Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

October 30, 2022 Thirty-First Sunday in Ordinary Time Wisdom 11:22-12:2 Psalm 145:1-2, 8-9, 10-11, 13, 14 2 Thessalonians 1:11-2:2 Luke 19:1-10

A reading from the Gospel according to Luke:

At that time, Jesus came to Jericho and intended to pass through the town. Now a man there named Zacchaeus, who was a chief tax collector and also a wealthy man, was seeking to see who Jesus was; but he could not see him because of the crowd, for he was short in stature. So he ran ahead and climbed a sycamore tree in order to see Jesus, who was about to pass that way. When he reached the place, Jesus looked up and said, "Zacchaeus, come down quickly, for today I must stay at your house." And he came down quickly and received him with joy. When they all saw this, they began to grumble, saying, "He has gone to stay at the house of a sinner." But Zacchaeus stood there and said to the Lord. "Behold, half of my possessions, Lord, I shall give to the poor, and if I have extorted anything from anyone I shall repay it four times over." And Jesus said to him, "Today salvation has come to this house because this man too is a descendant of Abraham. For the Son of Man has come to seek and to save what was lost."

Focus Questions:

- 1) Relate a time when you made a decision to change the direction of your life.
- 2) Describe a time when you were singled out by someone you admired.
- 3) Relate a time when you were given a second chance.

Family and children's question:

Zaccheus climbed a tree to get a better look at Jesus. What would you do to get closer to look at Jesus?

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

A poster was displayed in all the conference rooms at a computer manufacturing company. It showed two or three large, ponderous hippopotami standing around with their gigantic mouths wide open. The words on the poster read, "When all is said and done, more is said than done." Discussion without deeds is like dreams that one forgets as soon as He/she wakes up. Deeds without discussions will lack enthusiasm from the participants.

Today's Gospel is the story of two people, a Pharisee and a tax-collector praying to God. The prayer of the pharisee was a report of what he did for God according to God's commandment, while the tax-collector's prayer was his wish of what God could do in and for him. The pharisee presented to God, his own product of how he made a worthy life before God. The tax collector presented himself to God, his raw self, like a clay, so that he can become God's handiwork. The pharisee has done everything he needs to do, and God has nothing to do in him. While the tax collector pleads to God to do God's will.

Prayer is not a deed that we do for God. Rather, Prayer is the moment when we allow God to do the purpose for which God created us. Prayer is not to please/placate God with what we can do for God. Rather, Prayer is our openness to God to penetrate and possess us that our life may radiate, and we become His light and love. (Mother Teresa) Our potential is not what we can do but what and how much we allow God to do in us according to God's standard. Thus, Prayer becomes the moment of realizing that God empowers our human faculties so that our human words and deeds become divine in character.

Mother Teresa has very powerfully expressed. "In all sincerity we must be able to look up and say: 'I can do all things in Him who strengthens me.' (Phil.4:13) Because of this assertion of St. Paul we must have a certain confidence in doing our work – or rather God's work – Well, efficiently, even perfectly with Jesus and for Jesus." Let us be also convinced that we by ourselves can do anything only within our limitation as the Pharisee did. We can boast proudly about our achievements as long as we conscientiously hide our weakness, sin, and misery. Confidence in God allow us to live in God's mercy as the tax collector did. All what God needs from us is our emptiness and lowliness and our plenitude (Mother Teresa). Let us be like the tax collector and allow God to fill us that we become God's word and God's deed.

Since COVID our members have dropped & we would like to rebuild our group.





Liturgical Minister Training - Fall 2022

The Diocese of Rockville Center will offer training for those who wish to serve as Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion and Lectors.

Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion: Part A - This training is required for **all** those who are beginning as Ministers. This "BASIC" training is required for **all** Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion. Those who wish to minister in hospitals, nursing homes and to the homebound are required to attend Part B training in addition to BASIC training. One **must** attend Part A training prior to Part B training.
