A reading from the Gospel according to Matthew:

John the Baptist appeared, preaching in the desert of Judea and saying, "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand!" It was of him that the prophet Isaiah had spoken when he said: A voice of one crying out in the desert, Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths. John wore clothing made of camel's hair and had a leather belt around his waist. His food was locusts and wild honey. At that time Jerusalem, all Judea, and the whole region around the Jordan were going out to him and were being baptized by him in the Jordan River as they acknowledged their sins. When he saw many of the Pharisees and Sadducees coming to his baptism, he said to them, "You brood of vipers! Who warned you to flee from the coming wrath? Produce good fruit as evidence of your repentance. And do not presume to say to yourselves, 'We have Abraham as our father.'For I tell you, God can raise up children to Abraham from these stones. Even now the ax lies at the root of the trees. Therefore every tree that does not bear good fruit will be cut down and thrown into the fire. I am baptizing you with water, for repentance, but the one who is coming after me is mightier than I. I am not worthy to carry his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing fan is in his hand. He will clear his threshing floor and gather his wheat into his barn, but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire."

Focus Questions:

- 1) What part of John the Baptist's message is most meaningful today?
- 2) Describe the ways you are preparing for the Lord. What paths need to be straightened?
- 3) Describe a relationship or a place that brings you peace.

Family and children's question:

Be like John the Baptist and deny yourself one thing this week. Offer that sacrifice to God.

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

When electricity was first introduced to a little village, every villager switched from the propane lanterns to electricity except the oldest couple. When finally, the electricity was brought into their home, the old man waited for it to get extra dark; then he told his wife to turn on the switch. The light filled the room; the old man grinned from ear to ear, and said, "wow it is bright, and sure, it would help lighting my lamps easier." And with that he lit the lamp and his wife turned off the electricity. A newer and brighter light was treated merely as a help to light the dimmer and older lamp. One has to let go of the dimmer (darkness) in order to live in the brighter (light).

This weekend we begin the Season of Advent lighting the first of the four Advent candles in the Advent wreath. In the forthcoming weeks we will light the second, third and fourth candles. Near to Christmas all the four candles will be lit. Thus, we symbolically express our belief that the closer we are to Christ the brighter our life would turn to be; our life becomes more illuminated when it comes nearer to Christ.

The more we turn away from Jesus, the lengthier our shadows would fall before us. Away from the light of Christ we would help only the darkness to shroud us. On this first Sunday of Advent when we bless the Advent wreath and light the first candle let it symbolize our preparation to receive the light, Jesus Christ in our hearts and home. Let it express our desire to open our heart and let Jesus in who is willing to enlighten our darkness.

Today's second reading invites us to see this time of Advent as the time of light and the day to wake up from sleep. "For our salvation is nearer now the night is advanced, the day is at hand. Let us then throw off the works of darkness and put on the armor of light; let us conduct ourselves properly as in the day, not in orgies and drunkenness, not in promiscuity and lust, not in rivalry and jealousy. But put on the Lord Jesus Christ and make no provision for the desires of the flesh."

God is ready to overlook our unworthiness in order that we receive Jesus, His Son. God sends Jesus to make us worthy. God does not complain about the darkness we were living, rather wants us to be enlightened by Jesus. Let us take this time of Advent to trim our wick to burn brightly. Because God has not abandoned us for our unworthiness but found ourselves as his worthy place for His Son to be born. Let us awaken to our worth to shine brightly.

The first Sunday of Advent you will find in the pews new missalettes which have all the readings, hymns and prayers for the whole year. Since they are to be used for the whole year until the end of November 2023, may I request you please handle them gently. When not in use please place the missalettes carefully in the racks. Please do not jam books into the racks in the open position. Before leaving the church, please check your pew to see that the missalettes are in order. Thanks for your cooperation.

December 10th is the Christmas Tree Lighting after 5:00pm mass. After the tree lighting Santa will make a special visit in Walden Hall. Food will be available for a small fee. \$2 for a hot dog with fries or burger with fries; \$1 for a soda.


