Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

January 29, 2023 Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time Zephaniah 2:3; 3:12-13 Psalm 146:6-7, 8-9, 9-10 1 Corinthians 1:26-31 Matthew 5:1-12a

A reading from the Gospel according to Matthew:

When Jesus saw the crowds, he went up the mountain, and after he had sat down, his disciples came to him. He began to teach them, saying: "Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. Blessed are they who mourn, for they will be comforted. Blessed are the meek, for they will inherit the land. Blessed are they who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be satisfied. Blessed are the merciful, for they will be shown mercy. Blessed are the clean of heart, for they will see God. Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God. Blessed are they who are persecuted for the sake of righteousness, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. Blessed are you when they insult you and persecute you and utter every kind of evil against you falsely because of me. Rejoice and be glad, for your reward will be great in heaven."

Focus Questions:

1) How do you put the care for the poor into your daily life?

2) How important are power and reputation in your life?

3) Describe a time when you showed mercy to another.

Family and children's question:

Talk about the importance of being a peacemaker in whatever setting you find yourself-family, friends, school, work, etc.

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

Son: I have Got hundreds of Instagram friends whom I've never met.

Father: When I was young, we called them imaginary friends.

- A Twitter friend wrote to her other friends, "Let us be clear. We are only 'friends' on Twitter not in real life. Got it."

- Teacher to her student, "Having a lot of Facebook friends does not mean you are popular in real life. It only means you spend way too much of time on Facebook."

We live in a digital world which easily and instantly helps us connect to many people but sadly and unconsciously leads us to be away from the real touch of our next-door neighbors.

Today's Gospel invites us to live a real life not a digital life with God and others. It narrates that Herod threw John into prison and thus ended John the Baptist's ministry of announcing about Jesus's arrival. Then began Jesus's mission. Jesus came out of his town of Nazareth and began to travel various regions announcing the arrival of God's kingdom. John preached to repent so that the people may recognize Jesus and believe in Him. Jesus also invited the people to repent, so that they might consciously and personally be aware of the kingdom of God in and around them. Jesus's way of announcing God's kingdom is very personal. The Kingdom of God is not a thing one can possess nor system that one could adopt to. Rather it is a spiritual reality that each of us can enter, feel, live and be in. God in Jesus became the living part of our human History. Jesus's living among the humans, his going around their places, and his living their lifestyle invited them to see a new reality of God's kingdom being present and alive in and among them. His invitation was, ""Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand." 'Repent' is the personal invitation to change our focus from our regular and convenient way of seeing the things and people, to Jesus's way of seeing the presence of God among them and God's way of running our human history. That is the reason Jesus called first four people, Peter and Andrew, James and John, (and later they became 12) to follow Him, ""Come after me, and I will make you fishers of men." Their following is not like their job of catching fish but a new mission of catching people which is to live God's kingdom as a community. The followers of Christ are not entities or members of a group or

club but loving and living persons growing together as God's kingdom, in which God 's presence is their ultimate living experience.

As Paul says in the second reading, that we may be different from each other due to various reasons, but it is fundamentally Christ in whose name we recognize each other as our brothers and sisters. The experience of Jesus in each of us makes us agree in what we say that there be no divisions among us, and that we be united in the same mind and in the same purpose. Let us strive to focus the presence of God's kingdom (God's ruling) among us in our personal relationship to each other. Let us come out of the digital concept of relating; let us become the real world of love and living relationship. We are not put together as a system each one mechanically doing our parts in order that the social engine is kept running. We are not a web electronically or digitally communicating with each other. We are the lively Kingdom of God, growing together organically as brothers and sisters experiencing Jesus Christ in our living together.




