

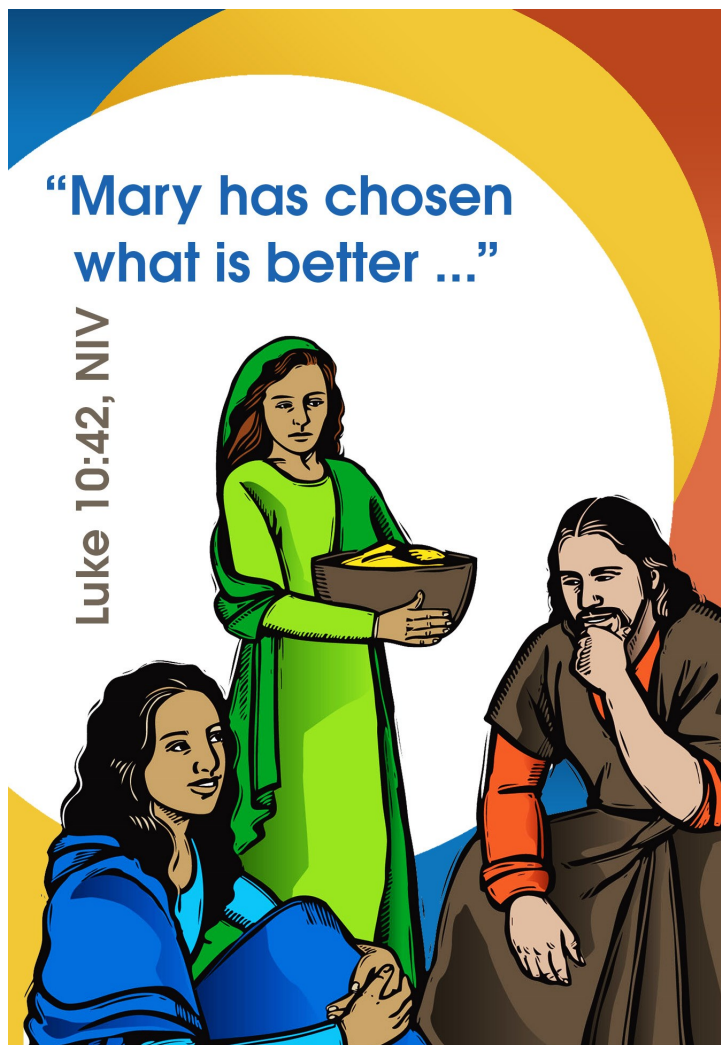

Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

July 24,, 2022
Seventeenth Sunday in Ordinary Time
Genesis 18:20-32
Psalm 138:1-2, 2-3, 6-7, 7-8
Colossians 2:12-14
Luke 11:1-13

A reading from the Gospel according to Luke:

Jesus was praying in a certain place, and when he had finished, one of his disciples said to him, "Lord, teach us to pray just as John taught his disciples." He said to them, "When you pray, say: Father, hallowed be your name, your kingdom come. Give us each day our daily bread and forgive us our sins for we ourselves forgive everyone in debt to us, and do not subject us to the final test."

And he said to them, "Suppose one of you has a friend to whom he goes at midnight and says, 'Friend, lend me three loaves of bread, for a friend of mine has arrived at my house from a journey and I have nothing to offer him,' and he says in reply from within, 'Do not bother me; the door has already been locked and my children and I are already in bed. I cannot get up to give you anything.' I tell you, if he does not get up to give the visitor the loaves because of their friendship, he will get up to give him whatever he needs because of his persistence.

"And I tell you, ask and you will receive; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you. For everyone who asks, receives; and the one who seeks, finds; and to the one who knocks, the door will be opened. What father among you would hand his son a snake when he asks for a fish? Or hand him a scorpion when he asks for an egg? If you then, who are wicked, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will the Father in heaven give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him?"

Focus Questions:

- 1) Describe a time when you were angry with God because you felt your prayers weren't answered.
- 2) What do you think is meant by the phrase "thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven." Relate a time when you lived out that sentiment.
- 3) For whom or what are you praying for these days?

Family and children's question:

Each day pray the Our Father, slowly, paying] attention to each of the phrases.

