violent abuse and contradiction. They preached first to the Jews as Jesus asked them to do. "Go to the lost sheep of the house of Israel (Matthew 10:6). But when they refused to accept them, they went to the Gentiles (Non-Jews), as Jesus advised them to do. "Whatever town you enter and they do not receive you, go out into the streets and say, "the dust of your town that clings to our feet, even that we shake off against you.' Yet know this: the kingdom of God is at hand".

The main focus of the messengers is not themselves, their method or talents, but the Message, the Good News, the Gospel of Jesus. The messenger must become the message itself. The message and the messenger should be experienced one in the other. The life of the messenger must reflect the message, and His message must be seen in his life.

Today's Gospel speaks loudly about the oneness of the message and the messenger. Jesus explains that He is the message from God the Father and He and the Father God are one and the same. They cannot be separated. Jesus affirms that this same union exists between Him, the shepherd, and His sheep, the believers. The inseparable oneness between Jesus and his believers is just the reflection of the oneness that exists between Jesus and God the Father. As God and Jesus cannot be separated, so too Jesus, the Good shepherd cannot be separated from His sheep.

In this Easter Season we celebrate the inseparable union with God expressed in the death and Resurrection of Jesus. Jesus who became one with us in all human aspects, including death, created an inseparable divine union with us. Jesus, the Shepherd united Himself with us His sheep so that we, the sheep too become like the Shepherd. Let our life reflect the message we believe. Let the message we believe, be seen in our life. Let us follow our Shepherd. Let our life reflect the Shepherd we follow. With Pandemic Coming to an End - Reflections on Religious Liberty

Americans of faith are fortunate to live in a country with robust liberty protections in our Constitution and Bill of Rights First Amendment. However, during these past two-plus years of COVID restrictions on religious activities, including full community worship, and their designation as "non-essential" while many secular activities were designated "essential", invites reflection on religious freedom in America today.

Since the U.S. Supreme Court has ruled on a number of cases based on the Free Exercise Clause of the First Amendment, we can ask, "Why did the founding generation protect religious liberty?"

The history of humanity is intertwined with faith and fundamental religious values that led to the modern understanding of human rights. "Because their ancestors had escaped religious persecution in Europe, the founding generation saw the need to protect religion and viewed morality as necessary to the nation's success," wrote Prof. Anthony Koenc, Dallas College of Law. (1) The First Amendment placed religion in a special category, uniquely shielding it from government interference.

"No doubt an emergency on the scale of COVID-19 justifies strong measures to protect the public, but we cannot lose sight of the fact that many of these measures are extraordinary assertions of government power that can dramatically constrain our basic freedoms.
