# Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

October 23, 2022 Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time Sirach 35:12-14, 16-18 Psalm 34:2-3, 17-18, 19, 23 2 Timothy 4:6-8, 16-18 Luke 18:9-14

#### A reading from the Gospel according to Luke:

Jesus addressed this parable to those who were convinced of their own righteousness and despised everyone else. "Two people went up to the temple area to pray; one was a Pharisee and the other was a tax collector. The Pharisee took up his position and spoke this prayer to himself, 'O God, I thank you that I am not like the rest of humanity -- greedy, dishonest, adulterous -- or even like this tax collector. I fast twice a week, and I pay tithes on my whole income.' But the tax collector stood off at a distance and would not even raise his eyes to heaven but beat his breast and prayed, 'O God, be merciful to me a sinner.' I tell you, the latter went home justified, not the former; for whoever exalts himself will be humbled, and the one who humbles himself will be exalted."

#### **Focus Questions:**

- 1) Describe how God's grace helped you to be humble and not prideful.
- 2) Relate a time when you noticed the Pharisee spirit infecting you? What did you do about it?
- 3) What is your reaction to God showing no favorites?

Describe a time when you felt misjudged. How did you react?

#### FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

The Lion went up to the rhinoceros and asked, "Who is the king of the jungle?" "You are, O Lion." Came the answer

The Lion asked the hippopotamus, "Who is the king of the jungle?"

The hippo said, "You are, O Lion."

The lion asked the elephant the same question. But the elephant seized the lion with his trunk, threw him high in the air, caught him on the way down and slammed him hard against a tree. The lion rose half dazed, shook himself, and said weakly, "Just because you don't know the right answer, you don't have to get sore."

Justice and power must be brought together, so that whatever is just may be powerful, and whatever is powerful may be just. (Blaise Pascal)

Today's Gospel is the story of how a powerless widow got her justice from a powerful unjust judge. The widow is the most defenseless and vulnerable person of the society in Jesus's time. Even more so as a powerless plaintiff asking for justice against her adversary, she could be easily ignored and silenced. Yet against all the odds how did she manage to get the judge to render a just decision? The unwilling and unjust judge in his personal testimony explains that it was her perseverance which compelled him to render justice. His words are, "While it is true that I neither fear God nor respect any human being, because this widow keeps bothering me I shall deliver a just decision for her lest she finally come and strike me."

Perseverance is persistence in doing something or determination in being somebody despite difficulty or delay in achieving the goal. Perseverance is a virtue that cannot be understated. With ordinary talent and extraordinary perseverance all things are attainable. Perseverance is like dripping water that hollows stone, not through force but through unrelenting drops on the same spot of the stone. Perseverance is not merely about sticking to the same thing forever. It means giving full concentration and effort to whatever one does right now. It is rather to keep journeying in the chosen path and be ever conscious of arriving at the destination without distraction and despair.

Through this parable Jesus instructs to develop and live such a kind of hopeful relationship with God. At the conclusion of today's Gospel, Jesus invites us to "Pay attention to what the dishonest judge says. Will not God then secure the rights of his chosen ones who call out to him day and night? Will he be slow to answer them?" Perseverance makes the believer stick on to God in all situations.

Perseverance by nature is not a quick solution; nor is it a temporary bandage, or immediate gratification. It is a long process or journey of faith and hope towards a healthy life in abundance. Perseverance gives the confidence that we believe the right person, God who is faithful to us and God works all things for the good of those who love him, who have been called according to his purpose. (Rom. 8:28)

Perseverance empowers us with the right hope that the right thing will certainly happen, because it is God 's purpose in God's time and with God's power that that will make everything happen in our life. Let us pray for the gift of perseverance and become people of faith and hope in God. Let us give our burdens to the LORD, and He will take care of us. He will not permit the godly to slip and fall. (Psalm 55:22). It is not the power of an unjust judge but the perseverance of a powerless widow is the real power of live.




