Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

December 18, 2022 Fourth Sunday of Advent Isaiah 7:10-14 Psalm 24:1-2, 3-4, 5-6 Romans 1:1-7 Matthew 11:18-24

A reading from the Gospel according to Matthew:

This is how the birth of Jesus Christ came about. When his mother Mary was betrothed to Joseph, but before they lived together, she was found with child through the Holy Spirit. Joseph her husband, since he was a righteous man, yet unwilling to expose her to shame, decided to divorce her quietly. Such was his intention when, behold, the angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, "Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary your wife into your home. For it is through the Holy Spirit that this child has been conceived in her. She will bear a son and you are to name him Jesus, because he will save his people from their sins." All this took place to fulfill what the Lord had said through the prophet: Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and they shall name him Emmanuel, which means "God is with us." When Joseph awoke, he did as the angel of the Lord had commanded him and took his wife into his home.

Focus Questions:

1) Describe a father you know who was faithful and good like St. Joseph?

2) Joseph's empathy saved Mary. When have you experienced the empathy of another person?

3) Describe a time when all you could do was trust.

Family and children's question:

What can your family do to help other families who are struggling this time of year?

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

At a Sunday school the children had a discussion how God has created everything good. Each child began to find good reasons for clouds, trees, rocks etc. One of them said, "If God has good purpose for everything, then why did he create poison ivy?" While the teacher struggled to answer the question another child said, "The reason God made poison ivy is that He wanted us to know there are certain things we should keep our hands off of."

The third week of Advent invites us to cherish the good in everyone and refrain from evil at all times. Today's Gospel narrates about John the Baptist's dilemma. He was imprisoned by Herod and was sure soon he would meet his death. Before dying he wanted to quiet his troubling conscience if he did his ministry of introducing Jesus as the Messiah. He sent his disciples to Jesus with this question, "Are you the one who is to come, or should we look for another?"

Jesus cleared his doubt not with a simple "Yes I am the one and no other". Rather Jesus indicated to John's disciples that He was doing all what the prophecy of Scriptures foretold to happen at the time of the Messiah. "Go and tell John what you hear and see: the blind regain their sight, the lame walk, lepers are cleansed, the deaf hear, the dead are raised, and the poor have the good news proclaimed to them. And blessed is the one who takes no offense at me." Thus, Jesus not only cleared John's doubt but confirmed him to have done all what God called him to do according to the scripture.

Like John the Baptist, we too may start our journey with God in doubt or with minimum faith. But if we allow God to explain to us about Himself as John did. God would both confirm in our faith by clearing all our doubt and reveal to us His plan of journeying with us towards the fullness of life. As it happened to John in prison, the evil and death around us can easily have a negative impact on us which in turn create doubt about oneself and others. But when we allow God to influence our mind and spirit, and God to deal with our fears and questions as John did, we will be encouraged by God how God's plan is being fulfilled in all what we say and do. God will show in each of us how the blindness can regain sight, the lameness can walk, leprosy can be cleansed, the deafness can hear, that which is dead can be made alive. May Advent give us the opportunity to walk with God who can bring us out of our doubt and fears. May the birth of Jesus open our senses to all the good that happen in and around us.

On Saturday, December 10th after the 5:00 pm mass is the Christmas Tree lighting. St. Nicholas (Santa) will join us in celebrating the mass and lead us to food and picture-taking. I thank all the volunteers whom Justin Monsee coordinated in decorating the trees with lights. I appreciate all the Knights who served food and the Hospitality ladies for the brownies and Hot Chocolate. God bless all who help us in preparing the way for the Lord to be born among us.
