Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

January 8, 2023
The Epiphany of the Lord
Isaiah 60:1-6
Psalm 72:1-2, 7-8, 10-11, 12-13
Ephesians 3:2-3a, 5-6
Matthew 2:1-12

A reading from the Gospel according to Matthew:

When Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, in the days of King Herod, behold, magi from the east arrived in Jerusalem, saying, "Where is the newborn king of the Jews? We saw his star at its rising and have come to do him homage." When King Herod heard this, he was greatly troubled, and all Jerusalem with him. Assembling all the chief priests and the scribes of the people, He inquired of them where the Christ was to be born. They said to him, "In Bethlehem of Judea, for thus it has been written through the prophet:

And you, Bethlehem, land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; since from you shall come a ruler, who is to shepherd my people Israel." Then Herod called the magi secretly and ascertained from them the time of the star's appearance. He sent them to Bethlehem and said, "Go and search diligently for the child. When you have found him, bring me word, that I too may go and do him homage." After their audience with the king they set out. And behold, the star that they had seen at its rising preceded them, until it came and stopped over the place where the child was. They were overjoyed at seeing the star, and on entering the house they saw the child with Mary his mother. They prostrated themselves and did him homage. Then they opened their treasures and offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. And having been warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they departed for their country by another way.

- 1) How had God helped you when you had to make an important decision?
- 2) What has been your guiding star?
- 3) Describe a time when your family faced danger together?

Family and children's question:

What gifts would you bring to the Christ child?

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

Question: May I ask you the secret of your success?

2023 begins on January 1st. 2023 would be another set of 365 days. It has nothing new in it to offer unless we make it new. Its newness depends upon how we want to make it new by our way of living the positives around us. On January 1st the new set of 365 days invite us to begin a new set of lifevalues. You and I can make our way of living the situations of 2023 in a new positive way.... New way of respecting and relating with people.... New way of being responsible of the situations. Unless we bring the newness by our way of living, the New Year will be just a repetition of the old year 2022 with the same number of minutes and hours, days, weeks and months.

May God who lives forever and new always, renew our vision and strength, focus and enthusiasm of our life. May we bring our newness into 2023. In the name of our Parish-Family of St. Thomas More I wish you and your families "A HAPPY HEALTHY NEW YEAR 2023". May the light of Christ born among us, shine upon us, guide us throughout the New Year 2023. May we find His Favor flourish every day of 2023 leading us to be prosperous, peaceful, healthy and happy. May His Grace fill you and permeate every moment of 2023.
