A reading from the Gospel according to Luke:

Jesus spoke to the crowds about the kingdom of God, and he healed those who needed to be cured. As the day was drawing to a close, the Twelve approached him and said,

"Dismiss the crowd so that they can go to the surrounding villages and farms and find lodging and provisions; for we are in a deserted place here." He said to them, "Give them some food yourselves." They replied, "Five loaves and two fish are all we have, unless we ourselves go and buy food for all these people."

Now the men there numbered about five thousand. Then he said to his disciples, "Have them sit down in groups of about fifty."

They did so and made them all sit down.

Then taking the five loaves and the two fish, and looking up to heaven, he said the blessing over them, broke them, and gave them to the disciples to set before the crowd.

They all ate and were satisfied.

And when the leftover fragments were picked up, they filled twelve wicker baskets.

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

A despairing client said to his psychiatrist, "No matter where I go, I have to take myself along – and that spoils everything." We cannot escape ourselves. We carry our inner self wherever we go and in whatever we do. Both what we run away from – and what we yearn for - is within us. Our life does not consist in external achievements or failures; rather it consists substantially in the expression of our inner truth.

Today is the Solemn Feast of Holy Trinity. We celebrate God's Nature lived and revealed to us in three persons, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. God is ONE. Here the 'ONE' does not mean a mathematical ONE but the mystical ONE. God is the mystical experience. God, the ONE cannot be fully explained in dry, intellectual, philosophical or theological jargons. God is ONE in the sense that God is full; God exists everywhere, in everyone and in all. God is so full that, as Psalm 131 sings, "Where can I go from your Spirit? Where can I flee from your presence? If I go up to the heavens, you are there; if I make my bed in the depths, you are there." God fills the whole universe that none of us can hide or escape from it.

God reveals the God-self to us in order to relate with us. The more a person relates with God, the more that person comes to know who God is. We can only love and relate with God; loving-relationship is the only way of knowing, understanding, and experiencing God. God would be an abstract truth to understand or express in human languages. But God becomes the lively experience of a loving-relationship for those who try to relate with God.

God reveals as three persons, as Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. This means that we, as human persons experience God in each person, Person of the Father, Person of the Son and Person of the Holy Spirit. We can experience God the Father as a creator in whatever and in whomever we recognize God's creative power and design. We can feel the presence of Jesus, the Son when we serve and love others in the way Jesus loves and serves all of us. We can live the power of the Holy Spirit whenever we die to our egoistic-selfish image and try to live the God's image in us.

We the human persons are the imitative extension of God in three persons. As God is the living reality of loving-relationship between the three persons, the humans and their lives are nothing but loving-relationship. Like God, every individual human person is a mystery to be experienced in loving relationship and not in systematic analysis or in convenient cataloguing. Each of us is not one of many like us. Every one of us is a unique design of God's creative will. Our individuality and personality emerge in its pure form with its specific taste only in loving relationship.

The celebration of Holy Trinity is the active celebration of understanding and living our nature in the light of God living and loving in three persons. We are not an abstract bundle of human beings. Each of us is a unique individual and our individual life finds its fulfilment in loving others. We acquire our rich identity by giving our individual identity in service of others. We celebrate God's nature in order to know and celebrate our nature.

We had a great Celebration of the four feasts last weekend. I thank all the volunteers who made every event very celebrative and spiritually meaningful. Special thanks to Frank Bayer who captured all the celebrative moments in beautiful pictures. You can see them all in our Parish social media. Noelle, Our Parish Youth minister made collages of pictures event by event, published in this bulletin. We are the Family of St. Thomas More blessed and united in the Love of Christ. Let us continue to be God's blessings to each other and live our unity in loving each other.

World Health Organization Recommends End to Conscience Rights

In a direct threat to conscience rights and religious freedom to all countries, the World Health Organization (WHO) released a document in March 2022 that stated, "If it proves impossible to regulate conscience objection in a way that respects, protects and fulfills, abortion seekers' rights, conscientious objection in abortion provision may become indefensible." Alyssa Koren, director of United Nations advocacy at Alliance Defending Freedom International said, "Put bluntly, the WHO is looking to leverage its enormous influence and budgetary power to chip away at international provisions and eventually work to establish a new legal regime ... with no right to conscientious objection." (1)

Koren explained, "International human rights law recognizes the unborn child as a rights-holding person, ... (therefore) no right to abortion exists." (2) In addition, the WHO acknowledges that 75% of countries have legal penalties for abortion. "... it is imperative that we consistently assert that international law is pro-life," said Koren. "Authentic respect for human rights requires safeguarding the right to life of the unborn, in addition to ensuring that mothers and their families have the resources and support necessary to welcome new life." (3)

Freedom of conscience and religion are assured by the Universal Declaration of Human Rights and other international declarations. However, "the fact that the World Health Organization would promote a frontal assault on such a fundamental right as freedom of conscience shows how irresponsible it has become," wrote the Catholic League. (4)


