



A reading from the Gospel according to Luke:

Jesus said to his disciples, "A rich man had a steward who was reported to him for squandering his property. He summoned him and said, 'What is this I hear about you? Prepare a full account of your stewardship, because you can no longer be my steward.'

The steward said to himself, 'What shall I do, now that my master is taking the position of steward away from me? I am not strong enough to dig and I am ashamed to beg. I know what I shall do so that, when I am removed from the stewardship, they may welcome me into their homes.' He called in his master's debtors one by one. To the first he said, 'How much do you owe my master?' He replied, 'One hundred measures of olive oil.' He said to him, 'Here is your promissory note. Sit down and quickly write one for fifty.' Then to another the steward said, 'And you, how much do you owe?' He replied, 'One hundred kors of wheat.' The steward said to him, 'Here is your promissory note; write one for eighty.' And the master commended that dishonest steward for acting prudently. "For the children of this world are more prudent in dealing with their own generation than are the children of light. I tell you, make friends for yourselves with dishonest wealth, so that when it fails, you will be welcomed into eternal dwellings. The person who is trustworthy in very small matters is also trustworthy in great ones; and the person who is dishonest in very small matters is also dishonest in great ones. If, therefore, you are not trustworthy with dishonest wealth, who will trust you with true wealth?

If you are not trustworthy with what belongs to another, who will give you what is yours? No servant can serve two masters. He will either hate one and love the other, or be devoted to one and despise the other.

You cannot serve both God and mammon."

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

The prodigal son returned home to his father. So, the father hugged him and said, "My Son! Oh, my Son! I am very happy you returned. Let us kill the fatten calf and celebrate your return."

The prodigal son replied, "Uh, Dad, I've become a vegetarian."

Without missing a beat, Dad quickly ordered his servants, "Quick, fetch the fattened asparagus." Today's Gospel is Jesus's famous story of the father waiting in love to welcome his prodigal son. The son returned when he realized that going back to his father as a servant is better than to continue living in disgust and disappointment among the swine. He came back to his father only to be accepted as his servant. Because he found in him nothing worthy to claim his sonship back. But on his return, he could see to his surprise that nothing has changed in his father's relationship towards him. He welcomed and celebrated him as his son.

Though the son denied the father's love for a while, the father never diminished in his father's love towards his son. The simple message is: "God never minds what we've done. God says "Just come home. I am waiting for you. I remain as your faithful father even when you leave me losing your faith in me." As Paul says too, "If we are unfaithful, God remains faithful, for God cannot deny who God is." (2 Timothy 2:13)

It is not that God does not care when we get lost. God creates/allows occasions or opportunities for us to grow in self-realization. God does not install His Love as a program in us as if we are God's computer. We are God's beloved people. God's love waits and watches for us to relate back to Him in love. God created us in God's image and thus finds us, as worthy persons to fall in love. God expects us to love God back freely, without any coercion. God as the father waits for the love in return from the prodigal sons. We have to realize for ourselves that we can and want to love God.

Our sinful inclinations and selfish preferences may take us far away from God as the prodigal son did. But God not only waits for us to come back to love and live with Him, but also come in search of us. The other two stories before the story of the prodigal son, present the God who is searching for us, the lost children. God looks for us like the shepherd who goes after the lost sheep. God is so happy to find us... happy like the woman who found her lost coin.

God so loves us to send His Son, Jesus to die on the cross so that we can be back to be ever with Him. St. Paul who lived formerly away from Jesus and later became His Apostle, must have felt the same love of a prodigal son coming back to the love of his father. He expresses God's love beautifully well in his letter to the Galatians, "I live, no longer I, but Christ lives in me; insofar as I now live in the flesh, I live by faith in the Son of God who has loved me and given himself up for me." Let us join with Paul and say, "Jesus loves me and wants to live in me. I will rise and return to HIM."


