# Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

July 31,, 2022 Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time Ecclesiastes 1:2; 2:21-23 Psalm 90: 3-4, 5-6, 12-13, 14, 17 Colossians 3:1-5, 9-11 Luke 12:13-21

#### A reading from the Gospel according to Luke:

Someone in the crowd said to Jesus,

"Teacher, tell my brother to share the inheritance with me."

He replied to him,

"Friend, who appointed me as your judge and arbitrator?"

Then he said to the crowd.

"Take care to guard against all greed, for though one may be rich, one's life does not consist of possessions."

Then he told them a parable.

"There was a rich man whose land produced a bountiful harvest.

He asked himself, 'What shall I do, for I do not have space to store my harvest?'

And he said, 'This is what I shall do I shall tear down my barns and build larger ones. There I shall store all my grain and other goods and I shall say to myself, "Now as for you, you have so many good things stored up for many years, rest, eat, drink, be merry!"

But God said to him,

'You fool, this night your life will be demanded of you; and the things you have prepared, to whom will they belong?' Thus will it be for all who store up treasure for themselves but are not rich in what matters to God."

#### **Focus Ouestions:**

- 1) How do the riches that you have stored up compare to the riches God treasures?
- 2) Share a time when you felt God calling you to simplify your life.
- 3) Our culture values "having it all." What is enough for you?

Take a look around your home. Decide what you really need and what you could give away.

#### FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

There was an exhausted wood cutter who kept wasting time and energy chopping wood with a blunt axe because he did not have the time, he said, to stop and sharpen the blade. Quiet time before God in prayer would seem a waste of time but that is the time life is charged with enlightenment to see clearly and energy to live joyfully.

The Rule in a monastery was not "do not speak," but, "Do not speak unless you can improve on the silence." The same can be said of prayer. Do not pray unless you can improve your living. This Sunday's readings reflect on the relation between prayer and life. In the first reading Abraham negotiates with God to save Sodom and Gomorrah from God's intended plan of destroying them. At the start God consents to spare the city of Sodom if God finds fifty innocent people in it. Abraham dialogues with God to lower their number up to 10 innocent people until God says that 'for the sake of those ten, God will not destroy it.' Prayer is a dialogue with God; on the one hand prayer pleads God's mercy to save us in our unworthy sinful state; on the other hand, prayer raises our style of living as much as possible, to reach God in God's way.

The second reading explains that God is not demanding what we don't have. God has forgiven our sins and unworthiness; God has made us sharers in Christ's Resurrection. We have the

our sins and unworthiness; God has made us sharers in Christ's Resurrection. We have the power of resurrection in us. Prayer is the moment when we allow the God-given power of the New-Resurrected-Life to be active. After having lived through various concerns and challenges of the day, Prayer can be the moment when we sit silently in the presence of the Risen Lord in order to be revived and revitalized with the Godly power of New-Life.

**Today's Gospel is the Lord's Prayer.** Jesus teaches that prayer can make God's will active on earth among us as it is ever-active in Heaven. Through prayer we can invite God's kingdom to come among us, both in God providing us our food every day and in forgiving our transgressions. Prayer empowers to change our life in forgiving each other's transgression as God does for each of us in forgiving our transgressions.

God promises that we would receive what we ask. God as a father would not hand us His children a snake when we ask for fish. If our prayer is to God our Father, all God expects us is to live like His children. Let us pray in faith as God's children. Let us persevere in prayer that it will be heard.

The U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) Statement on the U.S. Supreme Court Ruling in Dobbs v. Jackson, June 24, 2022: "This is a historic day in the life of our country, one that stirs our thoughts, emotions and prayers. For nearly 50 years, America has enforced an unjust law that has permitted some to decide whether others can live or die; this policy has resulted in the deaths of tens of millions of pre-born children, generations that were denied the right to even be born. "America was founded on the truth that all men and women are created equal, with God-given rights to life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness. This truth was grievously denied by the U.S. Supreme Court's Roe v. Wade ruling, which legalized and normalized the taking of innocent human life.
