Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

July 17,, 2022 Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time Genesis 18:1-10a Psalm 15:2-3, 3-4, 5 Colossians 1::24-28 Luke 10:38-42

A reading from the Gospel according to Luke:

Jesus entered a village here a woman whose name was Martha welcomed him. She had a sister named Mary who sat beside the Lord at his feet listening to him speak.

Martha, burdened with much serving, came to him and said,

"Lord, do you not care that my sister has left me by myself to do the serving? Tell her to help me."
The Lord said to her in reply,

"Martha, Martha, you are anxious and worried about many things. There is need of only one thing. Mary has chosen the better part and it will not be taken from her."

Focus Questions:

- 1) If Jesus were to come to your home today, what would you do?
- 2) Describe a time when doing busy work distracted you from listening to Jesus.
- 3) How do you extend hospitality to others as a member of the Church?

Family and children's question:

Where is home away from home? Who are the people who make you feel welcome?

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends.

A little girl came home from school and said to her mother, "I wish you would let me take my bath in the morning before I go to school, instead of at night before I go to bed."

"What difference does it make?" her mother asked.

"Every day at school", the little girl said, "Miss Taylor tells everybody to stand up who had a bath today. And I haven't been able to stand up one time since school started three moths ago." Literal understanding would lock us in the words spoken and not the meaning conveyed. Words are only tools which help us to grasp the meaning.

Today's readings invite us to live the spirit (meaning) of the law while observing its mandate. In the first reading, Moses reminded the people that Laws that are written in the scrolls, must dwell in the hearts of the reader. The purpose of the law is not to be referred from the book but to revive one's life from the heart.

The second reading presents the whole creation, (the heavens and the earth and the whole universe) is not inanimate objects operating as a mechanical system but a fullness of God's presence in Jesus. The universe is created in Jesus and for Jesus. Thus, the universe in its order and laws, one can experience the Creator; and realize Christ Jesus as its purpose and meaning. In today's Gospel, a scholar of the Law questioned Jesus "Teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?" Jesus did not give a straight answer but questioned him back, "What is written in the law? How do you read it?" The scholar knew the answer from the Book of the Law. So, when he gave the right answer Jesus asked him to put into action what he knew from the book, "You have answered correctly; do this and you will live." Knowing the law is like easy chair dreaming in an A/C room. But living the spirit of the Law is like 'rubber hitting the road' when the letters of the Law become flesh and bone reality in active life.

God is one. One can directly approach God in faith and devotion, in surrender and supplication. Law regarding love of God is not a problem for the Scholar. But Law regarding the love of neighbor is a challenging one. "Neighbor" is a very broad concept, which can include anybody and everybody; so, the scholar asked Jesus for a specific definition; a legal definition of "Neighbor" according to the Book of Law. Thus, the scholar questioned Jesus, "And who is my neighbor?"

Jesus answers him not from the Book but from life; His answer was not from the brain (letter of the law or intellectual one) but from the heart (the spirit of the Law: from the heart). Instead of telling who the neighbor is Jesus narrated a situation (Good Samaritan story) at the end of which Jesus helped the Scholar to find the answer to his own question. The neighbor is not a legal concept or entity defined legally in the law book. Neighbor is a living person whose need was actively met by the persons like the Good Samaritan.

Literal understanding of a 'Neighbor' in the Law depends on who interprets it and how the interpreter wants to do that. But the 'Neighbor' in the spirit of the Law is how the heart interprets it when one meets the needy person. Neighbor is a living person whom I don't choose according to the norms and definitions given to me externally from a Book. 'Neighbor' is a living person who needs my love and concern which my heart makes me aware of. Let us live the Spirit of the Law from the heart.

Supreme Court Rejects Maine's Ban on Tuition Aid to Religious Schools

"There is nothing neutral about Maine's program," wrote Chief Justice John Roberts. "The state pays tuition for certain students at private schools - so long as the schools are not religious. That is discrimination against religion." (1)

"The Court has again affirmed that states cannot exclude religious schools from generally-available public benefits based on their religious affiliation or exercise. In our pluralistic society, it is vital that all people of faith be able to participate in publicly available programs and so contribute to the common good," said Cardinal Dolan and Bishop Daly, chairmen of the USCCB Committees for Religious Liberty and Catholic Education. Supreme Court Affirms Freedom of Religion and **Speech for High School Football Coach**

The Supreme Court ruled 6-3 in favor of HS coach and former U.S. Marine Jo Kennedy's right to pray quietly in thanksgiving after football games. The coach prayed for less than a minute on the 50-yard line after games when the players and coaches had already shaken hands and he was no longer coaching.

"Respect for religious expression is indispensable to life in a free and diverse Republic - whether these expressions take place in a sanctuary or on the field, and whether they manifest through the spoken word or a bowed head," explained Justice Neil Gorsuch for the Court's majority. This decision also reminds the lower courts to be particularly vigilant when schools undermine the twin freedoms of religion and speech. "That the First Amendment doubly protects religious speech is no accident. It is a natural outgrowth of the framers' distrust of government attempts to regulate religion and suppress dissent," wrote Gorsuch. (3)