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

David, a second grader, was bumped while getting on the school bus and suffered a two-inch cut on his cheek. At recess he collided with another boy and lost two teeth. At noon, while sliding on the ice, he fell and broke his wrist. Later at the hospital, his father noticed David was clutching a quarter in his good hand. David said, "Dad, I found it on the ground when I fell. This is the first quarter I ever found. This sure is my lucky day." It was a lucky day for David - not a painful day. It is not the events in themselves that made David's day lucky or painful. It is his focus on his luck amidst all the accidents, which turned his whole day into a lucky day.

Today's Gospel invites us to focus on life more as a blessing than a burden. Martha was not wrong in complaining to Jesus about Mary who was spending time with Jesus without any concern to help Martha. The work becomes a burden when Martha has to do it alone. The work became painfully burdensome when she saw that both Jesus and Martha had taken advantage of her service. So came a moment when she could not take it any longer. She began to complain, "Lord, do you not care that my sister has left me by myself to do the serving? Tell her to help me." **Jesus answered, "Martha, Martha, you are anxious and worried** about many things. There is need of only one thing. Mary has chosen the better part and it will not be taken from her." At the outset these words of Jesus seem to extol Mary's way of "doing nothing and listening to Him" to be better than Martha's "serving and caring for Jesus". Actually, Jesus's words explain that there are two ways of living life. One is Martha's and the other is Mary's .

Martha's way is to "do" the living, which sees life as doing something in anxiety and worry and thus making the act of living burdensome and painful. Mary's way is to "be" oneself in life, by living from one's inner being. When life is lived as an expression of one's inner being, life becomes the blossoming of oneself. Life is not a making of oneself but flowering of oneself. Life is not expression of what one can do but what one is. When we live who we are it will not be taken from us; as Jesus said to Mary "Mary has chosen the better part and it will not be taken from her." This what Jesus meant when He said, "In the same way, let your good deeds shine out for all to see, so that everyone will praise your heavenly Father." (Matthew 5:16)

As Paul says when we live from our inner being whatever we do, whether we eat or drink all will reveal the Glory of God. (1 Corinthians 10:31) Life is not a product of our anxiety or worry but wonderful expression of God's blessing. Again, Jesus's empowering words encourage us to embrace life as God's blessing "Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat or drink; or about your body, what you will wear. Is not life more than food, and the body more than clothes? Look at the birds of the air: They do not sow or reap or gather into barns— and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not much more valuable than they? (Matthew 6:26) Let us focus on our blessings to start our life everyday when we get up from bed. Then let us pray to God and offer the day to be led and empowered by His providence and kindness. Let us live our day more as a blessing and not merely as a burden.

**The Faith of Our Founders – Freedom
Requires Sacrifice**

Most of the nation's 56 Founders were openly religious, believing with Samuel Adams that "true Religion and good Morals are the only solid foundations of public liberty and happiness." After signing the Declaration of Independence on July 4, 1776, Samuel Adams wrote, "We have this day restored the Sovereign to whom men ought to be obedient. He reigns in Heaven, and with a propitious eye beholds his subjects assuming that freedom of thought and dignity of self-direction which He bestowed on them. From the rising to the setting of the sun, may His kingdom come!"

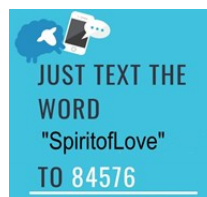
"And for the support of this Declaration, with firm reliance on the protection of Divine Providence, we mutually pledge to each other our Lives, our Fortunes, and our sacred Honor." - The final line of the Declaration of Independence

With this pledge, the 56 Founders were willing to sacrifice everything for God and for liberty. Many of them and their families suffered hardship that few today remember:

- Five were captured by the British and tortured before they died.
- Twelve had their homes ransacked and burned.
- Nine fought and died from wounds or hardships of war.
- A Virginia planter and trader saw his ships sunk by the British navy and he died in poverty.
- Others also lost all their worldly possessions and died bankrupt.

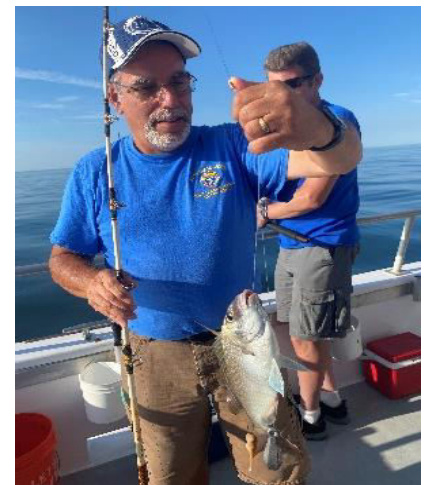
