A reading from the Gospel according to Matthew:

Jesus said to his disciples: "As it was in the days of Noah, so it will be at the coming of the Son of Man. In those days before the flood, they were eating and drinking, marrying and giving in marriage, up to the day that Noah entered the ark. They did not know until the flood came and carried them all away. So will it be also at the coming of the Son of Man. Two men will be out in the field; one will be taken, and one will be left. Two women will be grinding at the mill; one will be taken, and one will be left. Therefore, stay awake! For you do not know on which day your Lord will come. Be sure of this: if the master of the house had known the hour of night when the thief was coming, he would have stayed awake and not let his house be broken into. So too, you also must be prepared, for at an hour you do not expect, the Son of Man will come."

Focus Questions:

- 1) How often do you think of the Second coming of Christ?
- 2) Advent is different every year because we are in a different place every year. What are you looking forward to this Advent?
- 3) Relate a time when you felt unprepared.

Family and children's question:

Talk about what you can do as a family to make Advent more than just the preparation for the celebration on Christmas Day.

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

In the kingdom of Panda, a simpleton yells in the street: "King Panda is a moron! King Panda is an idiot!". He is taken away by the police on charges of lese majesty (insulting the monarch). He tells the policemen "Please let me go, I meant another Panda!". The police chief replies: "Do not lie. If you said 'moron', you certainly meant the King Panda!" A king is a man who rules a country, by inheritance, coming to power when the previous monarch dies, who is usually a family member of his. But to accept him as a king or not, depends on how well he rules.

Today is the Solemn Feast of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. Today's readings explain the nature and efficacy of His kingship. Jesus is a descendant of the family of King David. The first reading explains how David proved himself through victories over enemies, brought the people together as a nation and thus became the King at the acceptance and request of the people to be their King. The second reading proclaims the nature of Jesus's Kingship and Kingdom. Jesus is King in redeeming

His people from their slavery to sin and darkness by forgiving and leading them to light. His Kingdom is a community of people gathered together as members of His own Body and is filled with His peace and blessings.

The Gospel reading portrays Jesus, the King in action. It demonstrates how Jesus, exercises His Kingship and what is the nature of Kingdom. The Gospel today does not picture Him on His throne or in a war front winning His battles but describes graphically Jesus's pain and shame as a condemned criminal on the cross in the middle of two other criminals on His sides. The situation and its settings are certainly not royal in character. But the life and the forgiveness that He exercised from the cross to all and even to the criminal hanging like Him on a cross, is certainly Kingly and Godly in nature - the merciful and forgiving King in whose kingdom everyone is included not on their individual merits but on the unconditional mercy of God expressed in Jesus on the Cross. As people belonging to Jesus's Kingdom, let us live God's Kingly nature of including all people without any discrimination, for who they are, as given by God, as a gift in our Human Family, to live and build the Kingdom of God among us, a Kingdom of Love Peace and Justice.

This Thursday is Thanksgiving Day. Giving Thanks is not one of the many things that we do. It is a fundamental attitude towards life. Without thanksgiving we will be easily turned into a machine or creatures of habits. Thanksgiving makes us consciously live from the heart. When we begin to live from our heart, we will live every moment of life in the spirit of Thanksgiving.

I like to quote the words of St. Paul with the heart of gratitude for all of you, my family of St. Thomas More; "Every time I think of you, I give thanks to my God. Whenever I pray, I make my requests for all of you with joy, for you have been my partners in spreading the Good News about Christ from the time you first heard it until now. And I am certain that God, who began the good work within you, will continue his work until it is finally finished on the day when Christ Jesus returns." (Philippians 1:3-4). I wish you all "HAPPY THANKSGIVING."

Next week November of 27th we begin the New Liturgical Year with the Season of Advent, a period of preparation for the birth of Our Lord Jesus in our hearts and home. It is also a very busy season of getting gifts for our beloved one. May I remind you that you can give no better gift to you than your best self. As much as we would like to express our good self in the gifts we give, let us not forget to give sometime to tune our individual self to sound sweet, behave better, include the other without prejudice. to offer oneself without condition. Advent is the best time for our best self to be born within us.








The Catholic Health Community Outreach program will be at St. Thomas More on Tuesday November 22, 2022 from 10 AM until 2 PM.


