A reading from the Gospel according to Luke:

As Jesus continued his journey to Jerusalem, he traveled through Samaria and Galilee. As he was entering a village, ten lepers met him.

They stood at a distance from him and raised their voices, saying,

"Jesus, Master! Have pity on us!"

And when he saw them, he said,

"Go show yourselves to the priests."

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

A man was drinking tea with a friend in a restaurant. He looked long and hard at his cup, then said with a resigned sigh, "Ah, my friend, life is like a cup of tea."

The other also looked long and hard at his own cup, then asked, "Why? Why is life like a cup of tea?"

The man said, "I don't know why. I am not an intellectual."

Life can be contained into any kind of intellectual explanation. It cannot be boxed into any logical principles like 'Cause and Effect' or 'Quid pro Quo' or 'karma' etc. Settling down to a fixated reason of why things happen or happened in the way they happen/happened in life is only a partial and convenient understanding of the mystery of life.

In today's Gospel Jesus teaches us to live our life in faith and in service, so that we may cherish life in its abundance and to live it fully well. <u>First</u>, Jesus instructs us that life must be lived in faith. Faith empowers our life to move mountains. "If you have faith the size of a mustard seed, you would say to this mulberry tree, 'Be uprooted and planted in the sea,' and it would obey you. (Luke 17:6) <u>Secondly</u> Jesus teaches that life empowered by faith must be lived in service. Whether we plan to achieve big or small in life or wish to lead a commendable or a common style of life, our attitude towards the life must be like that of a servant. At the end of every day, we must be willing to say, the words of Jesus, 'We are unworthy servants; we have only done our duty." (Luke 17:10)

Faith and service are the basic pillars of life, (both of personal and social life.) Without faith life would be always lived in fear and thus would become frozen. Faith offers vision, as well as power to walk towards that vision. But this vision and power offered by Faith, must be lived in the mode of service. Faith without its natural lead to service, would be just one's own selfish dream. Faith without service would only be brutal or fanatic march towards goal without consideration for others who journey with us in life. Faith is not one's own fanatic vision to be imposed on others. Faith is a divine vision shared by all the believers. Faith empowers the believer to reach out to others in service. Service without faith will soon turn to be servile in nature. Service is not merely helping or attending to the need of the others, rather it is a loving act towards the other empowering the other, to journey towards the shared vision that faith has offered us. Service includes all of us in vision and empowers all of us without any discrimination and gathers all of us as pilgrims towards life in its fullness. Yes, we wish and believe in the vision of a prosperous and peaceful life for all and everyone. But why are we never able to overcome the problems of violence or war, divisions, or discriminations? Because our vision/wish offered by our faith are not lived in service. Faith without service is wild power without rein. Faith will be soon fanaticism without service. Service without faith is servility. Servant without faith will be a slave. Let us follow Jesus's wisdom to build the power of living in faith and to cherish life's abundance in service.

Liturgical Minister Training - Fall 2022

The Diocese of Rockville Center will offer training for those who wish to serve as Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion and Lectors.

Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion: Part A - This training is required for **all** those who are beginning as Ministers. This "BASIC" training is required for **all** Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion. Those who wish to minister in hospitals, nursing homes and to the homebound are required to attend Part B training in addition to BASIC training. One **must** attend Part A training prior to Part B training.

Lector Workshop is available for both new and experienced lectors.
