A reading from the Gospel according to Luke:

Tax collectors and sinners were all drawing near to listen to Jesus, but the Pharisees and scribes began to complain, saying, “This man welcomes sinners and eats with them.” So to them he addressed this parable. “What man among you having a hundred sheep and losing one of them would not leave the ninety-nine in the desert and go after the lost one until he finds it? And when he does find it, he sets it on his shoulders with great joy and, upon his arrival home, he calls together his friends and neighbors and says to them, ‘Rejoice with me because I have found my lost sheep.’ I tell you, in just the same way there will be more joy in heaven over one sinner who repents than over ninety-nine righteous people who have no need of repentance.

“Or what woman having ten coins and losing one would not light a lamp and sweep the house, searching carefully until she finds it? And when she does find it, she calls together her friends and neighbors and says to them, ‘Rejoice with me because I have found the coin that I lost.’ In just the same way, I tell you, there will be rejoicing among the angels of God over one sinner who repents.”

Focus Questions:

- 1) What is your reaction to these parables? Which one best communicates the love of God to you?
- 2) The parables show that God is the seeker, we are the lost. Describe a time when you felt lost and then found by God.
- 3) Describe a time when you were forgiven or you forgave someone without reservation.

Family and children’s question:

Talk about a time when your relationship with someone was healed after a disagreement.

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

A general of the Persian army always gave his condemned prisoners a choice, the firing squad, or the black door. Most chose the firing squad. The prisoners were never told what was on the other side of the door. Few ever chose the unknown of the black door. When asked what was on the other side of the black door, the general answered, "Freedom, and I've known only a few men brave enough to take it." Unless we are ready to take risk we will never step into the newer and better reality. Out of fear of taking risk we will only repeat the past. Doing the same thing over and over again would never bring different or newer results.

In Today's Gospel Jesus demands his disciples to take a great risk. "If anyone comes to me without hating his father and mother, wife and children, brothers, and sisters, and even his own life, he cannot be my disciple. Whoever does not carry his own cross and come after me cannot be my disciple." 'Hating parents and children' and 'carrying the cross' are too high a price to pay, too risky to follow Jesus. To be Jesus's disciple is not a "low-cost" and "low-risk" commodity. Jesus would not get any disciples at this rate. We expect Him to come in with a lower or a better offer, so that He can have more followers.

Let us try to understand the words of Jesus. The language of this particular saying, however, raises concern for many. Does Jesus really call us to hate our biological families and our very lives? Jesus is using hyperbolic language here as he does frequently in his teachings (e.g., If your hand or your foot causes you to stumble, cut it off and throw it away. It is better for you to enter life maimed or crippled than to have two hands or two feet and be thrown into eternal fire. And if your eye causes you to stumble, gouge it out and throw it away. It is better for you to enter life with one eye than to have two eyes and be thrown into the fire of hell. Matthew 18:8-9).

This becomes clear when we compare this saying in Luke with its parallel in Matthew (10:37): "Whoever loves father or mother more than me is not worthy of me; and whoever loves son or daughter more than me is not worthy of me." Matthew, drawing on the same Jesus tradition as Luke, seems to have interpreted the starker language of "hate" to refer to primary allegiance. For Matthew, this saying indicates that our primary allegiance must be to Jesus rather than to family. (Jeannine K. brown)

Discipleship is defined by following Jesus and "carrying the cross." This phrase indicates that giving up self-interest and competing loyalties are central to discipleship. Neither of these sayings of Jesus lend themselves to an "easy believism" or a "low-cost" form of faith. Instead, they stress the high cost of following Jesus.

In this Lukan passage, Jesus calls people to a kind of discipleship that is not cheap, not easy, and not to be entered into without deep consideration of the consequences and costs. This passage speaks to the importance of loyalty and allegiance to Jesus over all other competing loyalties, including family, self-interest, and possessions. Without taking the risks, we may live comfortably but not our true potential fully well. We would be rather repeating ourselves in doing nothing more pleasing our 'selfishness'. When we can keep our focus primarily on Jesus, we will be able to live true, original, and newer self with all our potentials.
