Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

July 3,, 2022
Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time
Isaiah 66:10-14c
Psalm 66:1-3, 4-5, 6-7, 16, 20
Galatians 6:14-18
Luke 10:1-12, 17-20

A reading from the Gospel according to Luke:

At that time the Lord appointed seventy-two others whom he sent ahead of him in pairs to every town and place he intended to visit.

He said to them, "The harvest is abundant but the laborers are few; so ask the master of the harvest to send out laborers for his harvest. Go on your way; behold, I am sending you like lambs among wolves. Carry no money bag, no sack, no sandals; and greet no one along the way. Into whatever house you enter, first say, 'Peace to this household.' If a peaceful person lives there, your peace will rest on him; but if not, it will return to you. Stay in the same house and eat and drink what is offered to you, for the laborer deserves his payment. Do not move about from one house to another. Whatever town you enter and they welcome you, eat what is set before you, cure the sick in it and say to them, 'The kingdom of God is at hand for you.' Whatever town you enter and they do not receive you, go out into the streets and say, 'The dust of your town that clings to our feet, even that we shake off against you.' Yet know this: the kingdom of God is at hand. I tell you, it will be more tolerable for Sodom on that day than for that town."

The seventy-two returned rejoicing, and said, "Lord, even the demons are subject to us because of your name."

Jesus said, "I have observed Satan fall like lightning from the sky. Behold, I have given you the power to 'tread upon serpents' and scorpions and upon the full force of the enemy and nothing will harm you. Nevertheless, do not rejoice because the spirits are subject to you, but rejoice because your names are written in heaven."

Focus Questions:

- 1) Relate a time when you made an effort to love someone who was different from you.
- 2) How does the story of the Good Samaritan influence your actions when you see someone in need. ,
- 3) How do you live your life so that love of God is primary.

Family and children's question

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

Husband: "I have been committed to myself, since I was born; and you have been committed to yourself, since you were born."

Wife: "Fine, we'll compromise. I'll get my way and you'll find a way to be ok with that."

What is commitment? Commitment is the state or quality of being dedicated to a cause, activity, person etc. which involves an engagement or obligation that restricts freedom of action.

The readings of this Sunday call us to reflect about the commitment without which the fulfilment in one's life would be impossible. The first reading narrates Elijah calling Elisha to continue his prophetic mission. Elijah's call meant something very valuable for Elisha that he left all his possessions and relations and followed Elijah. Elisha's commitment to Elijah empowered him to renounce everything. In the second reading Paul reminds us how the Spirit enlightens and empowers us to be such free persons that nothing or nobody can enslave us. Committing oneself to be led by the Spirit of Christ, is the ultimate freedom of living our potential without any restriction or reservation.

The Gospel reports the various responses from the people who wanted to follow Jesus. Each of them was ready to follow Jesus but not able to commit right away. Something or some person in their personal life delayed following Him immediately. In the first instance the followers of Jesus physically close to Him but very far away from Him in spirit. They wanted to destroy the people in fire, who would not welcome Jesus. But Jesus rebuked them for having such an inimical intention. Jesus expects His followers to be fully committed to goodness towards the other as He is.

In the second instance Jesus instructed the potential follower that following Jesus is a commitment to Him, the person and not to His power, position, or popularity. Following Jesus is a live-in relationship with the person of Jesus not expecting a profit from Him. In the third instance, Jesus seems to give a rude response, "Let the dead bury their dead" to the potential follower who asked Jesus's permission to bury his dead father before He could follow. Whether the response of Jesus is rude or not, depends on how we understand the man's request, "Lord, let me go first and bury my father." Does his statement mean, whether the father is already dead or at the point of death or when the father dies? Also, his words, "let me go first" could mean that he wanted "first" to take care of some other important duties before he would follow Jesus. But for Jesus there can't be any other important care or issue in a follower's life once she/he is committed to Jesus. Jesus expects from His followers to be totally devoted to Him, "If anyone would come after me, he must deny himself and take up his cross daily and follow me" (Luke 9:23).

Commitment to Jesus does not mean possessiveness of or to Jesus; rather it is one's disposition of being dedicated to the person of Jesus which involves an engagement or obligation that frees the follower from every other care and empowers the followers to live in Jesus's light and love fully. The whole life of the follower has to be seen and lived in the light of Jesus. Jesus is the primary and only focus, in the sense that all the words and deeds, all events and actions of the follower are lived and expressed as Jesus' experience. Our commitment to follow Jesus should make us shine God, "let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven. In the same way, let your good deeds shine out for all to see, so that everyone will praise your heavenly Father." (Matthew 5:16)
