A reading from the Gospel according to Luke:

Jesus told his disciples a parable about the necessity for them to pray always without becoming weary. He said, "There was a judge in a certain town who neither feared God nor respected any human being. And a widow in that town used to come to him and say, 'Render a just decision for me against my adversary.' For a long time the judge was unwilling, but eventually he thought, 'While it is true that I neither fear God nor respect any human being, because this widow keeps bothering me I shall deliver a just decision for her lest she finally come and strike me.'" The Lord said, "Pay attention to what the dishonest judge says. Will not God then secure the rights of his chosen ones who call out to him day and night? Will he be slow to answer them? I tell you, he will see to it that justice is done for them speedily. But when the Son of Man comes, will he find faith on earth?"

- 1) Recall a time in your life when your persistent prayers were answered.
- 2) How faithful are you to prayer these days?
- 3) Why do you think Jesus asks the question whether he will find faith when he returns? What do you think Jesus would find if he returned now?

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

A little old lady sold pretzels for fifty cents at a street corner. Everyday a young lawyer would pass her by and left her two quarters. However, he never took a pretzel. This went on for nearly five years. She never spoke a word to him all these years, as he walked away without taking a pretzel.

Finally, one day, as the lawyer passed her stand after leaving the two quarters, the woman spoke to him, "Sir I appreciate your business. But you need to know something. The price of pretzels has gone up to seventy-five cents. It is your choice to take or not take a pretzel but now you need to leave 3 quarters henceforth."

Life many times is taken to be a force of habit as the lawyer did or strict business as the woman expected it.

Today's Gospel story is about the ten lepers who were healed by Jesus, but only one came back to Jesus to thank Him. Jesus reacted to the one who thanked him, "Ten were cleansed, were they not?"

Where are the other nine? Has none but this foreigner returned to give thanks to God?" Then he said to him, "Stand up and go; your faith has saved you." All were healed. The Samaritan alone thanked Jesus; the nine others failed to thank Jesus.

Instead of coming back to Jesus to thank Him, the nine went straight to get their approval certificate of being cleansed of leprosy from the priest. Their need of being approved by the other (priests) worked in them more than their sense of being thankful to the one (Jesus) who cleansed them. So, the approval of their cleansing by others became more important to them than their personal realization that they were healed. On the contrary, in the Samaritan, his self-realization that he is cleansed of his leprosy and not the rush for other's approval, urged him ardently to return to the healer. His own realization that he is healed was more important to him than the approval from the others about his healing.

Healing is what happens in oneself. The approval is only an acknowledgement from the others. Until and unless one feels within oneself that he/she is healed, any kind of health-certificate from a doctor would be useless. Also, it is possible that a person can acquire one's health certificate from others by many crooked means even without being healed within oneself. Healing is primarily a self-realization. Without one's own self-realization any claim of healing would only be a forced or pretended one. That is why Jesus complemented the Samaritan, "your faith has saved you."

Faith invites us to see the healing to take place from within ourselves. Faith drives us (like the Samaritan) back to the source (Jesus), the healer, not to rush for the approval by others. Faith confirms to us that we are the healed persons not by other's standard but by God's Grace. Let our faith make us live from self-realization and not for the sake of approval from others.

October is the month of Our Lady of the Rosary: "The family that prays together stays together". Rosary is a family prayer that all the generations of a family pray together. October is the month dedicated to Our Lady of the Rosary. If your work or other concerns of daily life do not give enough time to pray the full Rosary, please try to come together as a family to pray a decade of the Rosary. A decade of the Rosary is praying an "Our Father", 10 times "Hail Mary" and conclude with "Glory Be". Also, while you wait on line, or are stuck in traffic, or waiting in the doctor's office... you can raise your heart to God praying the Rosary. In our Church we pray the Rosary every day before the Mass.

Rosary App on your phone: You can download from Google play store. "Rosary", a free App. It is a great help to pray the Rosary while you drive, just one decade or a full Rosary. Just tune the Rosary app to your car radio and you can join while the Rosary prayer is played.

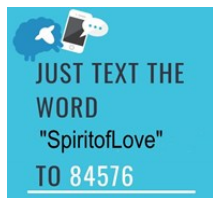

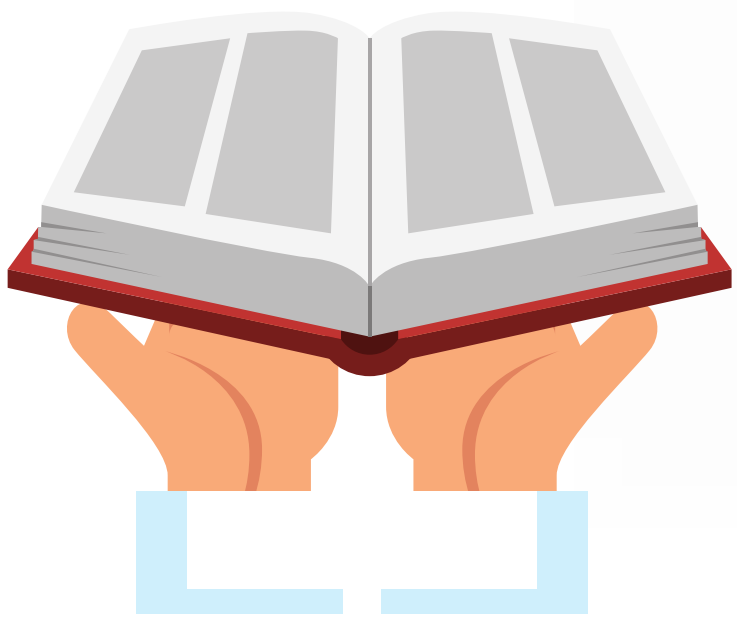

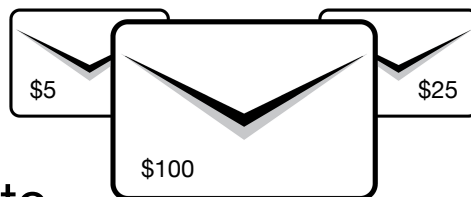
