A reading from the Gospel according to Luke:

Some Sadducees, those who deny that there is a resurrection, came forward and put this question to Jesus, saying, "Teacher, Moses wrote for us, If someone's brother dies leaving a wife but no child, his brother must take the wife and raise up descendants for his brother. Now there were seven brothers; the first married a woman but died childless. Then the second and the third married her, and likewise all the seven died childless. Finally the woman also died. Now at the resurrection whose wife will that woman be? For all seven had been married to her." Jesus said to them, "The children of this age marry and remarry; but those who are deemed worthy to attain to the coming age and to the resurrection of the dead neither marry nor are given in marriage. They can no longer die, for they are like angels; and they are the children of God because they are the ones who will rise. That the dead will rise even Moses made known in the passage about the bush, when he called out 'Lord, 'the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob; and he is not God of the dead, but of the living, for to him all are alive "

- 2) Describe a time when you tried to convince someone of something you believed in.
- 3) What does Jesus' answer do to help you understand the afterlife?

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

Beethoven handled the violin awkwardly and preferred playing his own compositions instead of improving his technique. His teacher called him hopeless as a composer.

<u>Walt Disney</u> was fired by a newspaper editor for lack of ideas. Walt Disney also went bankrupt several times before he built Disneyland.

<u>Albert Einstein</u> did not speak until he was four years old and didn't read until he was seven. His teacher described him as, "mentally slow, unsociable, and adrift forever in his foolish dreams. "He was expelled from the Zurich Polytechnic School. It happened more often than we know, that the persons who were considered as valueless have proved themselves highly valuable.

Today's Gospel story narrates that Zacchaeus was considered as sinner until Jesus declared him to be a saved one. The story begins describing Zacchaeus as chief tax collector who was grumbled at and branded as sinner and outcast by the people. The story ends by stating Zacchaeus redeemed by Jesus and thus declared by Jesus as a Son of Abraham like everybody else.

Zacchaeus as a tax collector, was extorting money from the people by hook or by crook in the name of tax. But his meeting with Jesus transformed him totally into a person who could declare openly, "Behold, half of my possessions, Lord, I shall give to the poor, and if I have extorted anything from anyone, I shall repay it four times over." The extorting person became a generous donor who not only was ready to repay the extortion-ed money but also (half of his possession) to the poor. He not only converted from his former way of living (tax collector) but promised to live a New way of living by willingly sharing his wealth.

The whole story ends with Jesus's powerful self-declaration, "the Son of Man has come to seek and to save what was lost." 'To seek and save the lost' is Jesus's mission. 'To be lost' means that the lost person belonged to someone before he/she got lost. 'To save' means that the found person has still possessed something that could be or has to be saved. While others condemned and abandoned him as a lost and unredeemable soul, Jesus sought him by getting Himself self-invited to his house and saved/redeemed in him that which can never be lost, his right of being a descendant of Abraham.

Zacchaeus story can be the story of us all. We may forget, deny, or neglect God and prefer to sit on our own tree (convenient zone) like Zacchaeus. Or at times (like Christmas or Easter) we may like to see who Jesus is, like Zacchaeus did out of curiosity. But God in Jesus seeks us, comes to our own comfort or convenient zone to get self-invited to come to our abode. Behold He stands at our door and knocks. If anyone hears His voice and opens the door, [then] He will enter our house and dine with us. (Revelation 3:20)

Encounter with Jesus and eating with Jesus can happen today in our lives at the Eucharistic table which is the Holy Mass. The first part of the Mass contains readings. They explain how Jesus comes to us in today's context, to our place where we are in the readings we can hear His self-invitation to dine with us. After the readings the Eucharistic celebrations starts at the Mass. At this moment, we offer the bread and wine to Jesus, while He offers back to us His body and blood in the forms of bread and wine. At the communion Jesus and we dine with each other. At this dinner time Jesus claims in us, that we are children of God redeemed by Him. At the end of the Mass we return to our life as persons touched by Jesus to live God's way of life in our day to day activities. The Zacchaeus story happens at the Mass for each one of us. Let us come down from our trees and dine with Jesus at the Mass to be sought and saved by Him

Summation:

As you may see the parish is experiencing the impact of inflation, erosion of investments and the same economic problems many of you are undergoing in these difficult times. Your generous support may have kept collections fairly close to last year, but we did experience significant impact due to inflation and investment erosion along with loses in major income streams from Parish Programs, Maintenance & Repair funds and the reduction of income from pledges for our Capital Campaign. in summary income decreased nearly \$300,000 year to year. Expenses increased in the salaries we pay staff along with fringe benefits which were the main drivers. Smaller increases were seen in Maintenance and Office expenses. In summary, while expenses overall decreased by nearly \$180,000; we were operating on a deficit of \$151,544. 
